Roll Call

The Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools met in regular session in the Lester L. Grile Administrative Center on Monday, September 22, 2005, at 7:05 p.m. President Carol J. Coen called the meeting to order with the following members in attendance:

Approval of Minutes – May 23, 2005 A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held May 23, 2005, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Wendy Robinson, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Scholarship Winners **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize Fort Wayne Community Schools scholarship winners.

RELATED INFORMATION: Twenty-five FWCS seniors were recently awarded scholarships by the Fort Wayne Community Schools scholarship committee. The scholarship committee is permanently chaired by Judge William C. Lee and other committee members are selected by FWCS Board members.

This year, the committee awarded the Helen Groot, Caroline Zwick, John F. Young, Charles Baker, Maryann Chapman, Alice MacPherson and Mary Lowery scholarships. Students who receive these scholarships must be FWCS seniors who plan to attend a four-year college or university. They are screened based on financial need, scholarship, leadership and initiative displayed during their high school years. Chapman recipients must also plan to earn a degree in the medical field.

National School Public Relations Association Award **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize Deborah Morgan, public information officer, for receiving a top award from the National School Public Relations Association for a public relations plan promoting the new kindergarten start date earlier this school year.

RELATED INFORMATION: The National School Public Relations Association recognized the district's "New Kindergarten Start Date" public relations plan with its highest honor – a Golden Achievement Award. Entries from across the country are judged against award criteria that reveal outstanding achievement in the four steps of a public relations program. Golden Achievement Award recipients have demonstrated success in all four areas. The New Kindergarten Start Date plan was created and implemented by Deborah Morgan and targeted at making the community aware that beginning with the 2004-05 school year, all kindergarteners would begin school on the same day as other students instead of two days later as had been past practice.

Vouchers

Dr. Robinson presented the vouchers for the period ending June 1, 2005, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Kurt A. Walborn, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 05-10 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Purchase of Property – North Side High School Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Purchase of Property – North Side High School:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board authorize the purchase of the following property located near North Side High School:

Address Appraisal #1 Appraisal #2 Purchase Price 624 Fricke Ave. \$88,000 \$96,000 \$92,000

RELATED INFORMATION: The current school site is significantly below the state minimum acreage recommendation. Funds are within budget.

A motion was made by Robert A. Armstrong, seconded by Geoff Paddock, that the recommendation concerning the Purchase of Property – North Side High School be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Medicaid Reimbursement Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Medicaid Reimbursement:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a one-year contract with Mecca-Tech, Inc. to provide Fort Wayne Community Schools with Medicaid reimbursement services.

RELATED INFORMATION: Reimbursable services include speech/language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, social work, nursing and individual psychological evaluations for eligible Special Education students. Mecca-Tech, Inc. of Lansing, MI provided the best proposal that includes a web based program. No software will be purchased by Fort Wayne Community Schools. Their fee is based on 10% of the net Federal Share of funds that would be reimbursed. The funds recovered will support current Special Education expenditures paid from the General Fund.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the recommendation concerning the Medicaid Reimbursement be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Non-Union Salary Increase Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Non-Union Salary Increase:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a one and one-half percent (1.5%) salary increase for the 2005/2006 contract year for Salary Schedules I, II and III, Meet & Confer groups and other non-union groups paid on fiscal-year schedule.

It is recommended that the Board approve a one and one-half percent (1.5%) salary increase effective January 1, 2006 for the remainder of the Meet & Confer and other non-union groups who are paid on a calendar-year schedule.

RELATED INFORMATION: This pay increase was calculated using the same formula as agreed upon with Fort Wayne Education Association (FWEA) and is the minimum level available for 2005/2006.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Stephen Corona, that the recommendation concerning the Non-Union Salary Increase be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Food Service Center Lease Public Hearing Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Food Service Center Lease Public Hearing:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board conduct a public hearing and approve a resolution regarding the terms and conditions of the proposed form of lease for the Food Service Center.

RELATED INFORMATION: At the May 23, 2005 board meeting, the board approved a resolution that authorized the public hearing at tonight's meeting. The hearing was also properly advertised. The public hearing and resolution are to consider the following terms: that the project is in the public interest; that the plans provide for necessary facilities for the district; that the maximum annual rental is not to exceed \$1,340,000; that an annual tax levy shall be authorized each year; that the aggregate principal amount of bonds not exceed \$11,950,000; and various other requirements of executing the lease.

Hearing

This was the appropriate time for members of the public to speak regarding this resolution. No one spoke at the hearing.

RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF THE LEASE AND MATTERS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, this Board of School Trustees (the "Board") of the Fort Wayne Community Schools (the "School Corporation"), has previously examined and approved a form of a lease (the "Lease") with the Fort Wayne Community Schools Food Service Center Building Corporation, an Indiana nonprofit corporation existing pursuant to the Indiana Code 23-17, as amended (the "Act"), as lessor (the "Building Corporation"), of all or a portion of (a) the existing food service center ("Existing Facility"), its related outdoor facilities, (b) the land upon which Existing Facility and its related outdoor facilities are located (the "Existing Real Estate"), (c) the land upon which a new food service center will be

constructed, which will be located at, or in the vicinity of, 3211 West Ludwig Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46818 (the "New Real Estate"), and (d) upon its completion, a new food service center which will replace the Existing Facility (the "New Facility") (clauses (a) through and including (d), collectively, the "Property");

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing on the proposed Lease was given by publication as required by law:

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2005, a public hearing was conducted in accordance with Indiana Code 21-5-12-7 as to whether the execution of the Lease is necessary and whether the rentals in the Lease are fair and reasonable for the proposed facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered the testimony and other evidence presented at the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF THE Fort Wayne COMMUNITY SCHOOLS, that:

Section 1. Providing for the Project is in the public interest, and it is a proper public purpose for which this Board agrees to cooperate with the Building Corporation and to assist it in fulfilling the requirements of all the agencies of the federal, state and local governments.

Section 2. The drawings, plans and specifications and estimates for all the cost of the Project, including but not limited to, all costs of acquisition, renovation and construction associated with the Project, provide for necessary facilities for the School Corporation and the same are hereby approved.

Section 3. The proposed Lease, as described in the notice of the public hearing and with a maximum annual rental not to exceed \$1,340,000, be, and hereby is, confirmed in accordance with Indiana Code 21-5-12-7(a), and provides for a fair and reasonable rental of all or a portion of the Property, and further, the execution of the Lease is necessary and wise.

Section 4. The President of the Board is authorized and directed to initial and date a copy of the proposed Lease and to place the same in the record book immediately following the minutes of this meeting, and further, the Lease is hereby made a part of this Resolution as fully as if the same were set forth herein.

Section 5. Any officer of the Board is authorized and directed to execute the Lease, in the name and on behalf of the School Corporation, and the Secretary of the Board, or any other officer of the Board, is hereby authorized and directed to attest such execution of the Lease.

Section 6. The Secretary of the Board, or any other officer of the School Corporation, be, and hereby is, authorized and directed, on behalf of the School Corporation to publish notice of the execution of the Lease in accordance with Indiana Code 21-5-12-7(b).

Section 7. An annual tax levy shall be authorized in each year during the term of the Lease to provide the necessary funds with which to pay the rent under the Lease.

Section 8. The issuance, sale and delivery by the Building Corporation of its first mortgage bonds in one or more series to be designated as the Fort Wayne Community Schools Food Service Center Building Corporation First Mortgage Bonds (the "Bonds"), in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$11,950,000, is hereby approved.

Section 9. Upon the repayment or prepayment by the School Corporation of all of the outstanding principal amount of the Bonds, the School Corporation, as lessee, will accept from the Building Corporation title to the Property, including any addition as thereto, free and clear of any and all liens and encumbrances thereon except as otherwise permitted by the Lease.

Section 10. The Building Corporation may issue, sell and deliver such Bonds, pursuant to the applicable laws of the State of Indiana, may encumber any property acquired by it for the purpose of financing such facilities, and may enter into contracts for the sale of the Bonds and the Project.

Section 11. Any member of the Board or officer or attorney of the School Corporation be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to file, pursuant to Indiana Code 21-5-12-8, a petition in the Circuit Court of Allen County requesting the appointment of appraisers (the "Appraisers") to determine the fair market value of the Property. Following the issuance of each series of the Bonds and upon receipt of cash in an amount not less than the amount fixed by the Appraisers as the fair market value of the Property, any officer of the Board be, and hereby is, authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the School Corporation, to execute and deliver one or more special warranty deeds conveying title to all or a portion of the Property to the Building Corporation.

Section 12. Any member of the Board or officer of the School Corporation be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to take any action and execute any documents, agreements and certificates as such member of officer deems necessary and desirable to effectuate the foregoing resolutions, and any such actions, documents, agreements and certificates heretofore taken or executed, including, but not limited to, publication of the notice of the public hearing on the Lease, be, and hereby are, ratified and approved.

A motion was made by Kurt A. Walborn, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Food Service Center Lease Public Hearing be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Cash Management Services Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Cash Management Services:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve Bank One as the cash management services provider to FWCS for the period August 2005 to July 2007.

RELATED INFORMATION: Under the provisions of I.C. 5-13-11, school corporations are permitted to enter into a written cash management agreement with a local bank for a two year period. Such an agreement allows bank employees to invest school corporation funds at mutually agreed upon rates. The agreement requires the bank to provide reconciliation services and all banking records as required by the state board of accounts. Any full service bank is eligible to submit a cash management system proposal as long as the system meets or exceeds FWCS specifications.

Requests for proposals were mailed to eleven banks with nine responding. The Bank One proposal provides the highest estimated earnings net of fees. Bank One has been the cash management services provider since 2001 and there are no service issues that would prompt a change.

It is further recommended that hamburger, wiener, pizza, single, and three compartment foil containers be withdrawn.

RELATED INFORMATION: The bid is for a one-year supply of cafeteria disposable products such as plastic and aluminum containers, plastic and polyester film, and spork packs to be used at the Food Service Center.

Invitations to Bid were mailed to sixteen prospective bidders with twelve responding. Of these twelve, the bid of Dispoz-O Plastics, Incorporated, Fountain Inn, SC did not meet legal requirements. Kegan Corporation, Auburn, IN and Penny Plate, Haddonfield, NJ submitted a "No Bid." Overall, the prices of the recommended bidders reflect an eight percent increase when compared to the last bid opened in May 2004.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a Smaller SPACES: Smaller Learning Communities grant from the United States Department of Education in the amount of \$5,049,890 over a five-year period for the six FWCS high schools.

RELATED INFORMATION: This competitive federal grant is intended to provide personalized support for high school students in both academic and social development so that more students are successful at that level. We hope to assure that all students reach the required academic goals and offer meaningful programs such as additional college experiences, internships, or alternatives to the traditional high school.

If awarded, funds would be used for: the development of a strong freshman program to establish a solid academic base and sense of community; to develop multiple upper level pathways for students that expand their opportunities to receive and use rigorous academic training in authentic ways; and to provide extensive professional development opportunities for strengthening teacher content knowledge and effectiveness in communicating content knowledge to students.

Dr. Carol Lindquist, Chief Academic Officer, will oversee the implementation of this program which addresses the FWCS Strategic Plan: strategy 1, We will ensure high levels of learning for all students; and strategy 3, We will function as a professional learning community.

Full-Day Kindergarten Grant Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Full-Day Kindergarten Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the 2005-2006 Full-Day Kindergarten Grant.

RELATED INFORMATION: The purpose of this grant is to provide full-day programs to improve the academic and social development of children in kindergarten.

The grant opportunity is open to all public school corporations in Indiana. The funds available for the 2005-2006 school year total \$8,500,000, the same as the 2004-2005 allocation. If all public school corporations chose to participate, the minimum grant award would be equal to a school corporation's ADM for 2005-2006 multiplied by approximately \$8.50 about \$250,000 for FWCS. In 2003-2004 FWCS received \$463,729 for this program and in 2004-2005 FWCS received \$401,815.
