Confidentiality and Public Information

- Generally, security documents, records, and information reviewed by the committee or discussion of the documents and records should **remain confidential**.
- Texas Education Code section 37.2071(i) makes any document or information collected, developed, or produced during the review and verification of a multi-hazard EOP not subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act (PIA).
- Texas Education Code section 37.108(c-1) provides that any document or information collected, developed, or produced during a safety and security audit conducted under the provision requiring regular safety and security audits of a district's facilities is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act (PIA).
- Access to documents and records by committee members are to be confidentiality protected and not shared with the public. **Any security documents, records, or information shall only be released by the District with permission from the Texas Attorney General.**

Country Place ES

We completed 6 lockdown drills throughout the year. During these drills, we had support staff in the halls to guide students on where to go, if their classrooms were locked. The teachers talked to students about what to do and where to go in case their door was locked before the drills occurred. We did this to help students be safer in case there is ever a case in which this is necessary. We want this to become as rote and common as fire drills, so students will know exactly what to do and not panic.

District requirement is 2 per year (1 each semester). This project applied to all staff and students.

Davis ES

Security Officer Josh Flores met with five boys from the fourth grade and five boys from the fifth grade every Wednesday to discuss issues going on with them in their personal life. They discussed issues concerning school and home safety.

Their SOS project involved 9 total students, and the Security Specialist.

Each stakeholder on campus is intrinsically motivated to be vigilant about following safety protocols to keep the students, their families, and the staff at Las Colinas a safe haven! The stakeholders at large were not aware about the trophy. Our goal was to intrinsically motivate each stakeholder to make Las Colinas a safe haven for all. Each stakeholder took the responsibility of the three main elements that would positively contribute to the safety of our campus:

1. Each staff wearing his/her ID badge
2. Spot check on all main entry/exit doors being locked at all times
3. Vigilant about entry protocol at the main door.

Las Colinas ES cont'd.

Improvements that occurred:

1. Quick reporting of strangers on campus exterior grounds without a visitor's pass or District ID. As a result of the above, quick action was taken.
2. Main entry/exit doors closed at all times after some occurrences of the doors not shutting fully (partially due to weather changes causing expansion/contraction of door frames)
3. Each stakeholder on campus wearing his/her ID badge compared to being asked to wear ID badges on:) Students taking the initiative of checking classroom doors and reminding teachers about checking main entry/exit doors

Individuals and groups involved were the Students, campus & District Staff, Resource officers, Parents, & Visitors at and to Las Colinas.
