RELATED INFORMATION: Each year, approximately 17,000 works of art and 3,000 manuscripts become national finalists from nearly 250,000 regional entries submitted by students for the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition. Only 1,000 art entries are recognized with national honors. Tonight, we recognize Carly Sorge for receiving a national Gold Key Award for her computer art entry “The Eccelerant.” Being a national award recipient demonstrates a major achievement for a young artist or writer. Thousands of young people have been nationally recognized since the program began in 1923, including some of America’s most respected talents, such as Truman Capote, Frances Farmer, and Andy Warhol.

All national award recipients are invited to participate in the annual National Celebration Events with an awards ceremony at Carnegie Hall in June. In addition, a series of career workshops and cultural experiences with art industry leaders will be held. National recipients are also encouraged to attend the National Student Art Exhibition at the Corcoran Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C. with student art exhibitions on display from July 1st through August 6th.

Medicaid
Reimburse-

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Medicaid Reimbursement:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a one-year contract renewal with Mecca-Tech, Inc. to provide Fort Wayne Community Schools with Medicaid reimbursement services.

RELATED INFORMATION: Reimbursable services include speech/language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, social work, nursing and individual psychological evaluations for eligible Special Education students. Mecca-Tech, Inc. of Lansing, Michigan has provided a web based program for the last two years. No software will be purchased by Fort Wayne Community Schools. Their fee is based on 10 percent of the net Federal Share of funds that would be reimbursed. The funds recovered will support current Special Education expenditures paid from the General Fund.

Full-Day
Kindergarten
Grant

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Full-Day Kindergarten Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the 2006-2007 Full-Day Kindergarten Grant.

RELATED INFORMATION: The purpose of this grant is to provide full-day programs to improve the academic and social development of children in kindergarten.

The grant opportunity is open to all public school corporations in Indiana. The funds available for the 2006-2007 school year total \$8,500,000, the same as the 2005-2006 allocation. If all public school corporations chose to participate, the minimum grant award would be equal to \$115 per full-day kindergarten student or about \$105,800 for FWCS.

2006
Remediation
Grant

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the 2006 Remediation Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the Indiana Department of Education for student remediation services in the amount of \$549,553.

RELATED INFORMATION: The 1997 General Assembly made additional funds available to school corporations to remediate students who have fallen or are in danger of falling below state proficiency standards. FWCS believes students are best served when remediation is offered in a variety of formats and timeframes. The district is requesting \$366,369 for remediation programs to be implemented beginning in June 2006 and continuing through May 2007. An additional \$183,184 will be provided by the district in matching funds.

Funds from the grant will be used to support remediation activities during the summer. Funds will also be used to hire an Intervention Specialist for each middle school whose job will be to ensure that the school provides appropriate remediation support for students who are struggling to meet grade level standards.

This non-competitive grant written by Greg Slyford, Manager of Academic Support, addresses FWCS Strategic Plan, Strategy 1: *We will ensure high levels of learning for all students* and Strategy 2: *We will provide a positive culture for students and staff.*

A motion was made by Robert A. Armstrong, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the 2006 Remediation Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, Robert A. Armstrong, Carol J. Coen, Stephen Corona, and Geoff Paddock ; nays, Jon J. Olinger and Kurt A. Walborn. The motion passed.

Early
Intervention
Grants

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Early Intervention Grants:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of Early Intervention Grants from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$171,720.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Early Intervention Grants are being submitted to support early intervention programs for young children. The grants provide reimbursement for continued training of district Reading Recovery teachers as required for their certification. In a sub-grant, three elementary schools (Arlington, Brentwood, and Study) have requested funds to provide families of K-2 students with materials to support early reading strategies and funds to provide ample reading materials for K- 2 students. The grant period is for one year.

The grant application addresses FWCS Strategic Plan, Strategy 1: *We will ensure high levels of learning for all students* and Strategy 4: *We will function as the center of learning in the community.*

A motion was made by Robert A. Armstrong, seconded by Stephen Corona, that the recommendation concerning the Early Intervention Grants be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, Robert A. Armstrong, Carol J. Coen, Stephen Corona, Jon J. Olinger, and Geoff Paddock; nays, Kurt A. Walborn. The motion passed.
