Resolution Regarding the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Resolution Regarding the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board pass a resolution to reapprove matters related to the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation including reapproving its Articles of Incorporation and Code of By-Laws and the reappointment of its directors. Furthermore, it is recommended that the Board approve the Second Amendment to the Master Lease and set the public hearing on the Second Amendment to Master Lease for April 26, 2021.

RELATED INFORMATION: These approvals are required to facilitate financing of the 2020 FWCS School Building Basic Renewal/Restoration and Safety Project approved by voters on June 2, 2020. Prior to this meeting, the Board of Directors of the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation approved the form of Second Amendment to Master Lease and authorized the execution of the Second Amendment to Master Lease.

The Board of Directors of the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation and the School Board of Trustees will convene again on April 26 to take further action, including approval to issue bonds. The School Board of Trustees will also conduct a public hearing on the Second Amendment to Master Lease and the appropriation of the bond proceeds for the 2020 FWCS School Building Basic Renewal/Restoration and Safety Project at that time.

Bond Counsel, Jeff Qualkinbush of Barnes and Thornburg, and Chief Financial Officer, Kathy Friend, were available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Maria Norman, seconded by Steve Corona, that the recommendation concerning the Resolution Regarding the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Lenovo ThinkPad Yoga L13 and 11e Laptops Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Lenovo ThinkPad Yoga L13 and 11e Laptops:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of 621 Lenovo Thinkpad L13 Yoga and 1,442 Lenovo Yoga 11e ThinkPad computers from ProSys of Indianapolis for \$1,187,737.04.

RELATED INFORMATION: The purchase of these laptops represents the last purchase for the fifth year of the 5-year technology plan that ensures students and teachers have current technology to support instruction. Since we were able to accomplish our 1:1 goal during the fourth year, this purchase of teacher and staff computers will allow us to begin our replacement schedule.

FWCS was able to secure pricing that was below General Services Administration (GSA) pricing. Indiana law does not require public bidding for purchases made at or below GSA pricing.

Funding will come from the Common School Fund.

Jack Byrd, Director of Technology was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Maria Norman, that the recommendation concerning the Lenovo ThinkPad Yoga L13 and 11e Laptops be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Application for Common School Fund Loan Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Application for Common School Fund Loan:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of an advancement from the Indiana Common School Fund (CSF) for educational technology equipment in the amount of \$2,000,000.

RELATED INFORMATION: Advancements from the Common School Fund provide funds for school districts to purchase educational technology. The Fort Wayne Community Schools (FWCS) will use these moneys to help fund the FWCS technology plan previously submitted to the State. Technology funds are currently insufficient to fund all the technology needs of the school corporation.

Funds are provided as a loan and are awarded to school corporations on the basis of assessed value (AV) per pupil, with low AV per pupil corporations receiving funds before high AV per pupil corporations. FWCS therefore cannot be assured of receiving the requested advancement.

Should the application be successful, funds will be budgeted in the Debt Service Fund to repay this loan beginning in the year 2023. Interest on the loan is expected to be no more than four percent and is likely to be as low as one percent.

Common School Fund advancements differ from School Technology Advancement Account (STAA) loans, which FWCS receives on an annual basis. Unlike CSF advancements, STAA advancements are given to all applying school corporations, regardless of their assessed value per pupil ranking.

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the following design and construction manager as constructor (CMc) contracts for the Renovation of Wayne High School and Accessibility and Security Improvements at Forest Park and Washington Elementary Schools projects.

Architectural and Engineering Services Design Collaborative
Total Estimated Design Services Contract \$1,895,625

RELATED INFORMATION: The renovation project at Wayne High School consists of architectural, mechanical, plumbing and electrical renovations. The accessibility and security improvements projects at Forest Park and Washington Elementary include the renovation and/or relocation of the office suite to facilitate an entrance with enhanced security and the addition of limited use/limited application elevator(s) to provide accessibility to all levels of the building and meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards.

The contract procurement method for these projects is the Construction Manager as Constructor (CMc) for publicly funded projects as allowable per I.C. 5-32. The recommendation includes the design services contract based on a percentage of construction value, as well as, a fixed fee for Contractor preconstruction services. An additional recommendation for construction manager services during

construction will be presented at a later date along with the establishment of a final guaranteed maximum price for the project. The overall construction budget for the projects has been established at \$42,125,000. The projects will be funded from the 2020 School Building Basic Renewal/Restoration & Safety Project.

2021 Field Sports Lighting Project Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the 2021 Field Sports Lighting Project:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the following construction contract for Field Sports Lighting Replacements:

RELATED INFORMATION: The project includes replacing the field sports lighting at North Side, Northrop, Snider and South Side High Schools with new LED sports lighting. The project was designed and procured through Sourcewell purchasing cooperative. Indiana law allows for purchases made through competitively bid contracts from approved cooperative purchasing entities.

The project is funded from the Operations Fund, which is identified in the Capital Projects Plan. This recommendation is within the program budget. Project specifications require the work to be complete by July 30, 2021.
