Dr. Mark Daniel, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Dr. Wendy Robinson Recognition The Board of School Trustees took the time to recognize the renaming of the Family and Community Engagement Center to the Wendy Y. Robinson Family and Community Engagement Center. Senator Andy Zay, a member of the northeast Indiana delegation, wishes to recognize Dr. Wendy Robinson.

Dr. Robinson served as the Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools July 2003 to June 2020. In total, she served the district for 47 years starting as a teacher. Among her many accomplishments was the creation of the Family and Community Engagement Center to better serve FWCS families.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Dr. Wendy Robinson upon her retirement as Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools.

Whereas, After more than four decades in public education, Dr. Wendy Robinson will retire as Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools at the conclusion of the 2019-2020 school year;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson attained her undergraduate degree from DePauw University, post-graduate degrees from Indiana University-Bloomington and Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne, and earned her Doctor of Education degree in educational administration and supervision from Ball State University in 1996;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson has spent her entire career with Fort Wayne Community Schools, starting out as a classroom teacher before holding the positions of assistant principal, principal, and central office administrator:

Whereas, In July 2003, after serving eight years as Deputy Superintendent, Dr. Robinson was appointed Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson is nationally recognized for her expertise in improving urban education, and has spoken at conferences and events hosted by organizations such as Learning Forward, The Wallace Foundation, the American Association of School Administrators, and the NYC Leadership Academy.

Whereas, A longtime member of the Indiana Urban Schools Association, Dr. Robinson served as the Association's President in 2012, 2013, and 2018;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson also served as a member of the Indiana Panel to Study Alternatives to ISTEP, a committee appointed to recommend changes to Indiana's standardized testing system;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson has worked to form partnerships with Fort Wayne agencies and businesses to increase educational opportunities for Fort Wayne students, and serves on numerous boards including Greater Fort Wayne, Inc. and Parkview Hospital;

Whereas, Dr. Robinson has received numerous awards for her service, including the Superintendent of the Year Award from the Indiana Association of Public School Superintendents in 2018, the Chairman's Award from the Indiana Civil Rights Commission in 2013, the Mike Kneale Educational Excellence in Leadership Award from the Education Research and Development Institute in 2012, the Joseph E. Hill Superintendent of the Year Award from the National Alliance of Black School Educators in 2009, and the District II Superintendent of the Year Award from the Indiana Association of Public School Superintendents in 2008; and

Whereas, Dr. Robinson's tireless advocacy for public education and her work as Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools will be felt for years to come: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors Dr. Wendy Robinson upon her retirement as Superintendent of Fort Wayne Community Schools.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to Dr. Wendy Robinson.

Student Basic Accident Insurance and Athletic Insurance Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Student Basic Accident Insurance and Athletic Insurance:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve a two-year agreement for student accident insurance through First Agency, Inc. at a cost of \$154,277 for 2022-2023.

RELATED INFORMATION: We received proposals from two agents specializing in student insurance. First Agency, Inc. provided the lowest premium for the coverage we requested. The premium for the basic sports and accident insurance for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years will be \$150,500. That is a \$24,220 decrease from 2021-2022. This will provide a \$25,000 maximum medical benefit with a \$0 deductible for each student.

The premium for catastrophic coverage will be \$4,777 for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years, a \$198 decrease from 2021-2022. The coverage with a maximum benefit of \$5,000,000 is for middle school athletes only. The IHSAA provides catastrophic coverage for high school athletes.

The insurance carrier for the basic sports and accident insurance is Guarantee Trust Life Insurance Company (AM Best Rated A-). The carrier for the catastrophic insurance is National Union Fire Insurance Company (AM Best Rated A). Claims will be processed by First Agency, Inc.

Optional policies will be available to parents to provide 24-hour coverage and/or extended dental coverage at the expense of the parents. Funding will come from the Operations Fund.

RELATED INFORMATION: Half-pints of milk, estimated at 5.7 million annually, represent about 90% of total dairy purchases for FWCS schools and other potentially vended programs. Other dairy items such as yogurt, cottage cheese and larger units of milk will also be provided and are in addition to the cost above. The bid is for a one-year contract with the option to renew.

Invitations to Bid were mailed to two prospective bidders with both responding.

Heinemann Literacy Resources

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of Leveled Literacy Intervention materials from Heinemann of Portsmouth, New Hampshire, for \$431,000.

RELATED INFORMATION: Leveled Literacy Intervention is a specifically designed reading program to be used for special education students that are reading below grade level in grades K-5. Funding will come from American Relief Funds for special education.

Dr. Nikki Sprunger, Assistant Superintendent of Diverse Learners, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Rohli Booker, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Heinemann Literacy Resources be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Ratification of the Fort Wayne Classified Association (FWCA) and Fort Wayne Nurses Association (FWNA) Contracts:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board ratify the collectively bargained agreements between FWCS and the FWCA and FWNA.

RELATED INFORMATION: The parties negotiated four-year contracts that will reopen exclusively to renegotiate compensation in 2023 and 2025. The salaries and wages of these employees will increase by 4% consistent with the increases for teachers.

These negotiated changes will assist in the recruitment and retention of nurses and our classified staff.

Charles Cammack, Jr., Chief Operations Officer or David Amen, General Counsel, were available to answer any questions.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Jennifer Matthias, that the recommendation concerning the Ratification of the Fort Wayne Classified Association (FWCA) and Fort Wayne Nurses Association (FWNA) Contracts be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Ratification of the Fort Wayne Classified Association (FWCA) and Fort Wayne Nurses Association (FWNA) Contracts Loan:

Temporary Inter-fund Loan Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Temporary Inter-fund

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve all inter-fund loans necessary to

eliminate deficits in certain funds of the corporation as of June 30, 2022.

RELATED INFORMATION: Cash deficits in funds of the corporation are not allowed at the end of a fiscal year. Deficits in property tax supported funds could occur if the distribution of property taxes from Allen County is short of expectations. Normal timing differences between revenue and expenditures could cause temporary deficits. State statute allows temporary transfers between funds if certain requirements are met. The treasurer will make all necessary transfers and report the loans to the Board.

Chief Financial Officer, Kathy Friend, was available to answer any questions.

A motion was made by Noah Smith, seconded by Rohli Booker, that the recommendation concerning the Temporary Inter-fund Loan be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve a transfer of up to \$10,000,000 from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund. This represents 4.4% of budgeted Education Fund revenue.

RELATED INFORMATION: Beginning in 2019, Indiana school districts deposit State tuition support to the Education Fund and property taxes to the Operations Fund. Transfers from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund are necessary to properly fund expenditures necessary to the operations of the school district. Half will be transferred by June 30 and the balance needed by December 31.

Chief Financial Officer, Kathy Friend, will be available to answer any questions.

RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER AMOUNTS FROM EDUCATION FUND TO THE OPERATIONS FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees is the governing body of Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 required the governing body of each school corporation to establish an Education Fund for the payment of expenses allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 required the governing body of each school corporation to establish an Operations Fund for the payment of expenses that are not allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 requires that distributions of tuition support be received in the Education Fund.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of School Trustees authorizes the Treasurer of Fort Wayne Community Schools to transfer the amount of \$10,000,000 from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund to reimburse the Operations Fund for expenses that are not allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5 for the period of 2022.

This resolution was duly made, seconded and adopted this 13th day of June 2022.

A motion was made by Maria Norman, seconded by Rohli Booker, that the recommendation concerning the Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Wendy Y. Robinson Family and Community Engagement Center Report

Tim Captain, Director Student, Family and Support Services and Natalie McLaughlin Parkview School Health Lead Nurse at FACE did a presentation and were available to answer questions on the Wendy Y. Robinson Family and Community Engagement Center.

Comments

Board President Anne Duff remarked that she sat here six months ago when there was a school shooting in Michigan. She said then, that she did not think legislators would move quickly on this but wanted to make sure FWCS was doing the best we could with our programs that are in place to help our students. She now feels helpless, it is our legislators turn to do something. Our students need to be protected, not only in schools, but also when they are out in the community. Stricter gun laws are needed. President Duff states that it is time we start prioritizing students lives in our country. FWCS Security team is doing everything in their power for our students to be safe while at FWCS. She reminded the community that if you see something, say something. Need to discuss this issue and let legislators know. Not up to the schools alone to put an end to this. Thanked those involved in Dr. Robinson's FACE naming event and proclamation. This naming was Julie Hollingsworth's request.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth spoke about educational companies who are saying "no more." Firearms are the leading cause of death under the age of 19. With rights come responsibilities. Seems that the Senate has come to do something, but will it be enough. Also 15% is the threshold for transferring funds.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias spoke about her families experience with gun violence. The last thing parents should think about when they drop their students off at school, is if this will this be the last time they see them. Our students are our most valuable assets. Other countries do things instantly. Disheartening that guns, money and power are more important than students.

Board Member Maria Norman feels we need to hold our legislators accountable. Senator Braun and Senator Young both have received over \$1 million from the NRA. Call your legislator. Not only do we not want anything to happen to students, but we want nothing to happen to our staff either. Member Norman also spoke about her experience as a student and board member at high school graduation. It is an honor and privilege to be one of the first to congratulate the students.

Board Member Rohli Booker echoes that we have to hold legislators accountable. It is great to know what FWCS has in place to keep students and staff safe. She gets consumed with this, but it is also in the minds of our students. Member Booker also spoke about her experience at the recent high school graduations and 5th grade ceremonies she was able to attend.

Board Member Noah Smith stated that it is not the right answer to give hardening funds. Don't need to take guns away but also don't need AK47s. Doesn't matter if school board is republican or democrat, the board is about what is good for the kids. Member Smith also spoke about South Side's 100 graduation class and the medallion he received.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel spoke about some of the student graduation speeches, that they need to be on Ted Talk, as they were so aspiring. We need to also listen to law enforcement officers.
