Alternative Education Program 2012-2013 Renewal Grant / Administrator Survey

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board accept the Alternative Education Grant from the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: Funding for the grant is based on the number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students enrolled in the following programs: Allen County Juvenile Center (ACJC), Allen County Learning Academy Extended (ACLA-Extended) at ACJC, Expectant Mothers Program at Anthis Career Center, L. C. Ward Education Center, and Youth Life Skills. The district received \$163,333.13.

Alternative Education is designed to meet the needs of students who are not succeeding in the traditional educational setting. Students are provided a variety of options that support continued opportunities towards graduation. FWCS alternatives have interventions for students and families that support academic/behavioral growth.

Johnnie Grimes, Pyramid for SuccessTM Coordinator is responsible for this non-competitive grant which supports Goal I: *Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence*.
