RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board recognize the Early College program at North Side High School and their collegiate partner Vincennes University and the Early College program at Wayne High School and their collegiate partner Ivy Tech Community College.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Early College program enables more students, particularly low-income, first generation and minority students, to experience rigorous high school and college coursework that leads to improved outcomes. Early college students are outperforming their peers nationwide:

- 90% graduate high school vs. 78% of student nationally
- 94% earn free college credit while in high school
- 30% earn an Associate's Degree or other postsecondary credential while in high school

Early college high schools replace remediation with acceleration, engaging instruction, and individualized supports to prepare all students – particularly those traditionally underserved – for college and careers.

Early Colleges are based on the idea that academic rigor, combined with the opportunity to save time and money toward a postsecondary credential, are powerful motivators for students to work hard and meet intellectual challenges.

Temporary Inter-fund Loan

Kathy Friend presented the following recommendation concerning the Temporary Inter-fund Loan:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve all inter-fund loans necessary to eliminate deficits in certain funds of the corporation as of June 30, 2014.

RELATED INFORMATION: Cash deficits in funds of the corporation are not allowed at the end of a fiscal year. Deficits in property tax supported funds could occur if the distribution of property taxes from Allen County is short of expectations. Normal timing differences between revenue and expenditures in the General Fund could cause a temporary deficit. State statute allows temporary transfers between funds if certain requirements are met. The treasurer will make all necessary transfers and report the loans to the Board.

Amendment to the 2014 Capital Projects Fund Plan Kathy Friend presented the following recommendation concerning the Amendment to the 2014 Capital Projects Fund Plan:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the 2014 Capital Projects Fund Plan be amended to include the adjustments identified on the list below. The State of Indiana requires the Board to hold a hearing and pass a resolution authorizing any changes in the Capital Projects Fund Plan.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Board approved the Waiver from Implementation of Protected Taxes on April 28. This provides lower circuit breaker impact to the Capital Projects Fund in 2014. As a result, more funds are now available to support the original plan, but transfers are needed from equipment lines to the appropriate construction lines.

HEARING: As published in the local newspapers on June 12 and June 19, 2014, this meeting is the official hearing for the modification of the 2014 Capital Projects Fund Plan. This is the appropriate time for anyone interested in this resolution to address the Board.

Items noted as alternates were not originally recommended due to lack of funds. Upon approval of the amendment, the board will be asked to approve change orders to increase the scope of two contracts by adding these alternates.
