Roll Call

The Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools met in regular session in the Lester L. Grile Administrative Center on Monday, March 25, 2002, at 7:03 p.m. President Stephen Corona called the meeting to order with the following members in attendance:

Approval of Minutes – March 11, 2002 A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held March 11, 2002, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Thomas Fowler-Finn, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

State Swimming and Diving Competition **RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board recognize swim teams from Northrop and Snider high schools for their performance at the state swim meet in February.

RELATED INFORMATION: Northrop swimmer Jennifer Chang and diver Kyle Skelton also placed in the competition. Chang was fifth in the 100-meter freestyle and sixth in the 200-meter freestyle. Skelton was fifth in the diving competition.

The girls' swim team at Snider finished fifth overall in the competition and several team members placed in individual races. Erin Morris was first in the 100-meter backstroke and second in the 500-meter freestyle. Stephanie Meyer was fifth in the 100-meter backstroke and eighth in the 200-meter individual medley. Elizabeth Stempien was ninth in the 50-meter freestyle and $10^{\rm th}$ in the 100-meter freestyle. Margaret Honig, Elizabeth Stempien, Erin Morris and Stephanie Meyer were second in the 200-meter medley relay. Lauren Rakes, Elizabeth Stempien, Erin Morris and Stephanie Meyer were fourth in the 400-meter freestyle relay.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize students from Snider High School for placing 9th in state competition in the Academic Decathlon in Indianapolis in February.

RELATED INFORMATION: This unique competition includes 10 events, including a speech, interview, essay and a super quiz. Topics range from music and literature to economics and science. Students are given a study guide and other materials to prepare for the competition. Team member Nimesh Lad earned 1st place in mathematics, Greg Wilson placed 2nd in mathematics and science and Corey Allison placed 2nd in the essay competition. The team won 1st place in the regional competition in January.

Indian Village Achievement

Three years ago, Indian Village Elementary School was given a two-year accreditation and a challenge to improve student achievement. Today, their 2001 ISTEP scores have propelled Indian Village to become one of the Top Five scoring schools in Northeast Indiana. Principal Stephany Bourne spoke about how staff development, a strong focus on academic goals, and using data to drive change have dramatically impacted student success.

Staff Spotlight – Steve Douglas

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize Steve Douglas, case manager at Nebraska Elementary School for his contributions to the children and families of Fort Wayne Community Schools.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Staff Spotlight program is the district's method of recognizing employees for outstanding work and commitment to excellence. We honor Steve Douglas, case manager at Nebraska Elementary School for the last 10 years. A video highlighting his accomplishments will be shown.

This program addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy V, Ensuring Staff Effectiveness; and Strategy VIII, Communicating that Fort Wayne Community Schools is an Excellent School System.

Vouchers

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the vouchers for the period ending March 13, 2002, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 02-06 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Occupational Medical Services

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Occupational Medical Services:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board renew the contract with RediMed a division of Quorum Health Group as the occupational medical services provider for a two-year period, effective April 1, 2002 through March 31, 2004.

RELATED INFORMATION: RediMed/Business Health Services (BHS) has been the provider for Fort Wayne Community Schools' occupational medical services including pre-employment physicals, routine physical exams and drug testing, since 1997. Due to the recent inclusion of StatCare sites, there are now six (6) clinics available in addition to three (3) hospital emergency rooms for workers compensation injury care.

RediMed/BHS has offered a 4% increase in cost based upon the 2001 utilization rate. The current 15% discount to RediMed/BHS standard prices, excluding medication, would continue along with the Lutheran Preferred workers' compensation agreement.

After the two-year contract extension, Fort Wayne Community Schools will consider other proposals/quotes for this service.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the Occupational Medical Services be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Group Life Insurance Renewal Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Group Life Insurance Renewal:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board renew Allianz/Baltimore Life Insurance Company as the group life insurance carrier for a two-year term, effective March 1, 2002, through February 28, 2004.

RELATED INFORMATION: Allianz Insurance Company has provided Fort Wayne Community Schools' group life and supplemental life coverage since March 1, 1997. Allianz will be transitioning their group life product to Baltimore Life, one of the ING companies, over the next few years.

Allianz/Baltimore Life Insurance Company has offered to renew Fort Wayne Community Schools' employee group life plan at the rate of \$.215 per \$1000.00 of coverage with a 2-year rate guarantee. This is an increase of \$.04 per \$1000.00 from the previous year. The effective date for the rate change has been deferred until April 1, 2002. A 2-year rate guarantee is also offered for the supplemental and dependent life classes of coverage with no increase to the existing rate.

Quotes were solicited from eight other companies. Five companies declined to quote and three quoted rates higher than the renewal offer from Allianz/Baltimore Life.

A motion was made by Donald J. Schaab, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the Group Life Insurance Renewal be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Consolidated Public Hearing on the North Side High School Year Round School Feasibility Study and the Lease:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board hold a consolidated public hearing to provide public input on the matter of year-round school at North Side High School and on the form of the lease.

RELATED INFORMATION: State law requires a school that is pursuing an increase in classrooms and financing the expansion through a bond issue to determine if year-round school would be an alternative to new construction. The Board is required to hold two public hearings on the matter. This was the second public hearing, the first public hearing was held February 11, 2002. As a result of the feasibility study, It is recommended that planning continue for the construction of renovations and expansion of North Side High School and not to pursue year-round school plans.

State law also requires the Board to hold a public hearing on the lease approved at its meeting on February 11, 2002. It is recommended that the terms of the approved lease be confirmed.

The board voted on these matters as a part of a resolution regarding this and other North Side High School Project related items.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning holding the Consolidated Public Hearing on the North Side High School Year Round School Feasibility Study and the Lease be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Consolidated Public Hearing on the North Side High School Year Round School Feasibility Study and the Lease Hearing was held, with no one disputing the Feasibility Study or Lease.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the Consolidated Public Hearing on the North Side High School Year Round School Feasibility Study and the Lease be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Resolution Regarding North Side High School Project Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the resolution regarding the North Side High School Project:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a resolution on the following matters regarding the North Side Renovation and Expansion Project:

- (a) reaffirms that a need exists for the North Side High School Renovation and Expansion Project
- (b) reaffirms the form of the Lease with the North Side High School Building Corporation originally approved February 11, 2002, which will be for a term not to exceed seventeen years
- (c) determines that the maximum annual rental for the North Side High School, as it currently exists and as renovated, in the amount of \$7,850,000 is a fair and reasonable rental
- (d) authorizes any officer of the Board to execute and attest the form of the Lease presented at this meeting, with such changes as such officer deems necessary or desirable
- (e) approves the issuance of first mortgage bonds by the North Side High School Building Corporation for this project in a principal amount not to exceed \$49,750,000
- (f) determines the annual tax levy will be authorized each year in an amount sufficient to pay the annual rental under the Lease
- (g) authorizes the School Corporation's attorney to begin the court-appointed appraisal process to determine the sale value of the North Side High School
- (h) approves the Feasibility Study and its conclusions that multi-track year round schools is not a viable alternative to the North Side High School Renovation and Expansion Project
- (i) approves the form of Continuing Disclosure Contract and authorizes its execution
- (j) authorizes any officer of the School Corporation to take any other action he or she deems necessary or desirable to fulfill the intent of these resolutions, and ratifies all actions previously taken

A motion was made by Carl A. Johnson, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the resolution regarding the North Side High School Project be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

I-READ Grant Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the I-READ Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve application for and acceptance of the I-Read Grant for the fiscal year 2002 in the amount of \$1,293,120 from the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: The grant, awarded by the U.S. Department of Education under the Reading Excellence Act (REA), is a three-year program, running from August 3, 2001, to August 2, 2004. The Reading Excellence program provides grants to state educational agencies to implement findings from scientifically based reading research in school and classrooms. Indiana received \$25.2 million. Schools were eligible to apply for this grant based on poverty level and ISTEP test data.

The purpose of this grant is as follows:

(1) To provide children with the readiness skills they need to learn to read once they enter school.

- (2) To teach every child to read in the child's early childhood years.
- (3) To improve the reading skills of students, and the instructional practices for current teachers.

This competitive grant was written by Carol Kettler, Title I Manager and the principals from Adams, Fairfield, and Study elementary schools. Adams is requesting \$446,925 to support Balanced Literacy, CLASS, and Reading in Motion. Fairfield is requesting \$446,195 for professional development and materials for Balanced Literacy, ESL, and Success for All. Study is requesting \$400,000 for a literacy facilitator, materials and professional development for Balanced Literacy.

The grant addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy IV, Articulated and Coordinated Curriculum, and Strategy V, Staff Effectiveness.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the I-READ Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.
