WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools certification from the Indiana Office of Management and Budget was \$755,469.

WHEREAS, the covered cumulative or capital project fund(s) for which the Fort Wayne Community Schools is seeking a loan is the Capital Projects Fund.

WHEREAS, the expected unencumbered balance at December 31, 2012 in the covered cumulative or capital projects fund(s) for which the Fort Wayne Community Schools is seeking a loan is expected to be zero.

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools requests a loan in the amount of \$755,469.

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools agrees to impose a property tax levy in calendar year 2013 for the debt service fund to repay the total amount loaned from the state general fund.

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools agrees to repay the total amount loaned in two equal installments in calendar year 2013 with the first installment due on the June settlement date specified in I.C. 6-1.1.27.3 and the second installment due on the December settlement date specified in I.C.6-1.1-27-3.

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools agrees that upon the failure to pay an installment of a loan when due, the treasurer of state may withhold the amount of the unpaid installment from any funds held by the state that would otherwise be due to the Fort Wayne Community Schools and deposit the amount in the state general fund.

She noted that the school will miss the principal next year.</p> <p>Board member Jordan Lebamoff commented about receiving flyers at his home for a carnival at the Imagine charter school. He is thankful that FWCS advertises what is offered for student academic success, not popcorn and balloons.</p> <p>Board President Mark GiaQuinta commented on what he considers the unethical practice of a charter school changing the location of the school after the application has been submitted/approved. Mr. GiaQuinta also commented on the practice of the Catholic Diocese of Fort Wayne South Bend offering bounty money to people bringing in students on the voucher system. Mr. GiaQuinta would like the Board to consider adopting resolutions regarding both these matters.</p> <p>Superintendent Robinson thanked administrators, teachers, parents and students in the district for a great year.</p>
