



SAFETY

Safety and security for our students and staff continues to be of the highest priority of our District.

Strong partnerships and collaboration with both Strongsville Police and Strongsville Fire has led to continued improvements in our District's safety plans and our emergency response readiness and training. We are working to ensure we are doing everything possible to provide safe and secure learning environments.

We are proud of the work being done with the city's safety forces to provide the safest environments for our students and staff.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS

Our District has full time School Resource Officers (SROs) at both Strongsville High School and Strongsville Middle School. In addition, we have officers who rotate among our elementary and preschool buildings. The presence of our SROs not only provide safety and security in our buildings, but these officers are also building relationships with our students. They are actively participating in activities both inside and outside of the classroom.

INVESTING IN SAFETY & SECURITY

Did you know that over the past five years our District has invested over \$1.5 million in safety and security for our school buildings?

As part of this total, we have also been awarded **over \$400,000 in safety** grants. Some of the grant money has been used to:

• Purchase BOLO sticks for classrooms in our District. The BOLO sticks provide reinforcements on doors if there is a situation that necessitates a lockdown.



- Purchase the ENVOY visitor management system for each of our buildings that provides instant background checks on all of our visitors before being granted access to our Main Office areas.
- Add window coverings on exterior windows, interior windows, and vestibule doors at our buildings. The coverings feature SCS artwork that not only adds to the exterior look of our buildings, but they also provide privacy and contribute to the safety for those inside our classrooms and schools.

Strongsville High School had 14 students qualify for the DECA National Competition, held in Atlanta, GA. This group of national qualifiers finished in the top five in the team and individual state competitions, consisting of a written test and role play presentations. DECA is the only national student organization operating in the nation's schools to attract young people to careers in marketing, finance, hospitality, management, and entrepreneurship.

Strongsville City Schools was in the **TOP 5%** of School Districts in Ohio

based on State Report Card results for 2022. This was the first year of the new State Report Card, which measures different components through a rating system of one to five stars..

Last year, our District received another **enhanced credit opinion** from Moody's Investor Service - improving from Aa3, to Aa2, to Aa2 with a positive outlook, to **Aa1 - the second highest rating that can be earned.**

This credit opinion is based on our District's strong financial position, the continued support of our community, and the **strong financial stewardship** of our District.

This rating has also supported our District's refinancing efforts for the 2012 Bond project - **saving taxpayers a total of \$14,524,342** over the remaining life of the bond.

Of the 31 school districts in Cuyahoga County, Strongsville ranks 25th in residential effective tax rate. Strongsville is in the bottom quarter of taxes paid for residential properties, for all District levies - Operating, Permanent Improvement, & Bond Retirement.

Meaning, a homeowner in Strongsville will pay less school taxes in comparison to 77% of other school districts in Cuyahoga County with the same home valuation.

Paige Applegate, a Strongsville High School senior, was a member of Team Ohio's 3v3 Women's Basketball Team, and earned a silver medal (2nd place finish) in the recent 2022 Special Olympics Summer Games. Paige, along with another Special Olympian from Brunswick became the first athletes from the Strongsville Special Olympics program to represent Team Ohio in the National Games' 40-plus year history. There were over 5,500 athletes from the U.S. and Caribbean countries participating in these games.

WHITNEY ART TEACHER STEPS UP TO SUPPORT THOSE IN NEED


