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Tenafly High School Students Face their Masked Selves Head On

Students Use Art to Create Personal Connections with Themselves and Each Other

Tenafly, NJ – February 23, 2021 – Students at Tenafly High School (THS) found a new way to turn wearing masks into a positive experience; they turned them into art.
