
WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange

What is it?? Tuition Reduction!!

Students in Western states **may** enroll in participating two-year and four-year **public** college programs at a reduced tuition level

up to 150% of the institution's regular resident tuition

In all cases, WUE tuition is considerably less than nonresident tuition



Tuition Reduction??

Resident Tuition	\$6,000

Cannot use time on WUE to establish residency


A student receiving WUE is a resident of their home state

EACH College & University sets their Qualifications to get WUE

Not every school has the same qualifications!!

OK there are 86 WUE 4-year Institutions *AND*Every one Sets their Own Criteria!

WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange

Academic Qualification:

Some colleges / universities have additional criteria such as high school GPA or ACT/SAT test scores

Each institution determines the qualifications and criteria for WUE applicants.

Some WUE schools limit the number of offers Applying EARLY may help

WUE may be based on family income / need Check with Institution if FAFSA is required



WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange

Qualification & Eligibility:

What Degree Programs are Eligible??

Some institutions have opened their entire curriculum on a space-available or first-come, first serve basis;

some schools offer only designated programs at the reduced WUE rate.

WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange

Length of Award:

Most are automatically renewable and capped at 4 years

Many schools have WUE Transfer Programs

What is WUE: Western Undergraduate Exchange.

The Western Undergraduate Exchange program offers students from western states a tuition rate that's 150 percent of the resident tuition rate at ASU — that's significantly less than regular nonresident tuition.

WUE students can choose from more than 100 bachelor's degree programs offered on ASU's Downtown Phoenix, Polytechnic and West campuses.



General eligibility requirements

- Students must be a permanent resident of Alaska, California, Colorado, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.
- Students must apply to one of the ASU WUE-eligible majors or programs.
- To maintain WUE eligibility, you must follow certain requirements including remaining enrolled in your WUEeligible major and campus. See all the requirements for maintaining WUE eligibility.

First-year student requirements

- First-year students must have a high school GPA of 3.00 or higher in competency courses (this is known as the ABOR GPA), or have an SAT of 1180 or ACT of 24 (not including the writing portion of these exams) or higher.
- First-year students are expected to live in an ASU residence hall during their first year. Please see asu.edu/housing for more information.
- WUE first-year students may be eligible for an ASU nonresident merit-based WUE scholarship. ASU will notify qualified admitted first-year students in writing of this award.

How to Apply

- Submit an application for admission including all required supporting documents to Admission Services
- Indicate an intended major or program that is one of the ASU
 WUE-eligible programs on the application
- Meet all other applicable ASU admission requirements.
- Students admitted to ASU for a WUE-eligible major who meet the requirements will be automatically added to the WUE program
 - WUE discount is not easily visible until a student registers for classes and receives tuition charges
