RELATED INFORMATION: The Scholastic Art and Writing Awards have recognized student achievement in visual arts and creative writing for 90-plus years. This year there were 230,000 entries across the country and 500 students were awarded Gold Medals. Fort Wayne Community Schools had 29 students who won regional gold or silver keys and some students won multiple awards at the regional (state) level. Northrop students Christian Stout and Madison Beckstedt won several regional gold and silver keys and Christian went on to receive a National Silver Key.

Each Congressional member has a competition in their district to select a piece of art that will hang in the U.S. Capital tunnels. Congressman Stutzman's judges selected the work of four Northrop High School Students as the top four pieces in the competition. First place winner Ixchel Mendez-Elizondo will go on to be recognized at a national ceremony June 24 in Washington, D.C.
