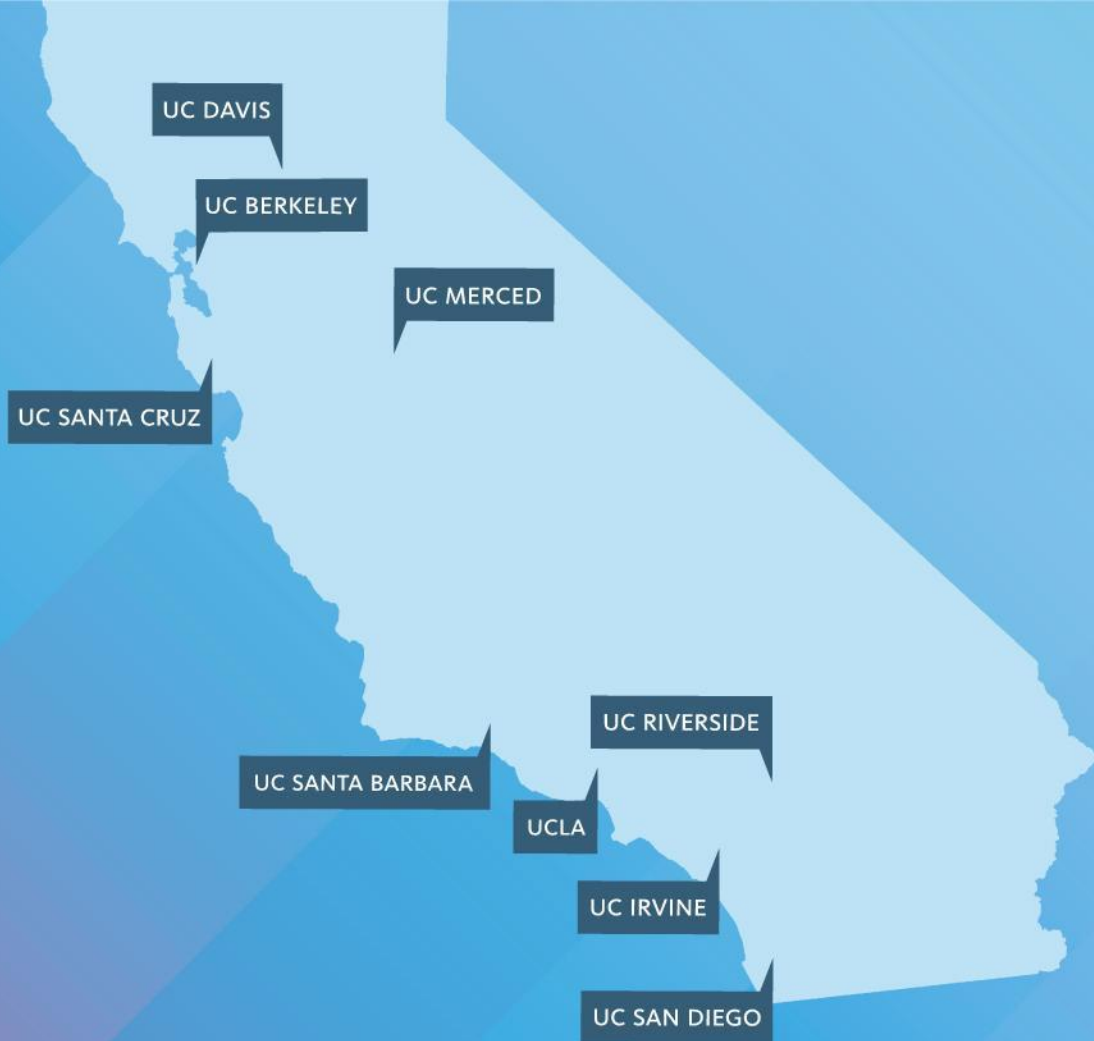

First-Year/Freshman Admission

Who is a first-year/freshman applicant?

- Current HS student or recent HS graduate
 - May take college courses while in high school
 - Allowed to take college classes the summer after high school graduation

Freshman Eligibility - GPA Requirement

Minimum GPA

- CA residents: **3.0**
- Nonresidents: **3.4**
- Calculated from A-G courses in 10th & 11th grades (includes summer)

COVID-19 Semesters

- Pass/CR grades OK in A-G courses completed in Spring 2020- Summer 2021
- Pass/CR grades **not** factored into GPA

Transfer Eligibility and Selection

Requirements

- 7 course pattern
 - UC-E and UC-M
- 60 semester/90 quarter UC-transferable units
- 2.4 GPA (CA)/2.8 GPA (nonresidents)

Selection

- Major preparation
- Competitive GPA
- IGETC (not required for UC admission)



Transfer Admission Planner (TAP) Overview

Who is it for?

- California Community College students
- Those planning to apply for Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

When should students create a TAP account?

- The sooner the better!



Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

- Guarantee to a *specific major* at 1 of 6 campuses offering TAG agreements
- Filing period - **September 1-30**
 - Must also complete a UC application in November!
- Hundreds of major options available!



The Value of a UC Education

UC Alumni:

- from five of UC campuses raised over \$47 billion in venture capital funding and created about 2270 companies
- who are first-generation surpass their parents income within 7 years of graduation
- are one in three CA state-elected officials
- 59% of CA undergraduates pay no tuition
- 71% of CA undergraduates receive grants & scholarships
- 46% of CA undergraduates graduate without student loan debt



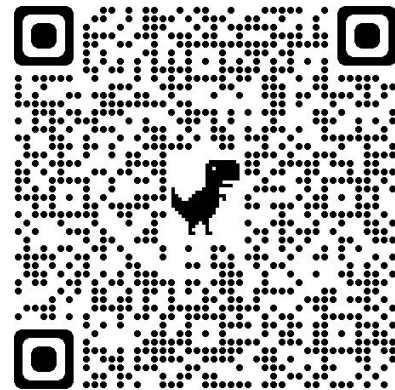

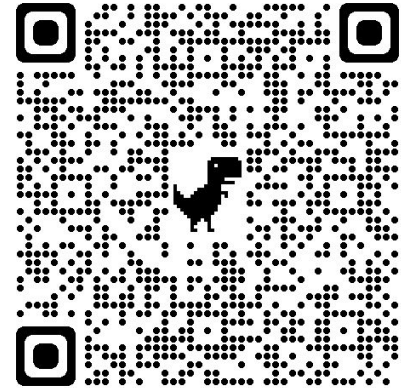

Complete College prep courses with final grades of (C-) or higher

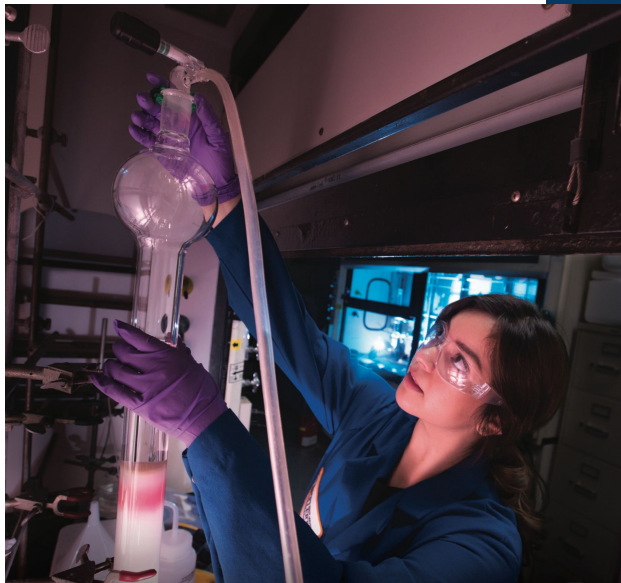
The CSU will consider course grades of (credit or pass) as fulfilling the A-G requirements for those courses completed during Winter, Spring, Summer, or Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring, or Summer 2021 terms

All other coursework must be graded and a grade of (C-) or better must be earned for the courses to satisfy A-G requirements.

Grades of (credit/pass) or (no credit/no pass) will not be included in the calculation of high school GPA.

Freshman Admission Requirements

A-G Requirements



The CSU strongly recommends that ALL students enroll in a yearlong senior-year English course and a mathematics/quantitative reasoning course.

These courses could include Expository Reading and Writing (ERWC), Math Reasoning with Connections (MRWC), weighted Honors, International Baccalaureate (IB), and Advanced Placement (AP) and other advance courses.

Freshman Admission Requirements

SAT/ACT Test Scores

The California State University (CSU) will temporarily suspend the use of ACT/SAT examinations in determining admission eligibility for all CSU campuses for *Fall 2022.

First-time freshmen must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- be a high school graduate or equivalent
- complete the 15-unit comprehensive “a-g” pattern of college preparatory course
- and earn a qualifying “a-g” grade point average (GPA).

Freshman Admission Requirements

Qualifying GPA

California residents and graduates of California high schools will be eligible for admission by earning a 2.50 or greater “a-g” GPA.

Any California high school graduate or resident of California earning a GPA between 2.00 and 2.49 may be evaluated for admission based upon supplemental factors. Each CSU campus will determine the supplemental factors used with GPA to determine eligibility in these cases and communicate these criteria publicly for prospective students.



Freshman Admission Requirements

Meet or exceed the CSU minimum Eligibility Index (EI)

Grade Point Average:

For provisional admission we will calculate the high school GPA of the A-G courses using the 10th and 11th grades.

Note that courses completed with (credit/pass) grades in the Winter, Spring, Summer, or Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring, or Summer 2021 terms will not be included in the calculation of the GPA.



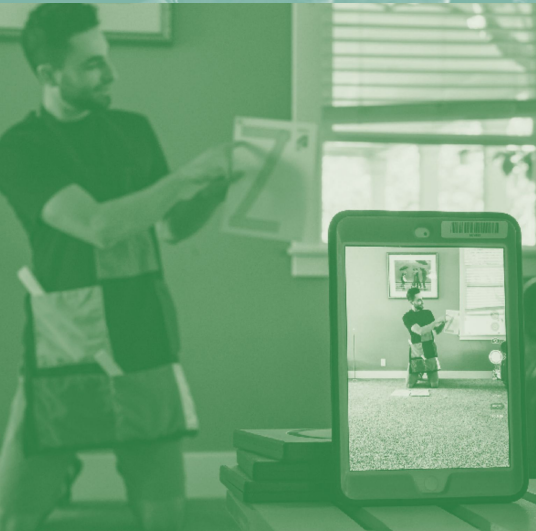

Impaction

When a campus receives a greater number of applications from eligible students but not enough spaces to offer admission for all of those eligible students. Therefore, meeting the minimum requirements may not be enough to gain admission.

Admission to a CSU will be determined based on you meeting the CSU admission requirements and any additional campus requirements at the time of your application.

Impaction does not mean impossible!



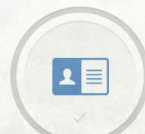

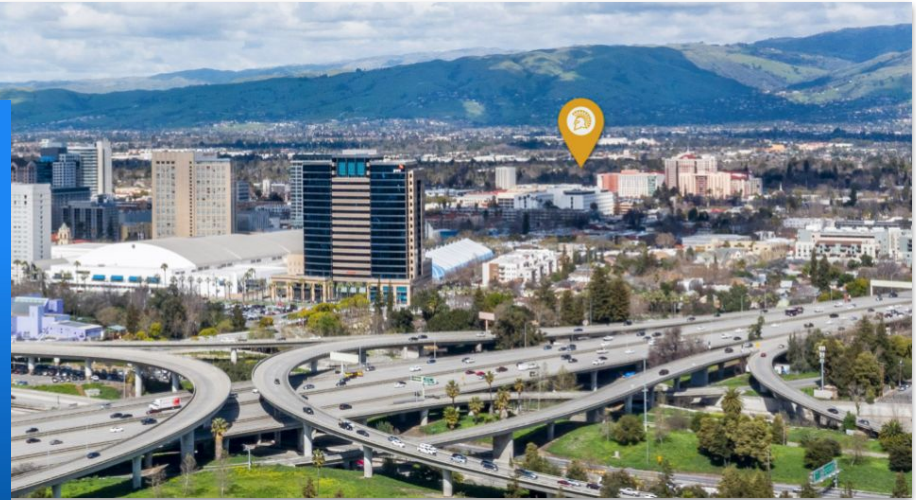

Freshman Admission Requirements

Freshmen applicants who meet the CSU minimum eligibility requirements will be ranked in each major and offered admission if they meet the majors Minimum Impaction Point Index.

San José State gives preference in the competitive admission process to “**local**” applicants. For freshmen, you are considered a “**local**” applicants if you will graduate from a high school in **Santa Clara County**. Local Preference for Santa Clara County high school graduates = .25

Additional consideration will be given to applicants who qualify for the **Cal State Apply fee waiver**; are the first to attend college in their family (**first-generation**); or are a **U.S. veteran**.

Transfer: CSU

- ▶ Regular Transfer
 - ▶ Countless number of majors
 - ▶ Work closely with college counselor to ensure requirements are met
- ▶ Examples:

Transfer: CSU (ADT)

- ▶ Associate Degree to Transfer (ADT)
 - ▶ 60 units + 60 units
 - ▶ GPA Boost for admission purposes
 - ▶ Commitment that you can finish Bachelor's Degree in two years after Community College
 - ▶ Limited number of programs

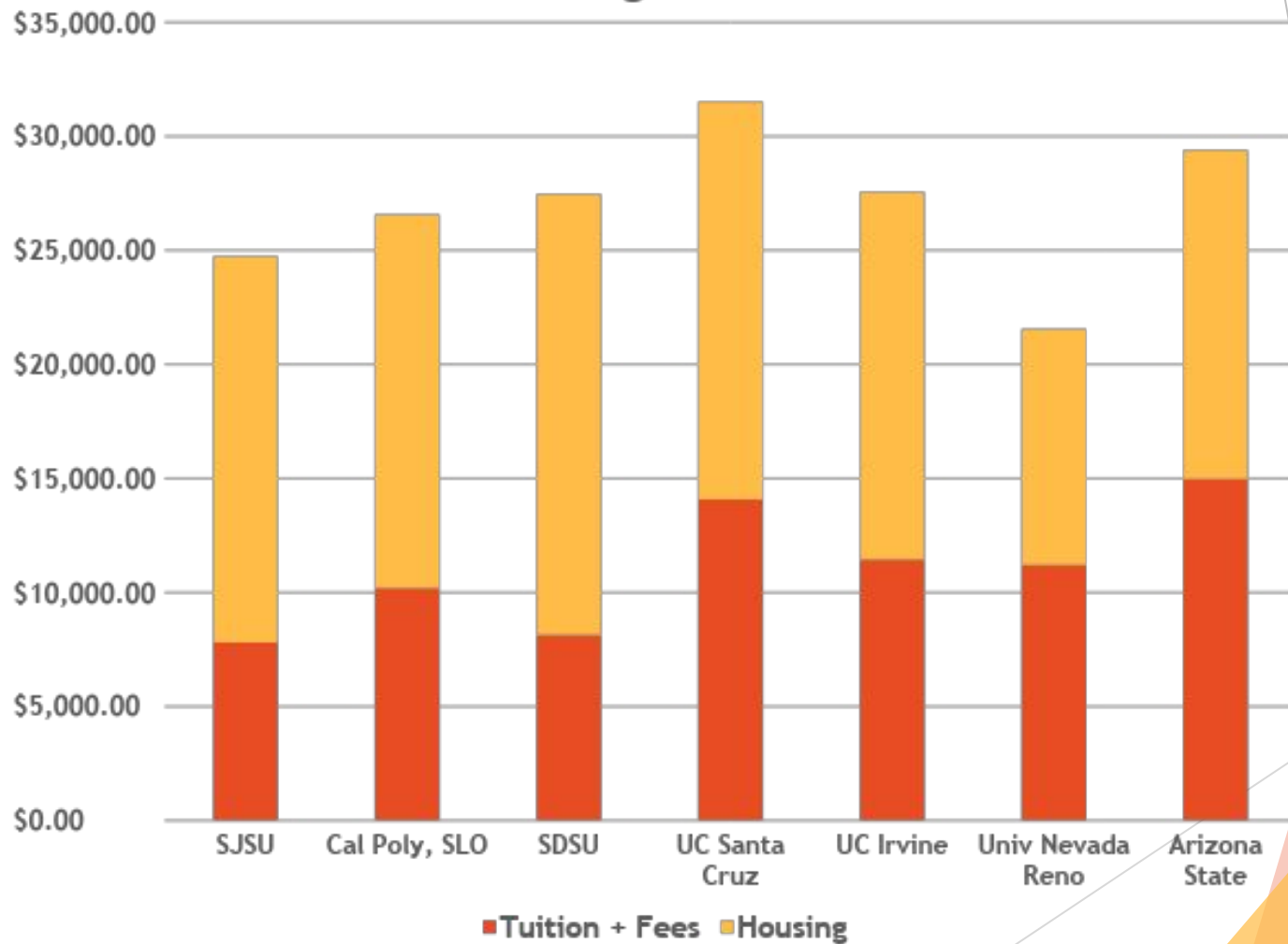

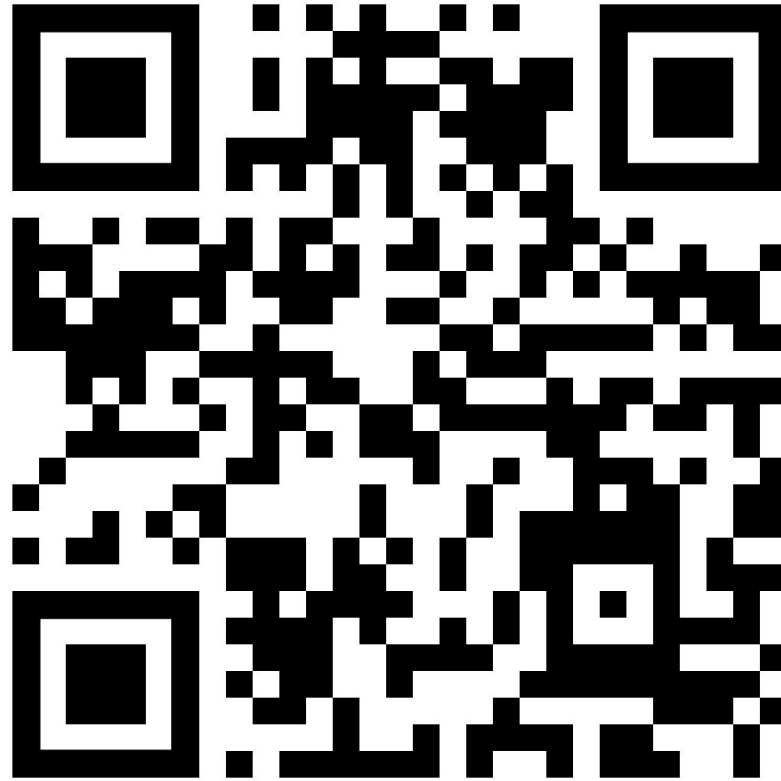
