National Honor Roll for Noetic **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize four Irwin Elementary School students who were named to the National Honor Roll at the Noetic Learning Math Contest.

RELATED INFORMATION: On April 14, 46 students from Irwin Math/Science Magnet School competed in the Noetic Learning Math Contest. The Noetic Learning Math Contest is an elementary math problem solving contest held twice a year. For this contest, each student has 45 minutes to complete a 20 question math test. The purpose of participating in the contest is to stimulate our students' interest in math and to inspire them to excel in math.

25,166 students from 45 states took the Noetic tests this spring. Audrey Woodruff and Henry Kelley tied for the highest score among the third graders at Irwin. Vishnu Varma and Rowan Miller tied for the highest score of Irwin fourth graders. All 4 students' scores were in the top 10% in the United States and were named to the National Honor Roll.

IMLEA also recognizes outstanding teachers who have contributed "above and beyond" in their classroom with a student, colleague or parent.

eCYBER-MISSION Competition

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize the students who placed first in the state and in the top four regionally in the 2014 6th grade eCYBERMISSION competition.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Memorial Park national science contest team is being recognized for its success in the 2014 eCYBERMISSION competition. For the first time, the team is composed of four 6th graders. These students studied genetically modified organisms in a biology laboratory at the University of St. Francis with the guidance of the university's biology chair. To do this, the students performed two major experiments during five months of work. The first experiment taught them how to identify regular DNA and GMO DNA in both processed foods containing corn as well as in natural corn. In the second experiment, the team conducted three blind tests to learn the effect of feeding GMO cornmeal to fruit flies in comparison to feeding non-GMO cornmeal. In two of the three tests, the fruit flies did better by eating the GMO cornmeal.

The team won 1st place in 6th grade in Indiana and reached the final four in our eleven-state region. Although the team did not advance to the national finals, it did finish in the top 20 of 1,041 6th grade entries in the United States. Each team member will receive \$500 from the contest.
