BrainPop Online Digital Learning System Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the BrainPop Online Digital Learning System

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a 3-Year K-8 subscription to BrainPop from BrainPop LLC of New York, NY for \$382,826.

RELATED INFORMATION: BrainPOP is a K-8 digital learning system for core content areas, computer science and social emotional learning. This system provides teachers resources, activities, and assessments for designing lessons that use the Deep Learning Essential Elements, especially Leveraging Digital.

The BrainPop subscription includes BrainPop, BrainPop Jr., and BrainPop ELL. BrainPOP has also included \$30,000 of curriculum integration services to FWCS at no additional cost. BrainPOP was used by all middle schools for the 2020-21 school year. Elementary schools piloted BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. during the Fall semester of 2020.

Funding will come from ESSR II funds.

Rachael Dickerhoof, Curriculum Coordinator, and Sara Shipe, District Technology Coordinator, were available to answer questions.

Newsela Online Literacy Resources Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Newsela Online Literacy Resources:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a One-Year subscription for Grades 3-12 to Newsela from Newsela Inc. of New York, NY for \$296,000.

RELATED INFORMATION: Newsela is an online platform featuring high-interest articles for social studies, ELA, science and social emotional learning. Teachers will use Newsela to increase student literacy skills. Newsela articles are from many different reputable organizations including the Associated Press, Smithsonian, PBS and National Geographic. Each article is available at five different Lexile levels and assigned to the student according to their NWEA performance.

Funding will come from ESSR II funds.

Scott Snyder, Curriculum Coordinator and Shannon Quigley, District Technology Coordinator were available to answer questions.

Purchase of Microsoft EES License Agreement Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Purchase of Microsoft EES License Agreement:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a Microsoft Enrollment Education Solutions (EES) License Agreement from Bell Techlogix of Indianapolis, IN for \$181,137.81.

RELATED INFORMATION: This purchase provides Microsoft Windows and Office licenses for all District owned devices. The EES license also includes many of the core data center products such as server operating systems and desktop management tools. This license also allows students and staff to download Microsoft Office on up to five personal devices at no cost.

Since pricing is set by Microsoft and not the reseller, Indiana State Code (IC 5-22-10-7) allows for the purchase of software programs without a bid.

Funding will come from the Operations Fund.

American Rescue Plan for Homeless Children and Youth Fund-Round 1 Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the American Rescue Plan for Homeless Children and Youth Fund-Round 1:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the grant application for and acceptance of American Rescue Plan-Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY1) funds from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$150,000 and submitted by FWCS as Lead LEA of the Allen County McKinney-Vento Consortium.

RELATED INFORMATION: American Rescue Plan-Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY1) funds address the needs of homeless children and youth highlighted by the impact of COVID-19 to supplement existing funds, interventions, and supports.

These funds will provide critical wraparound services to students outside of school hours through contracted community partners to address obstacles that currently impede learning and intensify challenges for homeless students. Services will include transportation to and from doctors' appointments, mental health services, and other supports that strengthen student and parent engagement in the learning process.

The application was written by Christian Perez Mora.

Tim Captain, Director of Student Services, and by Christian Perez Mora, Families in Transition Coordinator were available to answer questions.
