Dr. Wendy Robinson, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

National Merit and National Achievement Honorees **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize students who were named semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship competition and a finalist in the National Achievement Scholarship competition.

RELATED INFORMATION: Each year, the College Entrance Examination Board recognizes exceptional students from the more than one million students who take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test in their junior year. Students were also selected based on academic performance. Two FWCS students were named National Merit Semi-Finalists. They are among 16,000 students competing for 8,300 scholarships.

The National Achievement Scholarship Program is an academic competition for African-American students. One FWCS student was named an Outstanding Participant, and one student was a finalist. He is among 1,600 students competing for 800 scholarships.

RELATED INFORMATION: At the end of the school day on Sept. 21, 2011, North Side student Abigail Luttman fell ill, requiring immediate medical attention. On that day, Abigail passed out and students quickly ran to get health teacher Melanie DeGrandchamp, physical education teacher Ryan Hall, dance teacher Kara Wilson, school nurse Sunny Stachera and Principal Chad Hissong. Senior Tyler Byall, who went through a similar experience a year ago assisted as staff members performed CPR until paramedics arrived. Because of the quick action of students and staff, Abigail is with us today.

Purchase of Mobile Charging Caddies and Batteries **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board approve the purchase of 62 mobile charging caddies equipped with 32 Sidekick external laptop batteries, in the amount of \$171,864, for laptops being purchased for all elementary schools during the 2011-2012 school year.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Elementary Area Office plans to purchase 62 mobile charging caddies equipped with 32 Sidekick external laptop batteries to provide all-day cordless power for new laptops to support instruction in the classroom and provide access to online state testing.

In the spring of 2011, the IDOE mandated the use of computers to administer ISTEP for at least one grade level for all schools that could support online testing. As most FWCS elementary schools do not have room for or access to a computer lab, it was decided the use of laptops would provide the flexibility to use laptops within classrooms most of the time while allowing them to be pulled to a designated area to serve as a lab when needed. The Sidekick batteries from Earthwalk will allow these laptops to be used in any room without being plugged into an AC outlet. The batteries charge overnight in the charging caddies and then provide all-day cordless power for 32 laptops.

The Sidekick battery solution was selected because of its hybrid-nickel metal design that operates for up to 5 years at 80% capacity resulting in lower cost of total ownership as compared to typical laptop batteries.

2011-2012 Grant Application Title III: Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant Students

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the Title III: Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant Students for 2011-2012 in the amount of \$344,276.95 from the Office of English Language Learning and Migrant Programs of the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Title III grant is federal funding allocated by the Indiana Department of Education based on the number of limited English proficient (LEP) students in Fort Wayne Community Schools during the 2009-2010 school year. Funds from this grant will allow for the continuation of a range of supplemental services for the district's English Language Learners (ELL) program. The funds in this year's grant are specifically designated for personnel (interpreters/translators, ELL liaisons and ELL instructional coaches), instructional materials, professional development, and translation services.

The total Title III allocation of \$344,276.95 includes two subgrants:

- The basic Title III grant allocation of \$296,712.99
- An additional one-year allocation for Significant Immigrant Influx of \$47,563.96

RELATED INFORMATION: The Non-English Speaking Program grant is state funding allocated based on the number of limited English proficient (LEP) students in Fort Wayne Community Schools during the 2010-2011 school year. Funds from this grant will allow for the continuation of a range of services for the district's English Language Learners (ELL) program. The funds in this year's grant are specifically designated for personnel (interpreters/translators and ELL liaisons) and instructional materials.

This non-competitive grant written by Emily Schwartz Keirns, ELL coordinator, supports advancement intended and outlined in the FWCS District Goal I: *Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence* and Goal II: *Engage Parents and the Community*.

Refugee Children School Impact Grant 2011-2012 **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the Refugee Children School Impact Grant for 2011-2012 in the amount of \$32,945.00 from the Office of English Language Learning and Migrant Programs of the Indiana Department of Education.

RELATED INFORMATION: Funds from this grant will allow for the continuation of a range of services for the district's refugee students who participate in the English Language Learners (ELL) program. This mount allows for the board to be installed on the wall with minimal cosmetic changes, and allows for up and down movement of the board for varying teacher and student heights. The mount also allows for the Promethean board to be mounted over a chalk or dry erase board and can be easily removed for relocation to another classroom.

Empower Learning is the sole source provider for this unique integrated mount. Indiana law doesn't require public bidding for purchases made from sole source providers.

Cable Fund Access Board Originator Grant **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a Cable Fund Access Board Originator Grant from the Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) in the amount of \$10,700 for Jefferson Middle School, \$11,936.99 for Northwood Middle School, \$7917.80 for Portage Middle School and \$8074.78 for Shawnee Middle School.

RELATED INFORMATION: Funds from this non-competitive grant will be used to purchase or replace/enhance video/TV equipment for the TV/Broadcasting classes. Students daily record and edit in class and will be involved in daily student announcements and/or after-school video programs. Students learn the art of video production and get the needed experience to pursue a career in Communications. A public budget presentation was made at the September 26, 2011 Board of School Trustees meeting. All eight Board adopted funds and proposed budgets were discussed, and estimated tax rates were reviewed. The budgets, capital projects plan and the bus replacement plan were properly advertised on August 29 and September 5, 2011.

According to Indiana law, the school corporation must conduct a public hearing on the budgets, the capital projects plan and the twelve-year bus replacement plan. A hearing is scheduled for this evening's meeting of the Board of School Trustees. The intent of the hearing is to allow Board members the opportunity to receive community input. Board members will be asked to vote on these items on October 24, 2011.

This was the appropriate time for members of the public to address the Board regarding the 2012 budgets, the 2012-2014 Capital Projects Plan and the 2012-2023 School Bus Replacement Plan.

Speaker

Ms. Angie Hayden-Sutton spoke to the Board about her hope that the budget plan is accurate because she's heard for the last 12-18 months about a severe budget deficit that caused the closing of Elmhurst High School and Pleasant Center Elementary School.

There being no further speakers, the budget hearing was closed.

Health and Wellness Clinic Vendor Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Health and Wellness Clinic Vendor:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve Novia CareClinics as the vendor for the FWCS employee health and wellness clinic(s) for a two-year period effective January 2012.

RELATED INFORMATION: One component of the changes to the district's group health plan is the addition of a health and wellness clinic for all members of the Plan. Clinic services will provide employees, retirees and dependents with access to free basic health care services that will also enable better delivery of wellness initiatives meant to help lower overall health costs.

A Request for Proposal for clinic services was issued, nine responses were received and five providers were selected to be interviewed based on an initial comparison of fees and services. Novia's monthly fee in conjunction with their lab and prescription costs offers the district the lowest overall pricing. They are an Indiana based vendor with over five (5) years experience. Novia currently operates 32 clinics for a variety of employers with successful implementation in 14 public school systems.

This agreement may be extended annually beyond the second year subject to the agreement of the vendor, provided there are no additional price increase adjustments or changes to the terms of the contract.

A motion was made by John Peirce, seconded by Becky Hill, that the recommendation concerning the Health and Wellness Clinic Vendor be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Speakers

Representatives from Novia answered questions from the Board. Dr. Robinson thanked Kathy Friend, Charles Cammack and the committee for their work on this project.

Dr. Robinson reminded the audience that Friday, 10/14 is fall break and the district is closed. School will be in session on Veterans Day with activities planned. Public Affairs will have a press release with details.

Comments

Board member Stephen Corona shared that he attended the National School Boards Association's Council of Urban Boards of Education (CUBE) annual conference in New Orleans. He is suggesting that FWCS apply for CUBE recognition. Mr. Corona also noted that FWCS has an impeccable record with the budget process – any problems would be caught in an audit.

Board member Becky Hill gave kudos to the district and schools celebrating grandparent's day. She visited schools and had a delightful time.

Board member Lisa Olinger encouraged people to attend the work sessions planned for the facilities process. Visit the FWCS website to get more information.
