Dr. Thomas Fowler-Finn, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendation concerning awards and recognitions:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize the Snack Packers from Memorial Park Middle School for being named a semifinalist in the Christopher Columbus awards.

RELATED INFORMATION: The annual competition, sponsored by the Christopher Columbus Fellowship Foundation, gives students a hands-on experience in science and technology by exploring positive change in their communities.

The Snack Packers, four Memorial Park eighth-graders, examined why Fort Wayne is ranked as one of the most obese cities in the U.S. by studying the eating habits of school-age children. The team measured the body mass index of students in four FWCS elementary schools and asked them to keep diet and exercise journals. They later presented the students with healthy eating and exercise ideas in an effort to change their habits.

A panel of community leaders, scientists and experts in science education judged the idea as one of the best 30 entries in the country.

Retired teacher Larry Lesh and Food and Nutrition Services director Marsha Metzger assisted the students with the project.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Staff Spotlight program is the district's method of recognizing employees for outstanding work and commitment to excellence. We honor Janet Daugherty, secretary at Croninger Elementary School, for her many contributions to the school's students, staff and parents. Visitors to the school learn first-hand why this school secretary is so revered. Her caring attitude and willingness to do whatever is asked of her make her an invaluable member of the staff at this magnet school.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Sale of 2003 Tax Anticipation Warrants:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the warrant resolution received from the Indiana Bond Bank authorizing Fort Wayne Community Schools to obtain temporary loans to replace the temporary loans originally issued January 30, 2003 and maturing June 30, 2003.

RELATED INFORMATION: On January 30, 2003 FWCS borrowed \$3,670,863 for the General Fund and \$375,578 for the Transportation Bus Replacement Fund to support expenditures until the first semiannual distribution of property tax revenue on June 30th. Because of the delay in property tax reassessment in Allen County, it is uncertain when the first property tax distribution will be received by FWCS. It is therefore necessary to issue new tax anticipation warrants to replace the warrants maturing

June 30th. The new warrants will be for the same amount and mature the earlier of four days after we receive the first half settlement of property taxes or December 31, 2003.

At the last meeting, April 28, 2003, the Board approved a resolution authorizing the issuance of \$24,355,820 in new tax anticipation warrants on May 15, 2003. That issuance plus the replacement warrants approved with this recommendation will provide the necessary funds to operate until the first half property settlement.

RELATED INFORMATION: One portion of the project is resurfacing the running track and tennis courts at Elmhurst High School. The track resurfacing is part of the latex track replacement plan, and the resurfacing of the tennis courts will correct unsafe conditions.

The remaining improvements will increase the students' safety during arrivals and departures:

Holland School – reconfiguration of the parking lot to accommodate a bus lane,

Memorial Park Middle School – construction of separate bus lanes for special needs and standard buses,

St. Joseph Central School – construction of a parent pick-up lane, and the reconstruction of the bus lane,

Washington Center School – reconfiguration of the parking lot to accommodate bus and parent pick-up zones, and

Young Early Childhood Center – construction of a concrete walk to be used for the bus pick-up zone.

The project is within budget, and will be funded from the Capital Projects Fund. Project specifications require that the project be completed by August 1, 2003.
