#### **OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS**

The Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools met in regular session in the Lester L. Grile Administrative Center on Monday, June 24, 2002, at 7:08 p.m. President Stephen Corona called the meeting to order with the following members in attendance:

Approval of Minutes – June 10, 2002 A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held June 10, 2002, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Thomas Fowler-Finn, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Athletic Directors New Initiatives

Fort Wayne Community Schools high school athletic directors are working together to ensure that their programs remain a strong academic support for students. Snider Athletic Director Mike Hawley presented a report outlining the athletic directors' new initiatives.

Vouchers

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the vouchers for the period ending June 12, 2002, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Donald J. Schaab, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 02-12 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Application for Common School Fund Loan Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Application for Common School Fund Loan:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of an advancement from the Indiana Common School Fund for educational technology equipment for 2002 in the amount of \$1,950,000.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Advancements from the Common School Fund provide funds for school districts to purchase educational technology. The Fort Wayne Community Schools (FWCS) will use these moneys to help fund the FWCS technology plan previously submitted to the state. Technology funds are currently insufficient to fund all the technology needs of the school corporation.

Funds are provided as a loan and are awarded to school corporations on the basis of assessed value (AV) per pupil, with low AV per pupil school corporations receiving funds before high AV per pupil corporations. FWCS therefore cannot be assured of receiving the requested advancement.

Should the application be successful, funds will be budgeted in the Debt Service Fund to repay this loan beginning in the year 2004. Interest on the loan is expected to be no more than four percent and is likely to be as low as one percent.

Common School Fund advancements differ from School Technology Advancement Account (STAA) loans, which FWCS receives on an annual basis. Unlike CSF advancements, STAA advancements are given to all applying school corporations, regardless of their assessed value per pupil ranking.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Application for Common School Fund Loan be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

School Nutrition Programs for 2002-2003 Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the School Nutrition Programs for 2002-2003:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the renewal of Fort Wayne Community Schools application with the Indiana Department of Education to continue the School Nutrition Programs for 2002-2003.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Each year school districts throughout Indiana are required to renew their membership in the School Nutrition Programs. By virtue of this application with the State of Indiana, authority is given to Fort Wayne Community Schools to participate in the Federal Child Nutrition Programs of National School Lunch/Food Distribution, School Breakfast, and Summer Food Service Program. Responsibilities of Fort Wayne Community Schools and the Indiana Department of Education, Division of School and Community Nutrition Programs are outlined in the contract which remains on file in the Food and Nutrition Services office.

This program addresses the advancement intended and outlined in Strategy VII, Student-Centered Environment, as approved by the Board of School Trustees.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the School Nutrition Programs for 2002-2003 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Prices for School Meal Programs:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the following meal prices effective for the 2002-2003 school year. These prices reflect no change in breakfast and no change in lunch prices.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** From year to year, the prices of meals served by Fort Wayne Community Schools are reviewed as part of the overall year-end evaluation of the Food and Nutrition Services Department. When warranted, adjustments in meal prices are made.

This year no increase is needed. Therefore, it is recommended that the Board approve meal prices for 2002-2003 the same as last school year. The prices remain below the state lunch averages of Elementary \$ 1.41, Middle \$ 1.50, and High \$ 1.54.

This program addresses the advancement intended and outlined in Strategy III, Ensuring a Safe and Caring Environment, and Strategy VII, Student-Centered Environment, as approved by the Board of School Trustees.

A motion was made by Donald J. Schaab, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the Prices for School Meal Programs be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grants Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grants:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the administration's acceptance of the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grant fiscal year 2003 in the amount of \$6,891,699 from the Indiana Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Title 1 is a federally funded program designed to enable schools with high concentrations of low-income students to provide opportunities for children to acquire the knowledge and skills in the state content areas and to meet the state performance standards for all children.

Eligibility for Title 1 services is based on criteria related to family income. Fort Wayne Community Schools determines target areas on the basis of numbers of students receiving free and reduced lunch. For Fort Wayne Community Schools, Title 1 services are delivered in the following ten schools; Abbett, Adams, Bloomingdale, Geyer, Fairfield, Nebraska, South Wayne, Scott, Study and Washington. Students living in the target areas who attend non-public schools are provided instruction through a resource teacher, an instructional assistant or a service provider. Eleven non-public schools also participate in the fiscal year 2003 grant. In addition, three institutions for neglected children – Park Center, Spencer House, and Crossroad – will receive services. Services to homeless Fort Wayne Community Schools students also fall within the Title 1 grant.

The grant address advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education; and Strategy VI Meaningful Relationships with Families. It is managed by Carol Kettler, Title 1 Manager.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Donald J. Schaab, that the recommendation concerning the Title 1 Basic and Neglected Grants be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Title 1 Delinquent Grant Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Title 1 Delinquent Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the administration's application for and acceptance of the Title 1 Delinquent Grant for fiscal year 2003 in the amount of \$233,731.08 from the Indiana Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Wood Youth Center and the Juvenile Residential Facility receive funds through Title 1 Delinquent Grant to support instruction, counseling, and transitional services for clients. Instruction is designed to sustain academic growth during residency and to close the achievement gap. Both credit course work and/or tutorial services are available.

The grant address advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education; Strategy VII, Student-centered Environment. It is managed by Carol Kettler, Title 1 Manager.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Title 1 Delinquent Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

## School Improvement Grant

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the School Improvement Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve application for and acceptance of the School Improvement Grant for the fiscal year 2003 in the amount of \$1,227,693 from the Indiana Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The grant, awarded by the U.S. Department of Education under Title 1 is a two-year grant. The School Improvement program provides grants to state educational agencies to implement findings from scientifically based reading and math research in school and classrooms. Schools were eligible to apply for this grant based on their school improvement status.

The purpose of this grant is to carry out the school improvement and corrective action responsibilities under the No Child Left Behind Act.

The grant addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy VI Meaningful Relationships with Families. It is managed by Carol Kettler, Title 1 Manager.

A motion was made by Bettye J. Poignard, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the School Improvement Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Arts United Grant -Memorial Park Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Arts United Grant - Memorial Park:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the Arts United of Greater Fort Wayne Community Partnership for \$5,000 for Memorial Park Middle School.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Funds from the Arts United grant will be used to bring professional jazz musicians to Memorial Park as mentors to work with students in small groups on a daily basis. Exposure to professional musicians supports the fine arts and foreign language focus at Memorial Park, helps with the K-12 alignment, and demonstrates to students the possibilities of music in the professional world. Musicians will also hold clinics with larger groups of students and hold assemblies for the Memorial Park student body. A concert with Memorial Park students was free of charge and open to the general public. This grant is for the period of May 1, 2002 through May 10, 2003.

Rita Turflinger, principal, is responsible for this non-competitive grant which addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy X, Community Linkage.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Bettye J. Poignard, that the recommendation concerning the Arts United Grant - Memorial Park be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Lupke Foundation Grant Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Lupke Foundation Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the Lupke Foundation for Memorial Park Middle School in the amount up to \$800.00.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The objective for this competitive grant request is to offer financial assistance toward the hiring of a choreographer as an artist in residence for the school's Show Choir. The choreographer would work with students to learn routines. The skill and polished performances in

dramas and musicals performed by Memorial Park's Show Choir have earned it awards nationally, and throughout the Midwest region.

This program supports advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy X, Community Linkages.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Donald J. Schaab, that the recommendation concerning the Lupke Foundation Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.
