ISTEP Cut  
Score Process

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board recognize Sara Zuber, math facilitator at Scott Elementary School; Marge Goyings, a teacher at Shawnee Middle School; Derrell Gatson, a teacher at Memorial Park Middle School; Sandra Sunderland-Willis, curriculum coordinator and Susan Brace, a teacher at Jefferson Middle School and a member of the Indiana State Board of Education for taking part in the bookmarking phase of the ISTEP+ cut score process.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Sara Zuber, Marge Goyings, Derrell Gatson and Sandra Sunderland-Willis were among 144 Indiana educators chosen to take part in this process in January. Each educator met for three days with 23 other Indiana educators to help identify recommendations for cut scores. Their work focused directly on Indiana's students and their performances on the ISTEP+ relative to Indiana's new academic standards.

As a member of the Indiana Board of Education, Susan Brace began the cut score setting process by creating definitions for "pass" and "pass plus." Those definitions gave the 144 educators a framework to begin the process.

Reading  
 First Grant

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Reading First Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve application for and acceptance of the Reading First Grant for the fiscal year 2003 in the amount of \$969,880 from the Indiana Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** This competitive grant was written by members of the Curriculum Department and Dr. Patsy Turnipseed

The grant, awarded by the U.S. Department of Education under the No Child Left Behind Act, is a six-year grant for grades K-3. The Reading First Grant provides grants to state educational agencies to implement findings from scientifically based reading research in schools and classrooms. Indiana received \$10 million. Schools were selected for this grant based on poverty level and ISTEP + test data. The schools selected for this grant are: Franke Park, Indian Village, Irwin, Maplewood, Northcrest, and Weisser Park.

The purpose of the grant is to ensure all children will read on or above grade level by the end of third grade. The funding will support a language arts instructional facilitator at each building, job embedded and summer professional development, and materials and supplies. Money allocated for materials and supplies will be used to purchase required assessments, books, and balanced literacy supplies.

The grant addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy IV, Articulated and Coordinated Curriculum, and Strategy V, Staff Effectiveness.
