Accident                    **RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a one year contract with Arthur J.  
Insurance                    Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc. of Itasca, Illinois, to provide blanket student accident  
and                    insurance coverage for all school sponsored activities including sports.

Athletic                    **RELATED INFORMATION:** Requests for proposals were sent to eight student insurance agencies  
Insurance,                    and responses were received from six. Arthur J. Gallagher is the world's 4<sup>th</sup> largest insurance brokerage  
RFP                    and risk management services firm with over 8,000 schools as clients.

The premium for all lines of coverage will be \$162,270 for the 2007-2008 school year. This will provide a \$25,000 maximum medical benefit with a \$0 deductible for each student. If medical bills are \$100 or under for a covered injury, benefits are paid regardless of whether there is other insurance coverage. If bills are over \$100 and there is other insurance, benefits are paid on the covered unpaid balance. If there is no other insurance coverage, this policy becomes primary.

Also included is catastrophic coverage for middle school athletes with a maximum benefit of \$5,000,000. For high school athletes, the ISHAA provides catastrophic coverage.

Optional policies will be offered at registration time to provide 24-hour coverage and/or extended dental coverage.

Information on the comparison of proposals received is on file in the Superintendent's office.

It is further recommended that twelve ounce 50% juice non-carbonated beverage be withdrawn because of the absence of an acceptable bid.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The bid is for a one-year contract, with an option to extend, to supply bottled water, sports drinks, and juice to FWCS schools and facilities. Good nutrition is Food and Nutrition Services' primary goal. More stringent specifications are now being used for beverages to be served in schools through Food and Nutrition Services. Beverages containing nutrients are preferred in making award determinations. The nutrients considered are Vitamin A, Vitamin B6, Vitamin B12, Vitamin C, calcium, niacin, thiamin, riboflavin and iron.

Invitations to Bid were mailed to six prospective bidders with six responding.

Overall, the prices of the recommended bidders reflect a twenty percent increase when compared to the last bid opened in August 2005.

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Modular Classrooms at Franke Park Elementary School:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the purchase and installation of new modular classrooms at Franke Park Elementary School from Innovative Modular Solutions for \$139,268.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The purchase and placement of modular classrooms at Franke Park Elementary School will provide additional classroom space to relieve student overcrowding for the upcoming school year.

The modern two-classroom modular building will be assembled at the rear of the main school building where it is convenient to electrical and data hookups. This location also provides easy access to the main building for elevator and restroom use. Each classroom is heated and cooled independently of each other and the main building. These modular classrooms also come complete with an up-to-date fire alarm system that is tied into the fire alarm panel in the main building. The modular classrooms meet all current State and Local fire and building codes. The units are pre-wired for technology; however, some additional hookups may be needed to meet our specific requirements. Communication lines and security measures will be installed and are expected to add an additional \$10,000 to the project.

The classrooms will be ready for occupancy by August 10, 2007

Cash  
Management  
Services

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Cash Management Services:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve Chase as the cash management services provider to FWCS for the period August 2007 to July 2009.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Under the provisions of I.C. 5-13-11, school corporations are permitted to enter into a written cash management agreement with a local bank for a two year period. Such an agreement allows bank employees to invest school corporation funds at mutually agreed upon rates. The agreement requires the bank to provide reconciliation services and all banking records as required by the State Board of Accounts. Any full service bank is eligible to submit a cash management system proposal as long as the system meets or exceeds FWCS specifications.

Requests for proposals were mailed to twelve banks with nine responding. Fifth Third Bank submitted a "no bid". The Chase proposal was competitive and along with other factors was considered the most favorable. Chase has been the cash management services provider since 2001 and there are no service issues that would prompt a change.

Italy/Greece  
Field Trip –  
Blackhawk  
Middle

Dr. Lindquist presented the following recommendation concerning the Italy/Greece Field Trip – Blackhawk Middle School:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the field trip proposal for Blackhawk Middle School students to visit Italy and Greece in June 2008.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Blackhawk Middle School students will participate in a 9-day “From Rome to Athens” tour sponsored by Education First (EF) Educational Tours. The tour will include visits to Vatican City, the Colosseum, Roman ruins at Pompeii, the Acropolis, Delphi City and Delphi Museum. This tour is closely aligned with the places studied in the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade social studies textbooks. Students will develop a greater appreciation from studying different cultures and become better learners in the classroom. The students will be accompanied by Blackhawk Middle School social studies teachers: Elise Olson, Rolunda Suttle, and Wendy Wichern. A full-time EF bi-lingual tour director will accompany the group at all times when abroad.

The opportunity to participate will be extended to 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade Blackhawk social studies students (but will not exclude older students). Interested parents will also be invited to travel with the group. Participants and their parents will be encouraged to work with the teacher-sponsors on a variety of fundraising efforts during the 2007-08 school year to offset some of the travel expenses involved. Participation in these fundraising activities will be optional. EF Educational Tours has many safety guards in place, including a clause that releases participants from travel if there is a threat or act of terrorism, or if a formal Travel Warning is issued by the U.S. Department of State.
