RELATED INFORMATION: Arlington teacher Mrs. Stacey Foust's fourth grade class participated in a national letter writing contest to Ruby Bridges about their feelings about racism. Out of 15,000 entries, judges selected 100, and Ruby Bridges selected Jesse Link's letter as one of the top 25 nationwide. Jesse won a Diversity Classroom Library, a signed copy of Ruby Bridges' book "Through My Eyes" and personalized stationery.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize the Memorial Park students who placed second in the region and in the top eight nationally out of 450 entries in the eCYBERMISSION contest, which is sponsored by the U.S. Army.

RELATED INFORMATION: A group of Memorial Park Middle School students performed an experiment to discover whether providing students with a nutritious snack would increase their energy levels. The team tested its hypothesis with 3rd and 5th graders at Pleasant Center and Brentwood Elementary Schools and discovered that about 67% felt more alert, could concentrate better and had more energy.

The project included a pamphlet with health tips to be distributed to FWCS administrators, teachers, parents, students and medical offices; promoting the idea on three billboards in the city; and putting the information on the FWCS website.

Team members each received a \$3,000 savings bond for placing in the eCYBERMISSION competition.

READ 180
Reading
Intervention

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the READ 180 Reading Intervention:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a contract with Scholastic in the amount of \$408,850 for a technology-based reading intervention which was piloted in three middle schools during the 2005-2007 school years. Competitive bidding is not required when there is only one source for the product and the contract will be funded through remediation grant money.

RELATED INFORMATION: READ 180 is a research-based reading intervention for secondary students who are reading below grade level. It aligns with the district literacy models and provides one-to-one technology-based tutoring. Results in other districts have averaged reading gains of 1 to 3 years when the student completes the READ 180 program as it is designed. The growth in FWCS for all subgroups outperformed the expected growth from national studies of the program. The program includes specific coaching in techniques to enhance the reading process and multiple opportunities for students to practice their skills with independent level texts and track their progress. Detailed reports are provided to the student, the parent, and the teacher. From the reports provided by the program, teachers can continue to personalize instructional activities to support each student.

The district will be expanding the program to each middle school for each school's below grade level readers. Extensive preparation has occurred to ensure that the necessary technology support will be in place and that students most in need of reading remediation will be scheduled into the program.
