

# Girls basketball: Tenafly sophomore sensation surpasses 1,000 points

Rylie Theuerkauf became the seventh girls basketball player in North Jersey this season to eclipse 1,000 career points.

She is also the lone sophomore to do so this year.

The 5-foot-9 guard from Tenafly needed three points to reach the milestone entering Thursday's home game against Paramus Catholic. She was fouled on a layup with 3:20 to go in the first quarter and made the ensuing free throw to set off the celebration.

Theuerkauf is the fifth girl in school history to surpass 1,000 points and is well on her way to the top of the list. Lindsay Finnerty (Class of 2009) is the program's all-time leader with 1,519, followed by Alana Casner (2003) at 1,453, Morgan Henderson (2005) at 1,082 and Ashley Elia (2000) at 1,068.



Coach Devin Feeney named Theuerkauf the Tigers' "star performer" for the game on Twitter.

"She put up 41 points against a solid PC squad," Feeney wrote.

Theuerkauf raised her varsity total to 1,038. At the halfway point in her career, she is more than halfway to 2,000 points – a club that includes just 14 players in Bergen County history.
