DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHY (1950 Hours)

What is Diagnostic Medical Sonography?

Chances are you or someone you know has undergone an ultrasound exam. Whether it is to get a first glimpse of a developing baby in the womb or to determine the risk of a heart attack, sonography is widely used to gain advanced insight into the inner workings of the body. In fact, ultrasound is the most utilized form of diagnostic imaging available today, after x-ray exams. Unlike X-ray, sonography is a radiation-free imaging modality.

A diagnostic medical sonographer is a highly-skilled professional who uses specialized equipment to create images of structures inside the human body that are used by physicians to make a medical diagnosis. The process involves placing a small device called a transducer against the patient's skin near the body area to be imaged. The transducer works like a loudspeaker and microphone because it can transmit sound and receive sound. The transducer sends a stream of high frequency sound waves into the body that bounce off the structures inside. The transducer detects sound waves as they bounce off the internal structures. Different structures in the body reflect these sound waves differently. A computer analyzes these sounds to make an image of the structure(s) on a monitor that can be recorded on videotape.

MNTC Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program

The MNTC Diagnostic Medical Sonography program is a 15-month program designed to prepare students for entry level employment as a sonographer. The MNTC DMS program goals are to prepare competent entry-level Abdominal-Extended and Obstetric and Gynecologic sonographers in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains. Students learn all the required competencies for the following concentrations: abdominal sonography extended and obstetrics and gynecology sonography. These learning concentrations include abdominal, obstetrical, gynecological, superficial parts, and other appropriate areas. The DMS program includes 1950 clock hours of didactic, lab, and clinical instruction. Students will complete clinical assignments in selected hospitals and clinic facilities located throughout the Oklahoma City metro area, as well as facilities located in the larger communities outside the metro area. Students are responsible for expenses associated with clinical requirements.

Who Can Apply?

The program is open to adult only post-secondary students. Students must be at least 18 years old by the first day of class. Enrollment will be limited to twelve students. Applicants will be accepted based on scores derived from cumulative GPA from pre-requisite classes, essay, test scores, interview, and optional points such as: degree completion, health certifications, and sonographer shadowing.

Schedule

Class will meet from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Clinicals start the 4th week of the program. Once clinicals begin students will generally be in class on Mondays and Tuesdays and in clinicals Wednesday through Friday. Students will complete five clinical rotations ranging from 8 to 12 weeks during the program. Clinical hours will correspond to those of the assigned clinical site.

 - An additional Human Anatomy and Physiology Lab is not required for application or admission, however it will enrich the student's learning experience.

 - The communication skills requirement may be met by a variety of courses including English, speech or composition.

____3. Meet With An Advisor by May 5, 2023:

A Career Advisor will be contacting you by email and/or phone to schedule an appointment with you. Please be sure you are regularly checking the email that you verified on the admission application. A few past applicants have reported emails from MNTC in their junk/spam folders, so please check your email filters. It is also highly recommended you set up voicemail on your phone if you have not yet done so.

4. Complete Sonography Information Session (pg. 4)

____5. Take the ACT/SAT or Next Gen Accuplacer:

The ACT/SAT (Standard Test) and Next Gen Accuplacer consist of reading, writing, and math (arithmetic and QAS) assessments. Applicants can select which score they wish to use if points are achieved for the math section. Applicants may test twice within a 6 month period at Moore Norman Technology Center Assessment Center. After obtaining your referral from an MNTC Career Advisor, schedule your assessment with instructions given during Career Advisor

appointment. Residual ACT/SAT scores are accepted.

NOTE: Scores cannot be older than 5 years from application date.

6. Submit Documentation of Required Pre-Acceptance Immunizations/Health Screenings

The following must be accomplished and documentation submitted by the application deadline. Your application will not be considered complete without this documentation.

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)

You must have documentation of:

- ♦ Two (2) MMR vaccinations OR
- ◆ One (1) MMR and one (1) rubeola vaccination and one (1) mumps vaccination OR
- ◆ One (1) MMR and one (1) positive rubeola titer and one (1) positive mumps titer OR
- ♦ Positive titers for rubella, rubeola, and mumps.

Varicella (chicken pox)

You must have documentation of receiving:

- ◆ Two (2) varicella vaccinations OR
- ♦ Positive varicella titer

Tetanus (Tdap)

You must have documentation of receiving:

• One booster vaccine within the past 9 years. Must include pertussis (whooping cough)

Hepatitis B (HepB)

You must have documentation of:

- ◆ Three (3) injections given over a 6-month period **OR**
- Signed declination from a physician or clergy

COVID-19 Vaccine

For participation in clinical programs, MNTC does not require students to be vaccinated against COVID-19. However, health care facilities participating in clinical rotations require students to be fully vaccinated prior to participating in clinical rotations at their sites. Minimum site requirements are two doses of Pfizer/Moderna or one dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccines.

7. Obtain a violent offender/sex offender/criminal offender background check from the OSBI. An application with a positive violent offender/sex offender result on the OSBI will not be considered for admission to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program.

9. Diagnostic Medical Sonography Essay (pg. 20)
10. Job Shadow Form (recommended). Job shadowing is not required. The applicant should sook enportunities for job shadowing a sonographer at a healthcare facility.

The applicant should seek opportunities for job shadowing a sonographer at a healthcare facility. Points are earned for completing a minimum of 4 hours of shadowing. Job shadow forms can be found on the program website.

Top scoring applicants will be selected for a 15-20 minute panel interview to be conducted within two weeks of the application closing date. After final applicants are chosen, remaining applicants are placed on an alternate list until the first week of class is completed. After the first week of class, the alternate list is dissolved.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Post-Acceptance Check List

Steps 1 thru 5 must be accomplished after acceptance.

If accepted, you will be notified of the date for the orientation and the deadline for payment of tuition and fees. The following are required before entering the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program. You must present documentation of the following immunizations, titers, and records after being accepted into the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program. This documentation must be submitted to the Health Administration Office *prior* to the class start date. Failure to submit/meet the immunization/screening requirements will result in withdrawal of acceptance to the MNTC Diagnostic Medical Sonography program.

____1. Mandatory: if accepted, you <u>must attend</u> the Diagnostic Medical Sonography 8-hour orientation, which will be scheduled during the last week of July. If you cannot or do not participate in the meeting, your seat will be offered to the next person on the alternate list.

___2. IMMUNIZATIONS

If accepted, you will be notified of the date for the orientation and the deadline for payment of tuition and fees. You will be required to receive two (2) TB skin tests 7-21 days apart between June 15, 2023 – July 30, 2023. You must bring documentation of the TB skin tests to the health administration office by July 30, 2023. If you do not complete and bring documentation of the TB skin tests you will be dropped from the roster, and the next person on the alternate list will be contacted and enrolled.

Tuberculosis Skin Test (PPD)

You must have one (1) of the following;

- ◆ Two (2) negative TB skin test (PPD) to be done 7-21 days apart, from notification of acceptance to one (1) month prior to start date of class **OR**
- ◆ TB Blood Test-QuantiFERON OR
- ♦ If history of a positive PPD, student must submit evidence of a positive TB test, a documented negative chest x-ray (dated no more than three months prior to beginning of program) and complete TB symptoms survey along with a 'Release for Public Contact Form' obtained from the Health Department **OR**
- ♦ If new positive PPD, you must submit evidence of a positive TB test, documented negative chest x- ray, and 'Release for Public Contact Form' from the Health Department.

Seasonal Influenza (Flu) Vaccine

- ♦ Seasonal Flu Vaccine is now REQUIRED by all clinical sites.
- ◆ A current year immunization must be presented before clinical attendance will be allowed.
- Declination exemptions are only allowed when signed by your physician or clergy.
- After acceptance, students will be told when to obtain the influenza vaccination.

3. CPR: American Heart Association Health Care Provider

Current CPR Certification in American Heart Association, Health Care Provider, is required. CPR certification must remain current for your entire Diagnostic Medical Sonography education. If you have a current AHA CPR, but it will expire before November 2024, then you MUST take a CPR class and obtain certification that will be current for the entire program. Documentation of CPR

certification must be turned in by July 30, 2023.

4. National Background Check

Background *checks are included with your paid tuition and completed through MNTC*. The search consists of Criminal Research; Sex Offender Registry Search; State Criminal Database; Previous Address Search; Professional License; Compliance – Federal Exclusions; Compliance – state Registries & Sanctions; SSN Verifications; Education data; and Employment data. More information will be given after acceptance.

____5. Drug Screen – Drug screens are included with your paid tuition and completed through MNTC.

Medical Marijuana

Students are subject to drug testing at any time after program admittance, or at any time if a reasonable suspicion arises. Students may be denied admittance into the program, denied clinical experience, or be dismissed from the program for testing positive on a drug screening. It is important to understand that even if a student has a prescription for a controlled substance or other medication that impairs physical and/or cognitive ability, the student may be removed from the clinical setting or even the program, if the safety of others is at risk.

Per federal regulations, medical marijuana remains a drug listed in Schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act. Holding a medical marijuana license will not exempt students from a required negative drug screen to enroll in the program or participate in the clinical experience.

Immunization/Health screening requirements are based on clinical institutions' required documentation to attend clinical. Additional immunization/screenings may be required by clinical institutions.

Scrubs

Students must purchase five (5) sets of program specific scrub clothes, lab jacket, and clinical shoes. The style, size, and other order information will be provided once accepted into the program. You must purchase the required style and no other types of scrubs will be permitted to be worn in the classroom or clinical setting.

Transportation

Students must provide their own transportation to class and clinical sites. Clinical sites are located at facilities across the State of Oklahoma, including Tulsa, Lawton, Duncan, Ada, and Woodward. Students will not have a choice on which clinical sites they get assigned during each rotation.

Federal Financial Aid

Federal Financial Aid is available to adult students attending a 600+ hour program at MNTC. The programs eligible to participate in Student Financial Aid (SFA) funds are approved and accredited by the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education (ODCTE). For a complete list of approved programs, contact the Financial Aid office, 405.801.5046.

Federal Financial Aid Programs Offered at MNTC

The following are the financial aid programs available, if a student qualifies:

- Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program (a state/ federally funded program): This program is administrated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The OTAG program is funded with both state and federal LEAP (Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership) funds. An applicant is considered for this program if the FAFSA form was completed by December 1.
- Federal Pell Grant (Pell) Program: This is a need-based program, and eligibility is predetermined by the Department of Education.
- Federal Supplement Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) Program: This program is
 offered to students based on need. To qualify for FSEOG, the Expected Family
 Contribution (EFC) must be zero. The funds will be awarded to the students who have
 completed their application and been accepted until funds are exhausted. The amount
 for the award year can be up to \$500.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics....

<u>Job Outlook</u>. Overall employment of medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians is projected to grow 10 percent from 2021-2031, faster than the average for all occupations.

About 10,100 openings for medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire.

As the large baby-boom population ages, the need to diagnose medical conditions—such as blood clots and heart disease—will likely increase. Imaging technology is a tool used in making these diagnoses. Moreover, diagnostic medical sonographers, cardiovascular technologists and technicians, and vascular technologists will continue to be needed in healthcare settings to provide an alternative to imaging techniques that involve radiation.

<u>Work Environment</u>. Cardiovascular technologists and technicians held about 58,100 jobs in 2021. The largest employers of cardiovascular technologists and technicians were as follows:

Hospitals; state, local, and private	76%
Offices of physicians	11%
Outpatient care centers	3%
Medical and diagnostic laboratories	1%

Diagnostic medical sonographers held about 82,300 jobs in 2021. The largest employers of diagnostic medical sonographers were as follows:

Hospitals; state, local, and private	57%
Offices of physicians	23%
Medical and diagnostic laboratories	10%
Outpatient care centers	4%

Diagnostic medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, complete most of their work at diagnostic imaging machines in dimly lit rooms. They may perform procedures at patients' bedsides. Diagnostic imaging workers may be on their feet for long periods and may need to lift or turn patients who are ill or disabled.

<u>Work Schedules</u>. Most diagnostic imaging workers work full time. Some may work evenings, weekends, or overnight because they work in facilities that are always open.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program Immunization/Screening Requirements

The following documented immunizations, titers, and records must be submitted prior to acceptance in the **Sonography program**. You <u>must</u> submit documentation to the MNTC Health Administration Office of the Health Education Building.

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)

Submit documentation of receiving 2 MMR vaccinations, **or positive titers** (blood tests that show immunity to Rubeola, Mumps, and Rubella). If any titer comes back as negative, the vaccine must be administered.

Hepatitis B Vaccination

The hepatitis B vaccination is a series of 3 injections given over a 6-month period. If you wish, you may provide a signed declination from a physician or clergy and not take the series. The area of work you are pursuing puts you at risk for coming into contact with infected blood and body fluids, so think seriously about refusing this protective vaccination. You must have had the first shot of the series or have a signed declination statement to be accepted into the program.

Declination Statement

"A written statement from a licensed physician indicating that a vaccine is medically contraindicated shall exempt a student from the hepatitis B and/or measles, mumps, and rubella vaccinations. Students may also obtain exemptions to the hepatitis B and/or measles, mumps, and rubella vaccinations by submitting a written signed statement declaring that the administration of vaccine conflicts with the student's moral or religious tenets or, if the student is a minor, the student's parent or guardian provides a written statement that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the parent's or guardian's moral or religious tenets." (https://www.ok.gov/health2documents/IMM_School_CollegeUniversityVaccinationRequirementsOklahoma.pdf)

Tuberculosis Skin Test

If accepted into the DMS Program, you must submit two (2) **NEGATIVE** TB (PPD) skin test 7-21 days apart dated **June 15, 2023**—**July 30, 2023** or **TB Blood Test-QuantiFERON**. Be sure to get your TB skin test prior to taking any other immunizations or you will be required by your physician to wait one more month after receiving a vaccine such as an MMR. For positive reactors, you must show proof of the positive reaction and then have a negative chest X-Ray.

Varicella Immunization

Submit documentation of receiving 2 vaccinations, or have a **positive titer** (blood test showing immunity to Varicella). Submitting a physician's statement that you had chicken pox will **NOT** be accepted.

TDAP (Tetanus) Vaccine

Must have documentation of receiving a booster immunization within the past **9 years. Must include pertussis (whooping cough).**

FLU Agreement

The Flu Vaccine Agreement <u>must</u> be signed. <u>If accepted</u>, you must take the seasonal flu vaccine (at their own cost) or obtain documentation from their physician if they are prevented from taking it.

Background checks

The OSBI background check must be completed and submitted to the administration office prior to May 19, 2023.

The National Background Check will be required if accepted into the program. The search consists of Criminal Research; Sex License; Compliance – Federal Exclusion; Compliance – state Registries & Sanctions; SSN Verifications; Education data; and Employment data.

Drug Testing

If accepted into the sonography program, drug testing will be required by the clinical sites and provided by MNTC. Any drug test that comes back positive will result in immediate removal from the program.

Medical Marijuana

Students are subject to drug testing at any time after program admittance, or at any time if a reasonable suspicion arises. Students may be denied admittance into the program, denied clinical experience, or be dismissed from the program for testing positive on a drug screening. It is important to understand that even if a student has a prescription for a controlled substance or other medication that impairs physical and/or cognitive ability, the student may be removed from the clinical setting or even the program, if the safety of others is at risk.

Per federal regulations, medical marijuana remains a drug listed in Schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act. Holding a medical marijuana license will not exempt students from a required negative drug screen to enroll in the program or participate in the clinical experience.

COVID-19 Vaccine

For participation in clinical programs, MNTC does not require students to be vaccinated against COVID-19. However, health care facilities participating in clinical rotations require students to be fully vaccinated prior to participating in clinical rotations at their sites. Minimum site requirements are two doses of Pfizer/Moderna or one dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccines.

OSBI Background Check Information

As a part of the MNTC Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program, you will be required to practice your skills in facilities requiring background checks. Before you can be assigned to a hospital, clinic, or other facility for your clinical or externship experience, you must have a background check that includes a sex offender check. If your criminal history is positive, the facility will then review your personal criminal history background. Each facility has the right to accept or reject any student based on information shown in the criminal history background check. MNTC cannot overrule the decision of the clinical or externship sites. Criminal offender, sex offender and violent offender reports must be obtained <u>during the current application period (No earlier than January 2023)</u>. All three boxes must be checked on your OSBI application.

An applicant, whose background check does not come back clear, will be considered on a case by case basis, for admission to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program.

If you have lived in Oklahoma less than one year, you must submit the information from the state where you previously resided as well as the OSBI report. These reports must also include information regarding sex offender history.

It is your responsibility to obtain your record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) and provide it with your documentation. The OSBI has an online search system called Criminal History Information Request Portal (CHIRP) at https://chirp.osbi.ok.gov/. This system uses credit card or electronic transfer of funds to access all three required reports costing \$20, which you can print instantly.

If you need to go in person, the OSBI office is located at 6600 North Harvey off NE 63rd, Oklahoma City, OK, one block west of Broadway Extension, Building 6 in the Broadway Executive Park. The telephone number is 405.879.2689, extension 0. The cost is \$19.00; OSBI accepts cash or credit card. They will not accept checks. You will be required to bring your social security number, date of birth, full name and payment with you to be able to complete the process. A sample form is located on the next page. If you are a MNTC Hire student, the DHS background check with this program will meet the requirements for this program. See HIRE Coordinator with any questions. If you have any questions regarding the program application process, contact a career advisor at 405.801.5000.

If you have ever been convicted of a felony, then you may not be able to attend clinical education. In addition, you may not be allowed to sit for the ARDMS national certification registry exams. This means that you can never become registered and thus will not be able to practice sonography. If you receive a positive result you should complete the pre-application review process through the ARDMS. You can contact the ARDMS at http://www.ardms.org
