Dr. Wendy Robinson, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Staff Spotlight – Natalie Nelson, Reading First Coach/Facilitator Weisser Park Elementary School

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize Natalie Nelson, a Reading First Coach/Facilitator at Weisser Park Elementary School.

2005 South Side Natatorium Mechanical Renovation Project

RELATED INFORMATION: This project consists of construction of a new mechanical room and replacement of HVAC units, ductwork, and temperature controls. This recommendation exceeds the budget for the project. The base bid is \$195,001 higher than funds budgeted. The original estimate included replacing units. After further investigation, it was determined that the new units would not fit in the existing mechanical room. The expansion of the mechanical room was added to the scope of work which increased the cost. We request approval based on other Capital Projects Funds being available. An amendment will be brought forward in April to reinstate those funds. In addition, there

are a number of alternatives that are required in the amount of \$95,908. Those alternatives will be brought with the CPF amendment in April. Project specifications require the work to be completed by October 14, 2005.

1028 Public Hearing and Resolutions on Construction of New Food Service Facility Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the 1028 Public Hearing and Resolutions on Construction of New Food Service Facility:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board hold a public hearing and adopt a resolution regarding the construction of a new food service facility.

RELATED INFORMATION: I.C. 20-5-52 (P.L.1028) requires that a public hearing be conducted for all building projects costing \$1,000,000 or more. The Food Service Center project meets the requirement for a public hearing. This hearing has been properly advertised on March 14, 2005. The hearing is scheduled for this evening's meeting of the Board of School Trustees. Following the hearing, the Board will consider action on the attached resolutions. The description for the project is outlined in the resolutions.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF THE FORT WAYNE COMMUNITY SCHOOLS, ALLEN COUNTY, INDIANA

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees (the "Board") of the Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana (the "School Corporation"), has given consideration to the construction and equipping of new food service facilities which will be operated by the School Corporation and located within the geographical boundaries of the School Corporation (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code §6-1.1-20-3.1, if the Board proposes to impose property taxes to pay lease rentals on any construction, renovation, improvement, remodeling, alteration or expansion project, which is not excluded under Indiana Code §6-1.1-20-1.1, it must conduct a public hearing on the preliminary determination to proceed with such project prior to the Board's adopting any resolution or ordinance making a preliminary determination to enter into a lease; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code §20-5-52-5, a public hearing must be held if the Board proposes to construct, repair or alter a school building at a cost of more than \$1,000,000 that would be financed by a lease agreement, issuing bonds, or any other available method; and

WHEREAS, notice of said hearings have been given in accord with Indiana law; and

WHEREAS, interested people have been given the opportunity to present testimony and ask questions concerning the Project, and this Board has heard public input at a public hearing held this date concerning the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board, being duly advised, finds that it is in the best interests of the School Corporation and its citizens for the purpose of financing all or any portion of the Project to enter into negotiations with an Indiana nonprofit school building corporation (the "Building Corporation") to acquire all or any portion of the facilities operated or to be operated by the School Corporation, and enter into a lease or leases (collectively, the "Lease") with the Building Corporation, as lessor, for all or any portion of the facilities operated or to be operated by the School Corporation, in order to better serve the residents of the School Corporation, by allowing the Building Corporation to issue first mortgage bonds in one or more series in an estimated original aggregate issued amount of Eleven Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$11,950,000); and

WHEREAS, the Board expects to pay for certain costs of the Project or costs related to the Project (collectively, the "Expenditures") prior to the issuance of such first mortgage bonds, and to reimburse the Expenditures with proceeds received by the School Corporation upon the issuance of such first mortgage bonds by the Building Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to declare its intent to reimburse the Expenditures pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2 and Indiana Code §5-1-14-6(c).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF THE FORT WAYNE COMMUNITY SCHOOLS, ALLEN COUNTY, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

The Board hereby makes a preliminary determination that there exists a need for the Project. Accordingly, the Board hereby makes a preliminary determination that to the extent permitted by law the Board will take all of the necessary steps to enter into the Lease with the Building Corporation for all or any portion of the facilities operated or to be operated by the School Corporation, pursuant to which the Building Corporation and the School Corporation will finance all or a portion of the Project. The School Corporation and the Building Corporation will finance all or a portion of the Project through one or more series of first mortgage bonds issued by the Building Corporation, as lessor, in an original aggregate issued amount estimated to be Eleven Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$11,950,000)(the "Bonds"), or such greater amount in the case of the issuance of any bonds all or a portion of which will be used to refund all or a portion of the Bonds, and other funds of the School Corporation, if any. The proposed lease with respect to each facility will have a term no longer than fourteen (14) years, beginning on the date all or a portion of any of the School Corporation's facilities is acquired by the Building Corporation. The estimated maximum interest rate that will be paid in connection with the Bonds will not exceed five percent (5.00%) per annum, and the total interest cost associated therewith is \$4,350,000. Including interest costs, the maximum annual lease rental to be paid by the School Corporation under the proposed lease is \$1,340,000, and the maximum lease rental over the term of the lease is \$18,760,000, not taking into account funds of the Building Corporation available for capitalized interest. While the maximum annual debt service tax rate necessary to pay the annual lease payment for the financing of the proposed Project is estimated to be no greater than \$0.016, the Board expects after the execution of the proposed lease the total debt service fund tax rate will only increase by approximately \$0.01 over the current total debt service fund tax rate due to anticipated increases in the School Corporation's true tax value and the pay-off of other lease and debt service obligations of the School Corporation. The estimated completion date of Project is June 30, 2006. The Board estimates that the operational costs associated with the new food service facilities will be approximately \$2,804,000 in 2007, and currently expects that at such time the new food service facilities are completed, the Board will file a new facility appeal on that portion of the costs which are permitted under Indiana Code §6-1.1-19-4.4(a)(4).

Section 2. A notice of the foregoing preliminary determinations set forth in Section 1 of this resolution shall be given in accordance with Indiana Code §6-1.1-20-3.1.

Section 3. The Board hereby declares its official intent that to the extent permitted by law, to execute the proposed lease with the Building Corporation, and to request the Building Corporation to issue the Bonds in one or more series or issues, which Bonds are not anticipated to exceed an original aggregate issued amount of Eleven Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$11,950,000), and to reimburse costs of the Project consisting of the Expenditures from proceeds of the sale of such Bonds.

Section 4. McKinney-Vento Transportation Grant

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for the McKinney-Vento transportation grant that would provide transportation for homeless children and youth to their school of origin.

RELATED INFORMATION: Through the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act of 1987, as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, federal funds are available to each state to support programs that meet the needs of homeless children and youth. The Indiana Department of Education has identified transportation funding as a critical need for the state's school corporations. As a result, grants will be made available to school corporations for the provision of transportation services to homeless children and youth to their schools of origin.

Grants will be available in the amount of \$10,000; up to eight corporations may receive this funding. First preference will be given to school corporations that do NOT receive other McKinney-Vento funding. Awards will be made based on the demonstrated needs of the school corporation and on a first-come, first-served basis for the period of April 1, 2005, to March 31, 2006.

This is a competitive grant and supports our Strategic Plan, we will ensure high levels of learning for <u>all</u> students.
