Out of District Tuition:

Each year Fort Wayne Community Schools receives applications from students who reside outside of the school district. It is permissible to charge out-of-district students tuition, which equals the difference between the actual cost of the summer school program and the projected state reimbursement. Out-of-district tuition is \$168.00.

Student Fees for Textbooks and Instructional Supplies:

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Amendment to the 2006 Capital Projects Fund Plan:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the 2006 Capital Projects Fund Plan be amended to include the adjustments identified on the attached list and that the Board hold a hearing and adopt the attached resolution to modify the 2006 Capital Projects Fund Plan.

RELATED INFORMATION: The State of Indiana requires the Board to hold a hearing and pass a resolution authorizing any changes in the Capital Projects Fund Plan. Needed funding will come from reassigning revenue for the following proposed changes:

Lane/Portage – Fort Wayne Community Schools will expand the cafeteria seating area at each school. The expansion is the result of additional students expected next school year.

Mechanical/Electrical – This project will provide a back-up water heater system at the Natatorium. Currently only one of the two heaters is working. The new water heater will become the primary hot water heating source and the remaining heater will serve as back-up.

Equipment – Unassigned: Each year the budget includes a small amount for unassigned equipment, in the event that revenues are above or below projections. By reducing this budget, the funds are available for other projects.

HEARING:

As published in the local newspapers on March 17 and March 24, 2006, this meeting is the official hearing for the modification of the 2006 Capital Projects Fund Plan. This was the appropriate time for anyone interested in this resolution to address the Board. No one spoke.

The project consists of constructing additional square footage to expand cafeterias at Lane and Portage Middle Schools. Each area will provide enough new space to comfortably handle an additional 60 students per lunch period.

Planning and scheduling are under way so that construction can begin April 3, 2006 and be completed by September 16, 2006.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the purchase of classroom Montessori instructional materials for use in the Towles Intermediate and Bunche Montessori programs:

Nienhuis Montessori USA Mountain View, CA \$112,912.98

RELATED INFORMATION: These materials are used on a daily basis by students and staff. Specific lessons are given to preschool through sixth grade students in order to meet the state standards. Teachers are trained to use specific Montessori materials that meet the individual needs of their students. Once students are given lessons then they can work independently to complete their work contracts.

Due to the uniqueness of the instructional materials used in a Montessori classroom environment, consistency of the materials is key for allowing the interchange needed between both individual classrooms and the two Montessori sites. As children progress through the Montessori program, comfort and familiarity with consistent instructional materials helps to foster the independence that is central to the Montessori philosophy.

According to Indiana law, FWCS is not required to bid when there is only one source for a supply. Due to the unique nature of Montessori instructional materials, Nienhuis is the single source for their materials.

In addition to the Nienhuis order there will be 15 small purchases made to other vendors for instructional materials totaling \$48,629.96, which is well below the threshold for competitive bidding or quoting.

This recommendation is within the project budget, which is being funded from the Capital Projects Fund.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the purchase of thirty Gateway computers with equipment and the lease of an additional sixty Gateway computers with equipment for our schools to support their school improvement plans. Total payments for all ninety computers with equipment are \$101,311.43.

RELATED INFORMATION: The purchase of thirty computers with equipment will cost \$32,702.63. This funding is available from current School Technology Advancement Accounts (STAA) or Common School Funds (CSF).

The lease of sixty computers provides annual payments of \$22,869.60 for three years with an interest rate of approximately 2.4%. Total payments will equal \$68,608.80 and will be funded with future STAA or CSF. Leasing allows us to acquire consistent models at one time instead of introducing new models as funds become available.

Indiana law doesn't require public bidding for purchases made below the State QPA (Quantity Purchasing Agreement). The price of these computers is 16% less than the State QPA price.

Most of the computers purchased and leased will replace outdated models and others will support computer labs. The need for computers and the type recommended at our schools is determined by the Area Technology Coordinators

RELATED INFORMATION: The terms of the lease with Apple Computers provides for zero percent interest and annual payments of \$189,880.67 for three years and \$21,367.00 for two additional years. Total payments will equal \$612,376.00 and will be funded with Common School Funds (CSF) or School Technology Advancement Accounts (STAA). Most of the computers leased will replace outdated models and others will support computer labs. Leasing allows us to acquire consistent models at one time instead of introducing new models as funds become available.

Indiana law doesn't require public bidding for purchases from a sole source. No bid is required for the purchase of Apple computers because the purchase is directly from the sole source manufacturer. Discounts were provided by Apple.

The need for computers and the type recommended at our schools is determined by the Area Technology Coordinators.

The lease is renewable for an additional rental payment after the initial term.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a three-year agreement between Fort Wayne Community Schools and the YMCA of Greater Fort Wayne to serve as the provider for the Extended Day Child Care Program at selected elementary school sites.

RELATED INFORMATION: IC 20-5-2-1.5 requires each school corporation to offer on school grounds a school-age child care program that, at a minimum, is operated after the school day and is available to all of that corporation's students in preschool through grade 6. Board Policy 2262 also provides for FWCS to offer an Extended Day Child Care Program.

During the 2005-2006 school year approximately 990 children participated in the program. The after-school program will continue to operate at ten elementary schools for 2006-2007, including: Abbett, Bethlehem Lutheran (serving Irwin students), Franke Park, Glenwood Park, Haley, Indian Village, Lincoln, Maplewood, St. Joe Central and Towles Intermediate. A before-school program will be available at eight sites: Abbett, Bethlehem Lutheran (serving Irwin students), Franke Park, Glenwood Park, Lincoln, Indian Village, Maplewood, and Towles Intermediate. Since enrollment determines final site selections, it is possible that additional sites may be added after the fall school term begins.

The fee structure is as follows:	Before school care	\$30 per week

Program care includes five days per week. Extra fees will be charged for delays, early dismissal days, conference days, and winter and spring breaks. Financial assistance will be available on a sliding scale as determined by guidelines from the Division of Family and Children's Services for use by state funding agencies. In addition, the YWCA of Greater Fort Wayne will use CANI funds, Block grants, and YMCA partner with Youth funds to offer scholarships for 20-35 percent of program participants.

The YMCA has successfully conducted the Extended Day Child Care Program in FWCS for the past eleven years.

This agreement is in support of FWCS Strategic Plan Strategy 4: *We will function as a center of learning in the community.*
