FWCS Scholarship Recipients 2008

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board accept the resignation of Judge William Lee as the permanent Chair of the FWCS Scholarship Committee.

RELATED INFORMATION: The FWCS Scholarship was established by the Fort Wayne Community Schools Board of Trustees on September 24, 1984. Two years later, over \$100,000 had been raised, and the FWCS Scholarship Committee was formed to establish guidelines and distribute funds to FWCS high school seniors with the first scholarship being awarded in 1987. Members of the committee continue to be appointed by Board members. Judge William Lee was a charter member of the committee. In 1989, the Scholarship Committee By-Laws were revised to establish a permanent

position on the committee for Judge Lee and again revised in March 1991 to name him permanent chair.

During Judge Lee's tenure, he has been instrumental in helping to raise funds for additional scholarships. In 1997, the Wilson Foundation provided \$50,000 to establish the John Young Scholarship, which they continue to donate to annually. He also worked hard to have the courts revise the Chapman Scholarship to include undergraduate students going into the medical field and to change the funding from a non-interest bearing loan to a scholarship.

Judge Lee has been extremely committed to helping provide students the funding they need for higher education. Under his watch, nearly 2 million dollars has been distributed to FWCS seniors seeking to further their education.

Judge Lee introduced and thanked members of the scholarship committee who were present at the Board meeting. He also thanked individuals who gave money to start the scholarships and those who continue to do so.

Resignation of Judge William Lee as Permanent Chair of FWCS Scholarship Committee Appointment of Permanent Chair

On behalf of the Scholarship Committee, Judge Lee made a recommendation that Matt Henry be appointed by the Board to be a permanent member and chair of the scholarship committee. A motion was made by Kevin Brown, seconded by Carol J. Coen that the recommendation be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Kindergarten Orientation Video **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize individuals who contributed to the new Kindergarten Orientation video that was developed as part of the universal Kindergarten Orientation date.

RELATED INFORMATION: On May 8 of this year, all 34 FWCS elementary schools held Kindergarten Orientation and Early Registration. As part of this initiative, a Kindergarten Orientation video was developed with the outstanding teamwork and support from community members. The city of Fort Wayne provided \$4,000 towards the creation of the video, with the remaining \$1,000 coming from the Ready to Learn, Ready School grant. The video was produced by our local PBS station, WFWA. Each school received a copy of the video, and it was shown at all orientations. It was available for viewing on the FWCS website for the month of May. The video script is available in Spanish and Burmese. Additional copies were distributed to Early Childhood centers, CANI Head Start, East Wayne Street Head Start, Early Childhood Alliance, Gingerbread House and many other locations. We would like to recognize and publicly thank those who were strongly involved with funding and producing the video.

Lease of Apple Computers

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Lease of Apple Computers:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the lease of 285 Apple Computers and equipment for our schools to support their school improvement plans in the elementary area.

RELATED INFORMATION: The terms of the lease with Apple computers provide for zero percent interest and annual payments of \$106,165 for three years. Total payments will equal \$318,494.49 and will be funded with Common School Funds (CSF) or School Technology Advancement Accounts (STAA). Most of the computers leased will replace outdated models and others will support computer labs. Leasing allows us to acquire consistent models at one time instead of introducing new models as funds become available.

Indiana law doesn't require public bidding for purchases from a sole source. No bid is required for the purchase of Apple computers because the purchase is directly from the sole source manufacturer. Discounts were provided by Apple totaling \$14,857.26.

The need for computers and the type recommended at our schools is determined by the area technology coordinators.

A motion was made by Kevin Brown, seconded by Mitch Sheppard, that the recommendation concerning the Lease of Apple Computers be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Language Arts Reading Adoption Waiver

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Language Arts Reading Adoption Waiver:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve submission of a textbook waiver to the Indiana Board of Education to use the Macmillan/McGraw Hill Treasures series as the text for elementary language arts for the period 2008-2009 through 2014-2015.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Indiana State Board of Education adopts textbooks and related materials for use on a statewide basis according to the legally prescribed six-year cycle. Reading adoption was scheduled for 2007 and language arts (writing, speaking, listening) adoption was scheduled for 2008. Nearly 75% of Indiana school districts, including FWCS, combine their adoptions to integrate reading, writing, speaking, and listening as part of their research-based language arts program. On April 14, 2008, the FWCS Board of School Trustees approved the adoption of the Macmillan/McGraw Hill Treasures series for the period 2008-2015. However, for this adoption cycle, materials approved by the state for 2007 did not appear on the state 2008 list, thus requiring school districts to request a textbook waiver to comply with all aspects of the adoption requirements. The DOE has indicated tentative approval of the waiver.

A motion was made by Pamela Martin-Díaz, seconded by Kevin Brown, that the recommendation concerning the Language Arts Reading Adoption Waiver be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

2008 Remediation Grant Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the 2008 Remediation Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the Indiana Department of Education for student remediation services in the amount of \$571,048.

RELATED INFORMATION: The General Assembly makes additional funds available to school corporations to remediate students who have fallen or are in danger of falling below state proficiency standards. Fort Wayne Community Schools believes students are best served when remediation is offered in a variety of formats and timeframes. The district is requesting \$571,048 for remediation programs to be implemented beginning in June 2008 and continuing through May 2009. An additional \$285,524 will be provided by the district in matching funds.

Funds from the grant will be used to support remediation activities during the summer and provide support for the Read 180 program. In addition, these funds will enable FWCS to hire an Intervention Specialist for each middle school whose job will be to ensure that the school provides appropriate remediation support for students who are struggling to meet grade level standards.

The Remediation Grant is a non-competitive entitlement grant which promotes District Goal I: *Achieving and Maintaining Academic Excellence*.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Mitch Sheppard, that the recommendation concerning the 2008 Remediation Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Title I Basic and Neglected Grant Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Title I Basic and Neglected Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the administration's acceptance of the Title I Basic and Neglected Grant fiscal year 2009 in the amount of \$11,893,321.85 from the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: Title I is a federally funded program designed to enable schools with high concentrations of low-income students to provide opportunities for children to acquire the knowledge and skills in the state content areas and to meet the state performance standards for all children.

Eligibility for Title I services is based on criteria related to family income. FWCS determines target areas on the basis of numbers of students receiving free and reduced lunch. For FWCS, Title I services are delivered in the following sixteen schools: Abbett, Adams, Bloomingdale, Fairfield, Forest Park,

Franke Park, Indian Village, Maplewood, Nebraska, Northcrest, South Wayne, Scott, Study, Washington, Kekionga, and Miami.

Students living in the target areas who attend non-public schools are provided instruction through a resource teacher, an instructional assistant or a service provider. Twenty non-public schools also participate in the fiscal year 2009 grant. In addition, three institutions for neglected children, Spencer House, The Redwoods/ParkCenter and Crossroad, will receive services. Services to homeless FWCS students also fall within the Title I grant.

The grant supports District Goal I: *Achieving and Maintaining Academic Excellence* and is managed by Carol Kettler, Title I Manager.

A motion was made by Kevin Brown, seconded by Mitch Sheppard, that the recommendation concerning the Title I Basic and Neglected Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Title I Delinquent Grant

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Title I Delinquent Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the administration's application for and acceptance of the Title I Delinquent Grant for fiscal year 2009 in the amount of \$461,670.41 from the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Allen County Juvenile Center receives funds through the Title I Delinquent Grant to support instruction and transitional services for clients. Instruction is designed to sustain academic growth during residency and to close the achievement gap. Both credit course work and/or tutorial services are available.

The grant supports District Goal I: *Achieving and Maintaining Academic Excellence* and is managed by Carol Kettler, Title I Manager.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Kevin Brown, that the recommendation concerning the Title I Delinquent Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

National Football Foundation (NFF) "Play It Smart" Grant Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the National Football Foundation (NFF) "Play It Smart" Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a 2008/2009 National Football Foundation (NFF) grant for \$15,000 for the "Play It Smart" program at Wayne High School.

RELATED INFORMATION: In 2006, the "Play It Smart" program was started at Wayne High School. This program revolves around six goals for the student/athletes:

- 1. Improve grade point average.
- 2. Increase the number of students taking the SAT/ACT and improved scores on these tests.
- 3. Increase graduation rate and opportunities for higher education.
- 4. Enhance life skills development.
- 5. Increase opportunities for community service.
- 6. Increase parental and family involvement.

Since 2006 the program has shown incredible results, including improvement in student/athletes registering for SAT/ACT, mandatory academic study tables for any student/athlete who has a D+ or lower, fewer academically ineligible student/athletes, an increase in college visits for athletes and 100% of athletes who have applied to a college have been accepted

This grant funds the partial salary for the Academic Coach. Two community partners, Fort Wayne Medical Education Program and Orthopedics Northeast, fund the balance.

The grant supports District Goal I: *Achieving and Maintaining Academic Excellence* and is managed by Wayne Athletic Director Adam Swinford.
