Magnet School Assistance Program Grant Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Magnet School Assistance Program Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the Magnet School Assistance Program Grant for one year beginning October 1, 2018, renewable up to five years, for a total amount of \$14,993,840 from the U.S. Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The grant is named SEEK: Successful Equity, Excellent Kids! The goals of the grant are:

- to increase racial and socio-economic diversity in segregated schools;
- to increase academic performance in underserved schools; and
- to create and sustain magnet schools that expand academic choices for students.

The grant initially provides for STEM/STEAM enhancements at five schools, including Irwin Elementary, Whitney Young Early Childhood, Weisser Park Elementary, Memorial Park Middle and South Side High schools. Potentially, other schools could be added.

This competitive grant was written by consultant Carol Guse from Edu Shift Inc. The program supports FWCS District Goal I: *Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence*.

Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) Grant:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) Grant for one year beginning October 1, 2018, renewable up to seven years, for a total amount of \$21,358,400 from the U.S. Department of Education.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The grant is named GEAR UP Fort Wayne. The goals of the grant are:

- to increase the academic performance and preparation for postsecondary education of participating students;
- to increase the rate of high school graduation and participation in postsecondary education of participating students; and
- to increase educational expectations for participating students and increase student and family knowledge of postsecondary education options, preparation and financing.

The grant initially serves  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$  grade cohort students attending ten low-income middle schools feeding into five high schools.

This competitive grant was written by consultant Carol Guse from Edu Shift Inc. The program supports FWCS District Goal I: *Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence*.

Resolution to Establish Education Fund and Operations Fund Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Resolution to Establish Education Fund and Operations Fund:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a resolution to establish the Education Fund and Operations Fund.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** HEA 1009 requires school corporations to establish these new funds. Beginning in 2019, the new funds replace the General Fund, Racial Balance Fund, Capital Projects Fund, Transportation Fund, Bus Replacement Fund and Museum of Art Fund. Under IC 20-42.5, the State has established the proper allocation of income and expenses in the new funds.

## RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH EDUCATION FUND AND OPERATIONS FUND OCTOBER 22, 2018

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees is the governing body of Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana;

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 requires the governing body of each school corporation to establish an education fund for the payment of expenses allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5; and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 requires the governing body of each school corporation to establish an operations fund for the payment of expenses that are not allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of School Trustees authorizes the Treasurer of Fort Wayne Community Schools to establish the education fund and the operations fund effective January 1, 2019.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the proposed Fort Wayne Community Schools 2019 appropriations (budgets), the 2019 levy, the three-year Capital Projects Plan for 2019 through 2021 and the Bus Replacement Plan for the years 2019 to 2023.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** A public budget presentation was made at the September 24, 2018 Board of School Trustees meeting. All Board adopted funds and proposed budgets were discussed and estimated tax rates were reviewed. The notice for the Capital Projects Plan and the Bus Replacement Plan were properly advertised on September 26, 2018 in the Journal Gazette. The notice directs taxpayers to the District website for details of the plans. The budget was submitted to the Indiana Gateway on September 25, 2018 for public information. A hearing to allow the public to make comments on the advertised budgets, the three-year Capital Projects Plan and the five-year Bus Replacement Plan was held on October 8, 2018. All legal requirements for advertisement and hearings have been met for all funds, the Capital Projects Plan and the Bus Replacement Plan.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a resolution that determines the calculation for transfers to the Museum of Art beginning in 2019.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** HEA 1009 eliminated the Museum of Art Fund beginning in 2019 and there will no longer be a separate levy for that fund. The amount previously allowed will become a part of the total Operations Fund. This resolution will provide the calculation needed to determine future transfers to the Museum of Art.

## RESOLUTION TO DETERMINE MUSEUM OF ART TRANSFERS OCTOBER 22, 2018

This resolution is adopted by the Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana.

WHEREAS, the Museum of Art Fund is eliminated in 2019;

WHEREAS, Fort Wayne Community School's 2019 maximum levy in the Operations Fund includes the 2018 Museum of Art levy increased by the 2019 State growth quotient; and

WHEREAS, Fort Wayne Community Schools desires to determine a consistent calculation for future annual transfers to the Museum of Art.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, transfers to the Museum of Art shall be calculated as follows:

- (1) Base = 2018 maximum levy multiplied by State growth quotient (\$144,238 \* 1.034 = \$149,142)
- (2) Add 2019 proportionate share of excise tax, commercial vehicle excise tax and financial institutions tax
- (3) Deduct 2019 proportionate share of tax cap loss

For future years, begin with the prior year base calculation multiplied by the State growth quotient (1) and make adjustments (2) and (3).

Levy Neutrality

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Public Law 199 requires that those districts who issue a pension bond to replace their retirement severance programs must make the annual bond payment a tax neutral event to taxpayers.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the tax levy of the Operations Fund will be reduced by the amount necessary. It is expected that the tax levy will be reduced as follows:

Goals for Expenditure Categories Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Goals for Expenditure Categories:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a resolution to set expenditure category goals for the 2018-19 school year. The goal is to improve upon the current percentages between the expenditures for the student instructional categories and the other expenditure categories.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Beginning with the 2007-08 school year, school districts are required to establish goals for each category of expenditures that will increase the school corporation's allocation of taxpayer resources directly to student instruction and learning, in light of the unique circumstances present in the school corporation. The Department of Education most recently reported the following percentages:

FWCS was 6.3 percentage points greater than the state average.

## RESOLUTION FOR GOALS FOR EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES OCTOBER 22, 2018

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools Board of Trustees, Allen County, has adopted a 2019 budget;

WHEREAS, P.L. 191-2006 states that beginning with the 2007-08 school year, each governing body shall establish goals for each category of expenditures that will increase the school corporation's allocation of taxpayer resources directly to student instruction and learning, in light of the unique circumstances present in the school corporation.

WHEREAS, The State Board of Education has approved the following definitions:

A. "Student Instructional Expenditures" are: (1) student academic achievement expenditures plus (2) student instructional support expenditures.

B. "Other Expenditure Categories" are: (3) overhead and operational expenditures plus (4) non-operational expenditures.

WHEREAS, Fort Wayne Community Schools believes that the educational preparation of all students be addressed in a manner that maximizes the individual student's potential.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Fort Wayne Community Schools shall review on an annual basis each of these expenditure categories and how to improve student achievement. Fort Wayne Community Schools will strive to improve upon the current levels (percentages) between the expenditures for the student instructional expenditure categories and the other expenditure categories as described in IC 20-42.5 for the next fiscal year. However, increasing the percentages in the student instructional expenditure categories and maintaining certain ratios between the "Student Instructional" and "Other Categories" may be negatively impacted by unique circumstances that the Fort Wayne Community Schools might experience such as, but not limited to:

- Changes in Federal and State grants.
- Replacement of retiring teachers (top of the scale) with new teachers who have lower salaries than the retiring teachers.
- School construction related to the district's long-range facility plan.

A motion was made by Glenna Jehl, seconded by Maria Norman, that the recommendation for the Goals for Expenditure Categories be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Approval of Revised Board Policy 6144 – Investment Income Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Approval of Revised Board Policy 6144 – Investment Income:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board adopt the revised Board Policy 6144 – Investment Income.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** A revision to this Board policy is required due to changes the State has made to school funds. The policy change is to direct investment funds to the new Operations Fund effective January 1, 2019.

Board Bylaws and Policies are available to the public on the FWCS website and also on file in the Superintendent's office. The updated versions will replace older ones.
