Academic
Super Bowl

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize students and staff from Elmhurst, South Side and Snider high schools and Lane, Memorial Park, Shawnee, Northwood and Portage middle schools for placing in the top 10 at recent state Academic Super Bowl competitions.

RELATED INFORMATION: Each year, students from across the state compete in the Ameritech Hoosier Academic Super Bowl state finals. More than 100 schools participated in the middle school competition in April and the high school competition in May. The annual competition tests students' knowledge in several subject areas, including math, science and English.

Elmhurst and Snider are state champions in the social studies and interdisciplinary competitions respectively. Elmhurst won in the Class 2 category and Snider won in the Class 1 category. Snider also placed sixth in Class 1 fine arts. South Side placed fourth in Class 1 fine arts.

In the middle school competition, Shawnee claimed the state title in Class 2 competition in social studies and interdisciplinary. It's the second year Shawnee has earned 1st place in social studies. The English team finished fifth. Also in Class 2 competition, Portage finished third in English, Northwood finished fourth in social studies and Memorial Park was third. Lane was third in Class 2 science competition.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize the members of the Education Improvement Committee (EIC) for their commitment to the students of Fort Wayne Community Schools.

RELATED INFORMATION: The EIC was formed in 1989 to oversee the responsibilities of the racial balance settlement between Fort Wayne Community Schools and Parents for Quality Education with Integration (PQEI). By 1992, all Fort Wayne Community Schools elementary schools were racially balanced. In 2001, state funding for the PQEI settlement ended. The work of the committee will benefit this community for many years to come.

Vouchers Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the vouchers for the period ending May 15, 2002, and May 29, 2002, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Donald J. Schaab, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 02-10 and 02-11 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Adult and Continuing Education Grants Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Adult and Continuing Education Grants:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a Comprehensive Adult Education Program Grant and a Program Enhancement Grant from the Indiana Department of Education, Division of Adult Education by Fort Wayne Community Schools Adult and Continuing Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Comprehensive Adult Education Program Grant monies are used to support an adult education program through the purchase of materials and supplies for student use, and to pay costs for clerical support, administrative and guidance functions, costs related to assessment and registration. This funding enables Fort Wayne Community Schools to serve over 2200 adult learners annually who are working toward GED certificates, improving their basic academic skills, and/or English as a Second Language. The Fund Year 2003 Base award in the amount of \$225,327.00 has been set aside for Region 11, comprised of Allen, Whitley, and Huntington counties. An additional grant in the amount of \$19,014.00 is competitive and, if awarded, will be used to enhance inter-agency coordination with Workforce Investment Agency partners, literacy programs, and district councils, as well as to enhance student recruitment, retention, and/or student outcomes. Eligibility for the combined grants totaling \$244,341.00 is contingent on the maintenance of the current level of local effort at \$70,916.00 per year which pays for some secretarial, custodial, counseling, and administrative costs.

These grants, written by Bonnie Rogers, Coordinator of Continuing Education, address advancements intended and outlined in the Fort Wayne Community Schools Strategic Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees. Specifically, Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy VII, Student Centered Environment are addressed.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Adult and Continuing Education Grants be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

2002 - 2003 Safe Haven Grant Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the 2002 - 2003 Safe Haven Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute for \$159,000 for Safe Haven programs at Scott and Washington elementary schools.

RELATED INFORMATION: Governor O'Bannon's Safe Haven Program provides funds for school corporations and community organizations to jointly develop plans to keep schools open for extended hours to implement programs to reduce substance abuse, reduce violent behavior, and promote educational progress.

The Scott and Washington sites will extend the hours after school that the facility is open and will collaborate with the Minority Health Coalition, Park Center, St. Joseph Hospital, and other community agencies. The after-school program includes a variety of activities such as computer enrichment, homework help, creative arts, gymnastics, dance, and remediation.

This competitive grant addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy III, Safe and Caring Environment and Strategy X, Community Linkages.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the 2002 - 2003 Safe Haven Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Elementary Foreign Language Incentive Program

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Elementary Foreign Language Incentive Program:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the Elementary School Foreign Language Incentive program from the United States Department of Education for Lindley Elementary School. The total grant is in the amount of \$6,000,000 to be distributed among the awarded schools. The exact amount of funds available for Lindley Elementary School will be determined by the number of schools applying.

RELATED INFORMATION: The objective of this competitive grant is for staff development and implementing Lindley's improvement plan. The grant will be assist in teacher in-services and curriculum improvement. It would also provide additional library books in Spanish and Spanish teacher materials. Students, parents, and teachers will benefit from this grant.

This program aligns with FWCS Strategic Plan, Strategies V, "Staff Effectiveness" and VII, "Student-Centered Environment."

RELATED INFORMATION: Fort Wayne Community Schools appoints two representatives to serve one year terms on the Allen County Historical Society Board. Dennis McClurg, Snider High School principal, has agreed to continue serving in this position from July 1, 2002 through June 20, 2003. Deborah Morgan, Public Information Officer for Fort Wayne Community Schools, has also agreed to serve on the board for the Historical Society for one year beginning July 1, 2002.

The funds will be used for property purchase, construction management fees, architectural fees, site work, structural steel purchases and foundation work.

RELATED INFORMATION: Repayment of these notes will come from issuance of the proposed after \$49,750,000 bond issue in the spring of 2003.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the PL 221 School Improvement Plans:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the PL 221 School Improvement Plans submitted to the Superintendent.

RELATED INFORMATION: All Fort Wayne Community Schools' schools have complied with the requirements of Public Law 221 by developing three-year comprehensive School Improvement Plans. These plans were designed by Quality Improvement Teams, representing all stakeholders, and with active participation by staff members, parents, and community members. They specifically focus on student achievement in English/Language Arts and Mathematics, aligning closely with the Indiana School Accountability system and the federal legislation "No Child Left Behind".

Fort Wayne Community Schools and Fort Wayne Education Association served as active partners in leading the process and, as required by law, Fort Wayne Education Association has approved the Professional Development Programs developed by the teams. These Professional Development Programs, when approved by IDOE, will lead to professional development funding by the State. Following approval by the Board of School Trustees, the plans will be submitted to IDOE. John Kline presented a report on the PL 221 School Improvement Plans.

The School Improvement Plans address advancement intended and outlined in the Strategic Plan, particularly in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy V, Staff Effectiveness.

A motion was made by Donald J. Schaab, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the PL 221 School Improvement Plans be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Voluntary
Student
Drug
Testing

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Voluntary Student Drug Testing:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the guidelines for a new program of voluntary student drug testing.

RELATED INFORMATION: This voluntary program will be made available to any student in the district whose parent deems it necessary. Testing will be done through a process that analyzes a small hair sample clipped from the student's head. Results of the testing will be confidential, and communicated directly to the parent from the testing lab.

These guidelines have been reviewed by several school and community groups, including the Fort Wayne PTA Council, Key Communicators, and Fort Wayne Community Schools administrators, teachers, and nurses.

School personnel will make parents aware of this program by publicizing it in all handbooks and similar materials distributed annually by Fort Wayne Community Schools. A listing of community agencies that provide assistance for those with drug abuse problems will also be made available to parents when a request for testing is made.

Hair sampling kits will be available at each school through the school nurse. The kits will provide information, forms, and materials necessary to remove a hair sample and mail it to the lab. School nurses will remove hair samples in the presence of the parent, and prepare it for transport to the lab. Results will be obtained by the parent shortly after shipment of the sample.

Students involved in a confirmed violation of the Fort Wayne Community Schools Behavior Code will still be subject to the same consequences listed therein.

This guideline supports Strategic Plan Strategies III, insuring a safe, caring environment; and VI, initiating and maintaining meaningful relationships with families. It also supports Fort Wayne Community Schools Policy 2413 regarding Health Services and Policy 5530 regarding Drug Prevention.

A motion was made by Carl A. Johnson, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the Voluntary Student Drug Testing be approved.

Following discussion of the Voluntary Student Drug Testing, Jon J. Olinger made a motion that the recommendation be tabled. This was seconded by Donald J. Schaab, Roll Call: Ayes, Stephen Corona, Carl A. Johnson, Jon J. Olinger, Bettye J. Poignard, Donald J. Schaab; Nays, Jerome F. Henry, Sr.. The motion to table the recommendation passed.
