- 3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS:

4. PRINCIPALS' REPORT:

- **4.A. Trousdale County Elementary School** Ms. Badru stated that the school presently has 117 students in Kindergarten and 130 students in the first grade. She said that the school is experiencing approximately 36 absences per day. She stated that the school has been busy practicing safety drills such as intruder lockdown and fire drills. Ms. Badru said that she is placing emphasis on student discipline this year by holding students accountable. She said that the two days a week afterschool detention has been helpful but that she is also implementing restorative practices in the school's overall discipline plan. Ms. Badru concluded by outlining the school's new morning drop off procedures for Kindergarten and Head Start students in which these students are to be school at the same time as all other grades.
- **4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School** Mr. McCall stated that the school's present enrollment is up to 344 students with 108 students in the 8th grade. He said that the school has been practicing all of its emergency drills while putting the school in difficult situations such as classroom transitions during those drills. He noted how the support of the SRO, canine searches, and installation of new vaping sensors are aiding in school safety. Mr. McCall stated that the school was beginning to conduct classroom walkthrough observations which helps improve instruction through instructional feedback and coaching for teachers. Mr. McCall stated that the teachers and students that recently attended the new Move2Stand bullying prevention program are really excited in getting it implemented in the schools. Mr. McCall concluded by describing how he is utilizing the new wellness and nutrition teacher in related arts time.
- **4.C. Trousdale County High School** Dr. Kuhn stated that the high school presently has 404 students enrolled with attendance going better than last year. He stated that he has an "attendance watch list" of students that were chronically absent last year on which the school is focusing its attention this year. He stated that the high school has also been practicing its emergency drills including already conducting a random drug dog search this year. He stated that the two most prevalent discipline issues include cell phones and vaping. He too is excited about the potential to improve school climate through the new Move2Stand bullying prevention program. Dr. Kuhn concluded by discussing how the school had begun classroom

walkthroughs and how he was presently using the process to ensure norming of observation reporting.

4.D. Student School Board Representative - Elizabeth Harris, Student Representative, reported a good start to the school year. She stated there were some scheduling concerns in the first week but the issues have been worked out. She stated that the vaping sensors and Dr. Kuhn's metal detector has been resourceful in reducing vaping in school. Elizabeth stated there is a lot of optimism for the new Move2Stand bullying prevention program and that there is a lot of athletic support in the school.

- 5.B. Academic and Goal Updates Dr. Satterfield reminded parents that the PowerSchool Parent Portal logins were sent home with students on August 12 and that the platform will become operational on Aug. 15. He informed the Board that 2021-22 value-added reports are now available with all three schools achieving a Level 5 (the highest score). He stated that this is instrumental in helping students overcome the negative effects of the COVID pandemic. Dr. Satterfield stated that 2022 TCAP results show Trousdale County students outperforming Tennessee students in all reporting categories and leading surrounding counties in 4th grade math (36.6%), 7th grade reading (49.1%), 7th grade math (54.7%), English 1 (52.3%), Biology (52.4%), and US History (53.5%). Dr. Satterfield stated that the school is addressing school safety through multiple layers such as enforcing student discipline, securing exterior doors, addressing visitors to school, adding additional security cameras, use of vaping sensors, stationing SROs at each school, conducting emergency drills, and canine searches, athletic drug screenings, and enforcing student discipline policies that are already in place. Dr. Satterfield concluded by stating that the school district is taking a renewed interest in student attendance for 2022-2a3, stating that the schools will be tying an attendance requirement to end of the year exemptions as well as extracurricular participation.
- **5.C.** Project Updates Dr. Satterfield informed the Board that he is presently working on having the high school parking lot resurfaced but that two weeks of the fair has held the project up. He stated that the elementary school parking lot would also be repainted (striped) as part of the high school project. He stated that there is work to be done with water drainage on the Pre-K playground and in Mr. McCall's office. He stated that he has someone to address the issues and is presently on a waiting list.

6. NEW BUSINESS:

6.A. Hartsville Rotary Club - Chris Gregory, President

Mr. Gregory highlighted the support projects that the Rotary Club does annually such as the 3rd grade dictionary project, the Imagination Library, Character Counts, and their largest Christmas for Kids event. Mr. Gregory also thanked the Board for allowing students and families to participate in its annual food drive that is held annually in November.

Dr. Satterfield presented Outstanding Service Awards to retiring school board members, Ms. Regina Waller (16 years) and Mr. Anthony Crook (12 years) for their distinguished years of service to the students of Trousdale County.
