Right-of-Way Dedication at Northcrest School

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board authorize the dedication of right-of way to the City of Fort Wayne for curb improvements at Northcrest School. It is further recommended that the superintendent be authorized to sign the appropriate documents and take necessary steps to complete this transfer.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The sidewalks along Stony Run Lane and Archwood Lane at Northcrest School were constructed right next to the streets. Cars pass very close to pedestrians and snow is plowed from the streets onto the sidewalks in winter. For the safety of our students walking to school, FWCS is moving the sidewalks in 5 feet and creating a green space next to the streets. In order to accomplish this, we must dedicate the 5-foot green space to the City. Funding for this project comes from the 2010 Capital Projects Fund budget, Site and Traffic lines. The construction contract has already been approved by the Board.

Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Revised Board Policy - 0000 Bylaws and 1000 Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Revised Board Policy – 0000 Bylaws and 1000 Administration:

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board adopt revised Board Policies for section 0000 Bylaws and section 1000 Administration.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: The Board Policy committee is recommending revisions to Board Policy 0166 Public Participation at Board meetings and Board Policy 1230.04 Lines of Responsibility. A final copy of the proposed policy changes are listed below. The language has been shared with all Board members more than one day prior to this meeting.

### 0166 Public Participation at Board Meetings

Board meetings are conducted for the purpose of carrying on the official business of the school district. The mMeetings are not public forums meetings but are meetings held in public. The Board encourages citizens to express interests and concerns related to the school district, and The agenda for each regular meeting of the Board will include a section for general comments from the public following adjournment of the meeting. One of the primary opportunities for citizens to address the Board is the regularly scheduled Board meetings.

Board meetings are conducted for the purpose of carrying on the official business of the school district. The meetings are not public forum meetings but are meetings held in public. All meetings, except executive sessions, will be open to the public.

The agenda for each regular meeting of the Board will include a section for general comments from the public. Individuals or organizations desiring to speak to the Board should sign in prior to the start of each meeting. If the matter concerns a business or academic problem particular to an individual or concerning a particular school, the Board will not hear comments unless the chain of command and/or appropriate appeal procedures have been exhausted through prior discussions with the appropriate supervisor and the Superintendent or his/her designee in an attempt to resolve the problem. The Board will not permit personal attacks against any person by a speaker, and will refer questions about operations to the Superintendent.

In accordance with provisions of State law, action by the Board on an item presented under general comments from the public is not permitted. No response of any kind will be required by or from any member of the Board or administration either during or at the conclusion of the speaker's remarks. Comments are limited to five (5) three (3) minutes. The School Board president may grant additional time in exceptional circumstances. The President of the Board, or in the absence of the President the presiding officer, is authorized to enforce these rules, and may stop any speaker has the prerogative to discontinue any presentation that violates these public participation procedures.

### 1230.04 Lines of Responsibility

An organizational chart for the School Corporation shall be prepared by the Superintendent and approved by the Board to designate clearly the relationships of all employees within the Corporation organization. The organizational chart shall be kept up to date, and changes shall be approved by the Board.

The Superintendent shall keep the Board apprised of the organizational structure of the corporation, and the Board shall approve changes in that organizational structure. (Etc.)
