3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS:

4. PRINCIPALS' REPORT:

4.A. Trousedale County Elementary School - Ms. Badru updated the Board about the status of TCAP testing noting that there is a lot of student illnesses which presents challenges with makeup testing and meeting the minimum 95% participation rate. Ms. Badru announced plans for the upcoming PreK-Kindergarten registration to be held May 17-18 and the dissemination of student report cards on May 26. She concluded by informing the Board about ongoing safety drills that the school practices on a regular basis.

4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School - Absent

4.C. Trousedale County High School – Dr. Kuhn informed the Board about the fundraising activities that have been held at the school to raise funds for Ms. Vickie Thaxton, the school's

janitor who is presently going through cancer treatments. He stated that the school has presently raised \$6,200. Dr. Kuhn updated the Board about End of Course assessment, stating that everything has gone well; however, the assessment platform has experienced a few issues. He stated that student attendance has been excellent. Dr. Kuhn concluded by updating the Board about the school's safety plans and drills that it routinely conducts.

5.A. Employment Notifications

5.B. Academic and Goal Updates – Dr. Satterfield updated the Board about the present student enrollment noting that the district currently has 15 less students from the same time last year and how enrollment affects planning for the subsequent 2023-24 school year. He updated the Board about the state TCAP testing window noting that the elementary school only has a two-week window as compared to the middle and high schools that have three weeks; however, the elementary school does not test social studies. Dr. Satterfield explained implications of how the universal reading screener may provide an additional gateway for 3rd grade promotion. He informed the Board that the 2nd grade had been selected to conduct a new 2nd grade field test for both reading and math for which it will conduct after TCAP on May 15 and 16. He updated the Board about career exploration activities that the schools are planning that include Career Pathway Exploration Day, Rising 9th grade Registration, college visits to TCAT, Cumberland University, and Tennessee Tech. He concluded by informing the Board about the free sports physicals that will be held on Saturday, May 6.

5.C. Project Updates - Dr. Satterfield updated the Board about on-going and planning improvements to the physical plant that include the baseball/softball fencing, new middle school library furniture, installation of new classroom door locks for 4th and 5th grade classrooms, PA system replacement at the football stadium and TCHS gymnasium, and band room carpet replacement. He updated the Board about progress on the new greenhouse noting that he will be able to begin purchasing after the budget amendment is passed by the county commission on Monday. He concluded by discussing on-going work with the development of emergency floor plans for all three schools.

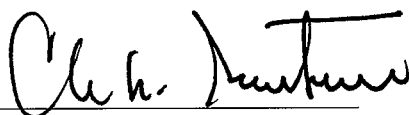

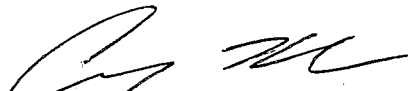

BYLAWS of Trousdale County PTO

ARTICLE I – NAME, DESCRIPTION & PURPOSE

Section 1: NAME – The name of the organization shall be Trousdale County PTO (TC PTO). The PTO is located at 103 Lock Six Rd. Hartsville, TN 37074.

Section 2: DESCRIPTION – The TC PTO is a non-profit organization that exists for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes, including the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Section 3: GOALS – The goal of the PTO is to enhance and support the educational experience at our schools (TCES, JSMS, TCHS), to develop a closer connection between school and home by encouraging parental involvement, and to improve the environment at our schools through volunteer and financial support.

Section 4: POLICY – The TC PTO agrees to abide by any policies and procedures determined by the Board of Education.

ARTICLE II – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: Membership shall be automatically granted to all parents and guardians of our schools students, plus all staff at our schools. There are no membership dues. Members have voting privileges, one vote per household. Membership can be terminated if board agrees member's contributions do not align with the goals of the PTO.

ARTICLE III – OFFICERS

Section 1: EXECUTIVE BOARD– The Executive Board shall consist of the following officers: President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Communications Secretary, and Treasurer. Officer positions can be shared. The School Principals, or his/her designee, are voting members of the Executive Board.

Section 2: TERM OF OFFICE – The term of office for all officers is one year, beginning immediately upon election that is held each August, and ending upon officer election the following school year.

Section 3: QUALIFICATIONS – Any PTO member in good standing may become an officer of the PTO. A school representative cannot act as treasurer or bookkeeper for the TC PTO or be a signatory on the checks for a school support organization. A majority of the voting members of TC

PTO should not be composed of school representatives. TC PTO must include one representative from each school faculty as a sponsor.

Section 4: DUTIES –

Executive Board – Develop the PTO's annual budget, establish and oversee committees to conduct the work of the PTO, establish fundraising programs, approve by majority vote of the Board unbudgeted expenditures of no more than \$50.00.

President – Preside at General PTO meetings and Executive Board meetings, serve as the official representative of the PTO, and retain all official records of the PTO.

Vice President – Oversee the committee system of the PTO, assist the President and chair meetings in the absence of the President.

Recording Secretary – Record and distribute minutes of all Executive Board meetings and all General PTO meetings, prepare agendas for official PTO meetings, hold historical records for the PTO.

Communications Secretary – Manage communications and marketing for the PTO including, but not limited to PTO newsletters, email broadcasts, website, bulletin boards, etc.

Treasurer – Serve as custodian of the PTO's finances, collect revenue, pay authorized expenses, report financial activity every month, prepare year-end financial report, facilitate an annual audit, and hold all financial records.

Section 5: BOARD MEETINGS – The Executive Board shall meet monthly during the school year, or at the discretion of the President.

Section 6: REMOVAL – An officer can be removed from office for failure to fulfill his/her duties, after reasonable notice, by a majority vote of the Executive Board.

Section 7: VACANCY – If a vacancy occurs on the Executive Board, the President shall appoint a PTO member to fill the vacancy, for the remainder of the officer's term.

ARTICLE IV – MEETINGS

Section 1: GENERAL PTO MEETINGS – General PTO meetings shall be held to conduct the business of the PTO. Meetings shall be held monthly during the school year or at the discretion of the Executive Board.

Section 2: VOTING – Each member in attendance at a PTO meeting is eligible to vote, one vote per household. Absentee or proxy votes are not allowed.

Section 3 – QUORUM – Five (5) members of the PTO present and voting constitute quorum for the purpose of voting.

ARTICLE V – FINANCIAL POLICIES

Section 1: FISCAL YEAR - The fiscal year of the PTO begins July 1 and ends June 30 of the following year.

Section 2: BANKING - All funds shall be kept in a checking account (Wilson Bank) in the name of Trousdale County PTO, requiring two signatures of the Executive Board and held at a local financial institution. There shall be no use of debit or credit cards.

Section 3: REPORTING - All financial activity shall be recorded in a manual or computer-based accounting system. The Treasurer shall reconcile the account(s) monthly and report all financial activity monthly. The PTO shall arrange an independent review of its financial records each year and the financials shall be open to public inspection. The PTO shall provide access to all books, records, and bank account information to the Board of Education, school Principal, auditors, or the comptroller of the treasury upon request.

Section 3: ENDING BALANCE - The organization shall leave a minimum of \$500.00 in the treasury at the end of each fiscal year.

Section 4: CONTRACTS - Contract signing authority is limited to the President or the President's designee.

ARTICLE VI – FUNDRAISING

The TC PTO shall obtain approval from the Board of Education before undertaking any fundraising activity and shall submit the formal request form for consideration. All fundraising activity should be consistent with the goals of the TC PTO.

ARTICLE VII – BYLAW AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the bylaws may be proposed by any PTO member. Amendments presented at a PTO meeting shall be considered for voting at a subsequent meeting. 2/3 approval of all members present and voting is required to adopt an amendment to the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII - DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the PTO, any funds remaining shall be donated to our schools.

ARTICLE IX - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The authority for this organization shall be "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised."
