3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS:

4. PRINCIPALS' REPORT:

- **4.A. Trousdale County Elementary School** Ms. Badru stated the school has completed the 2nd grade TCAP and will begin ELA and Math TCAP for grades 3-5 next week. She noted that student attendance has been good and that the school intends to reward students' efforts after TCAP is completed on April 29. Ms. Badru informed the Board that the TDOE will be visiting the school's high-dose math tutoring program tomorrow. Ms. Badru noted future events forthcoming such as the Book Fair, 5th grade transition day, and Pre-K/Kindergarten Round-Up which will be held on May 17 and 18.
- **4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School** Mr. McCall updated the Board about the logistics of administrating the TCAP assessments. He stated that student attendance is good and that the students seem to be taking their assessments seriously and the school will conclude TCAP assessments on April 29 with a few days reserved for make-ups.

He stated that the school is presently making plans for 5th grade transition day and the middle school career fair sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. Mr. McCall concluded by updating the Board on end of the year athletic and intramural events.

4.C. Trousdale County High School – Ms. Dickerson noted that all high school TCAP assessments are online and that there has been some glitches and delays with online testing. She also addressed the challenges with special testing accommodations such a read alouds. She noted that the school has experienced 100% student attendance with good student behavior. Ms. Dickerson praised the support of Jennifer Cothron, district testing coordinator, and Andy Overman, technology coordinator, in helping the school work out the glitches associated with online testing. Ms. Dickerson concluded by stating that the high school TCAP testing would continue until May 5.

5.B. Academic and Goal Updates - Dr. Satterfield informed the Board that the district will delay the dissemination of report cards if necessary in order to include TCAP results as a portion of students' 2nd semester grades as established by state law and Board policy. Presently, TCAP weighs 25% of all students' second semester grade in content areas that have a corresponding TCAP assessment. The alternate report card day is Thursday, May 26, and this date has been shared with staff and parents for many months. Dr. Satterfield reviewed a letter notice that will be sent to all parents of rising 3rd graders in the upcoming 2022-23 school year. The new state Literary Law requires students that do not pass the 2023 TCAP to attend Summer Learning Camp with 90% attendance, or to enroll in afterschool TN ALL Corps tutoring during their 4th grade year, or to repeat the 3rd grade. Dr. Satterfield stated that this is a very strict law that parents need to understand, and this is why Ms. Badru will be including an information letter with all 2nd graders' report cards in May. Dr. Satterfield highlighted the good work everyone has done towards addressing student career counseling. He noted the free Pre-ACT opportunities, 8th and 10th grade Parents' Night, 8th and 9th grade Career Exploration Day, 8th grade Registration Night, TCAT and Vol State campus visits, and the Chamber of Commerce's middle school career fair. Dr. Satterfield concluded by outlining information about the upcoming Summer Learning Camp for rising 1-8 graders that begins on May 31.

5.C. Project Updates - Dr. Satterfield updated the Board about the new vaping sensors that have been installed at the high school and how it has reduced vaping at the school. He thanked the Board for approving the purchase of vaping sensors for the middle school that will be available in the fall. He stated that he is continuing to work with Romach Construction to develop a plan to address the courtyard drainage issue. He stated that the baseball/softball stadium is to be completed next week and passed around pictures of the new food trailer that will be used to replace the concession stand at the baseball/softball field as a solution to

flooding. He concluded that the Board would address the elementary roof issue in new business.

6. NEW BUSINESS:

6.A. Elementary School Roof – Dr. Satterfield updated the Board concerning ongoing issues pertaining to the elementary roof warranty brought on from the intended Brazos Urethane resurfacing project. Dr. Satterfield and Mr. Kerr has been in conversation with the Mayor and the Chairman of the Commission who recommend that the school district pursue legal actions against the original manufacture of the 22 year old spray foam roof. From conversations with the school board attorney and the school board's architect, both recommend that the school board hire a roofing expert, Richard Rinks, with Rinks & Associates to provide a second opinion analysis of TNRMT structural engineer's report in order to advise the Board concerning possible future legal action.




