Approval of Minutes – July 14, 2003

A motion was made by Robert A. Armstrong, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held July 14, 2003, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Vouchers

Dr. Wendy Robinson presented the vouchers for the period ending July 16, 2003, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 03-14 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Appointments to the Allen County Historical Society Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Appointments to the Allen County Historical Society:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board appoint Dave Yarde and Bonnie Moorman to serve on the Allen County Historical Society Board.

RELATED INFORMATION: Fort Wayne Community Schools appoints two representatives to serve on the Allen County Historical Society Board. Dave Yarde, Waynedale Elementary School principal, and Bonnie Moorman, Director of Human Resources have agreed to serve three-year terms beginning July 1, 2003.

RELATED INFORMATION: The project consists of carpet replacement in the office of Anthis Career Center. This recommendation is within the project budget, which is funded from the Capital Projects Fund. Work will be completed by November 30, 2003.

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the School Technology Advancement Account Application:

School Technology Advancement Account Application

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and the receipt of an advancement from the School Technology Advancement Account in the amount of \$643,000 for the 2003-2004 school year.

RELATED INFORMATION: The School Technology Advancement Account provides funds annually for school systems to purchase computer technology for student instruction. The Fort Wayne Community Schools uses these moneys to fund learning and technology plans of schools.

The request of \$643,000 is based on a guideline provided by the state of \$500 for each 25 students. Funds are provided in the form of a loan with a very low interest rate. The last loan under this program had an interest rate of 1 percent. Funds would be budgeted in the Debt Service Fund to repay this loan beginning in 2005.

Recommendation for Student Dashboard

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Recommendation for Student Dashboard:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a hosted application service for the Student Dashboard from Edline, Chicago, IL for \$52,800.00

RELATED INFORMATION: During the fall of 2002, FWCS developed its 3-year Technology plan which calls for the development of a web-based system called the Student Dashboard that will enhance the communication between parents, students, teachers, administrators, and community stakeholders. The Dashboard allows, through a secure account sign-on, web access to student information. People using the system will have access only to those students they are responsible for. Community stakeholders will only have access to aggregate information. The student information displayed includes: grades, assessments, attendance, discipline, demographics, and assignments.

This purchase will be made with Common School Fund (CSF) monies. The allocation of funds for this project from CSF was approved by Cabinet in September of 2002.

Invitations for Proposal were sent to ten vendors with eight vendors responding. Crowe-Chizek of South Bend, IN and IBM of Indianapolis, IN did not return a proposal.

The bid is for a two-year contract with the option of annual extensions for the following two years.

The Food and Nutrition Services Department reviewed the bids.

The price per half-pint in this bid is approximately thirteen percent lower when compared to the last bid price of June 1998. During the year, the price fluctuated as allowed in the contract. The price change is permitted based on the United States Department of Agriculture's increase or decrease of the cost per hundred weight of Class I raw milk to FWCS suppliers. The bid price is less than one percent lower than the price we are currently paying for milk.

It is further recommended that twelve and sixteen ounce calcium fortified bottled water, and eight and sixteen ounce flavored bottled water, non-carbonated, be withdrawn because of the absence of an acceptable bid.

Guest Speaker

Jim Ullmer, spoke on behalf of Seven-Up Bottling Group.

RELATED INFORMATION: The bid is for a one-year contract, with an option to extend annually for each of the next three years, to supply beverages to FWCS schools and facilities. Good nutrition is Food and Nutrition Services' primary goal. More stringent specifications are being used this year for beverages to be served in schools through Food and Nutrition Services. Beverages containing nutrients are preferred in making award determinations. The nutrients considered are Vitamin A, Vitamin C, calcium, niacin, thiamin, riboflavin and iron.

Invitations to Bid were mailed to nine prospective bidders with four responding.

Overall, the prices of the recommended bidders reflect a two percent decrease when compared to the last bid opened in June 2002.

RELATED INFORMATION: The bid is for a one-year contract, with a one-year option to extend, to supply bread and buns to FWCS cooking schools and the Food Service Center.

Invitations to Bid were sent to seven prospective bidders with two responding. The lowest bidder was not chosen due to a history of service issues (delivery, availability, etc.) with FWCS.

The prices of the recommended bidder reflect an increase of ten percent for the Food Service Center and an increase of twenty-nine percent for the cooking kitchens when compared to the last bid opened in June 2001.

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the 2003-2004 Special Education Grants:

2003-2004 Special Education Grants

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of special education grants from the Indiana Department of Education for the school year 2003-2004.

RELATED INFORMATION: This noncompetitive grant is to offset the cost of special education services. The reauthorization of PL 105-17, IDEA requires that after the base payment allocations are made, additional funding is awarded to each district based on public and private school enrollment within the FWCS jurisdiction and the number of children living in poverty (National School Lunch Act participants).

The local educational agency will receive a base payment amount of \$518.54 for each child (ages 5-22). The base payment for preschool is \$485.55.

The PL 105-17 Part B, IDEA grant amount for the 2003-2004 school year is \$6,590,535. This is an increase of \$1,162,789 over the 2002-2003 school year.

The PL 105-17 Section 619 preschool grant for 2003-2004 is \$299,649. This is a decrease of \$4,972 over the 2002-2003 school year.

The funds will be used to support salaries and fringes of approximately seventy teachers, occupational therapists, physical therapists, therapy assistants, psychological services, and other related services. A CSPD (Comprehensive System of Personnel Development) grant provides \$33,478 to support training for school staff.

Under the provisions of IDEA, a grant program was established to promote innovation and program development. The amount of this PL 105-17 sub grant is \$112,798 which will be used to provide support for students with behavior issues and provide expanded educational options for expelled students.

These funds are used in support of FWCS Strategic Plan, Strategy I: Personally Appropriate Education.
