Approval of Minutes – June 9, 2003

Dr. Thomas Fowler-Finn, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Indiana PTA Teacher of the Year **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize Forest Park Elementary School teacher Jacalyn Butler for being named Indiana PTA Teacher of the Year.

RELATED INFORMATION: Jacalyn Butler, an FWCS teacher since 1990, teaches second grade at Forest Park. She was honored by the Indiana PTA at the state conference in May. It is the second consecutive year an FWCS teacher has received the Indiana PTA's highest teaching award. Butler was selected for her commitment to her students, competence as a teacher and efforts to strengthen student achievement by working with the school's PTA. Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grant Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the administration's acceptance of the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grant fiscal year 2004 in the amount of \$6,130,067 from the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: Title 1 is a federally funded program designed to enable schools with high concentrations of low-income students to provide opportunities for children to acquire the knowledge and skills in the state content areas and to meet the state performance standards for all children.

Eligibility for Title 1 services is based on criteria related to family income. FWCS determines target areas on the basis of numbers of students receiving free and reduced lunch. For FWCS, Title 1 services are delivered in the following ten schools: Abbett, Adams, Bloomingdale, Geyer, Fairfield, Nebraska, South Wayne, Scott, Study and Washington. Students living in the target areas who attend non-public schools are provided instruction through a resource teacher, an instructional assistant or a service provider. Fifteen non-public schools also participate in the fiscal year 2004 grant. In addition, three institutions for neglected children – Park Center, Spencer House, and Crossroad – will receive services. Services to homeless FWCS students also fall within the Title 1 grant.

Please note this is a planning allocation as the final allocation will not be known until at least the middle of July.

The grant addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy VI Meaningful Relationships with Families. It is managed by Carol Kettler, Title 1 Manager.

A motion was made by Geoff Paddock, seconded by Kurt A. Walborn, that the recommendation concerning the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Adult and Continuing Education Grant

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Adult and Continuing Education Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a Comprehensive Adult Education Program Grant and a Program Enhancement Grant from the Indiana Department of Education, Division of Adult Education by FWCS Adult and Continuing Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Comprehensive Adult Education Program Grant monies are used to support an adult education program through the purchase of materials and supplies for student use, and to pay costs for clerical support, administrative and guidance functions, and costs related to assessment and registration. This funding enables FWCS to serve over 2200 adult learners annually who are working toward GED certificates, improving their basic academic skills, and/or English as a Second Language. The Fund Year 2004 Base award in the amount of \$225,327.00 has been set aside for Region 11, comprised of Allen, Whitley, and Huntington Counties. An additional grant in the amount of \$6760.00 is competitive and, if awarded, will be used to enhance inter-agency coordination with Workforce Investment Agency partners, literacy programs, and district councils, as well as to enhance student recruitment, retention, and/or student outcomes. Eligibility for the combined grants totaling \$232,087.00 is contingent on the maintenance of the current level of local effort at \$70,967.00 per year which pays for some secretarial, custodial, counseling, and administrative costs.

These grants, written by Bonnie Rogers, Coordinator of Continuing Education, address advancements intended and outlined in the FWCS Strategic Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees. Specifically, Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy VII, Student Centered Environment are addressed.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the recommendation concerning the Adult and Continuing Education Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Legal Services Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning Legal Services:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that William Sweet be retained as the School Corporation's General Counsel at a fixed fee of \$250,000 annually.

RELATED INFORMATION: In order to control legal costs, we have negotiated an arrangement with William Sweet, the Corporation's primary outside counsel, to devote a minimum of 80% of his time exclusively to FWCS for a fixed fee significantly less than current costs. We anticipate savings in excess of \$100,000 annually, and the arrangement may be terminated at any time if it is unsatisfactory to the Corporation.
