It hardly seems possible. Another summer is almost over and it is time to begin another school year. It is always an exciting time. This year we will continue to build our staff and programs to best meet the needs of our students and community.

With the positive funding model in place we have been able to return some of the programs we had to eliminate in the budget crisis and add some wonderful supports at all of our schools. In addition to all of the initiatives we implemented last year we will build on those by adding a dean of students at each elementary school, increasing the number of content coaches, increasing the family outreach staff, expanding our extended learning opportunities, increased intervention staff, the return of Jump Start Kindergarten, smaller class sizes K – 3rd grade, increased technology at school sites, expanded professional development, uniform implementation district-wide, and in the summer of 2016 we plan to offer a summer school program at multiple sites.

Ms. Carbajal's ongoing mission for Zela Davis students is to make computer literacy an integral part of the daily curriculum, using iPads and Chromebooks for research projects and science activities. She hopes to increase the number of computers in each classroom so that teachers can assign an activity and students can work in pairs with a Chromebook or iPad to complete the task. Increasing students' familiarity with computers will also improve their typing skills and ability to use word processing programs, something they will need to master before taking the new Smarter Balanced state exams starting in the third grade.

In 2015-2016 Ms. Carbajal and her STEM Staff will expand the Project Lead the Way curriculum from three classrooms to ten classrooms, in grades two through five. The PLTW curriculum will include topics such as Energy Conversion, Stability and Motion, and Robotics and Automation!
