



SUPPORTING DATA:

This contract has not changed since the Board approved it in May of 2019. This is simply the opportunity to revisit and renew what has already been approved. This would be the second renewal of four before going out and issuing a new Request for Proposal for Fleet Fuel Cards, if the board so chooses.

The District issued Request for Proposal (RFP) 20-0606-24 for a multi-year contract to provide the district with a Fleet Fuel Card System. The proposal was legally advertised in the Daily Courier on May 16, 2019, and again on May 23, 2019. In addition, the District also advertised the bid on the AZ Purchasing website and the District's website.

Two (2) sealed proposals were received by HUSD, no later than 2:00 p.m. on June 6, 2019 at the HUSD Business Office. The offerors were Diesel Direct West, Inc. and Bennett Oil.

An evaluation committee convened to evaluate the proposals. The following evaluation criteria were listed in the solicitation and cost was not the deciding factor:

- A. **Responsiveness** - Responsiveness of the proposal in clearly stating and understanding the scope of work, and in meeting the requirements of the RFP.
- B. **Cost** - Lowest Price of Fuel: Namely the bidder/vendors cost of fuel at the most economical point of purchase based on the OPIS (Oil Price Information Service) weekly index average plus \$ (bid) per gallon (which includes all applicable administrative, transportation and regulatory fees, plus profit).
- C. **Logistics** – Proximity of fuel location(s) capable of fueling multiple large vehicles at one time as determined by the Transportation Department to be the most cost effective for the District.

It was determined by the evaluation committee that due to the location and accessibility of the fueling stations as well as the availability of multiple pumps, it is most advantageous and in the best interest of the district to award the multi-term contract for a fleet fuel card system to Diesel Direct West, Inc.



Evaluation of the Food Service Program

Only 278 Yavapai County food establishments were awarded Yavapai County's Golden Plate Award for 2020.

To be eligible, an owner or operator needs to meet three criteria:

- 1) Operate through-out the entire calendar year without a cited critical food handling violation.
- 2) Have an approved and implemented food safety plan.
- 3) Have a person-in-charge with an accepted and current manager-level food safety certificate through-out the year.

Review of all food and beverages sold

- **Nutritional analysis** of menus is completed on a weekly basis. All a la carte foods and beverages are analyzed to ensure they meet the Smart Snack Standard.
- Even with the **expected increase in per meal cost**, the Food and Nutrition department is looking forward to implementing continued changes brought to the program by the signing of the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 and the required implementation of the changes for school year 2021-22.
- **Menu selections** continue to include lean meats, whole grains, fresh fruits and vegetables daily, while providing the students multiple healthy entrée choices.

Assessment of school environment regarding wellness issues

School Health Advisory Council (SHAC), sometimes called a “School Health Team” or “Wellness Council,” is a group of individuals who represent both the school and the community. This group meets 3 to 4 times per school year to provide advice on aspects of the school health policies and programs. SHACs can advise a local education agency (district) or an individual school site (elementary, middle, or high school).

- **Wellness Policy Evaluation** is given every other year to each school to complete. This tool gives each school principal the opportunity to read the wellness policy while answering questions about their schools adherence to the policy. Findings are posted on our department website under Student Wellness.

Activities and programs conducted to promote nutrition and physical activity

- **Free meals for all students.** The USDA extended waivers that enabled us to serve free meals to all students
- **Meal Pack Pick Up.** Child Nutrition provided meals to children who are too young to attend school, attend school 100% on-line, or attend a school that does not provide free meals.

- **Meal Delivery Program.** Thanks to the tireless assistance of our Transportation Department, Child Nutrition was able to provide meals via home delivery, to children who are too young to attend school, attend school 100% on-line, or attend a school that does not provide free meals.
- **St. Mary's Food Bank** provided us with 532 meals to be given to families in need over our summer meal program
- **Hungry Kids Foundation** continued to offer weekend meal bags over the summer.
- **Scratch Cooking.** The pandemic changed the way we served meals to children as well as changed the food we served to children. Grab & go meals had to consist of mostly pre-packaged items. Once we were back in school, we made a commitment to offer more homemade items like our ziti and mac & cheese.
- **Breakfast in the Classroom.** Mountain View Elementary School and Lake Valley Elementary School implemented Breakfast in the Classroom this school year. It has been a great success with meal participation doubling over last year.
- **As part of National School Breakfast Week 2021,** we held an art contest where students drew a picture of their favorite school breakfast. The art work had to show what "superpowers" they received from eating school breakfast. Winners received a goodie bag filled with whole grain, reduced sugar treats and a certificate of recognition.
- **Nutrition Education:** Nutrition education was extremely limited due to Covid restrictions.
- **Clean Label.** In an effort to provide more nutritious foods to our students, we are continuously searching for cleaner labeled products to serve to our students.
- **Health and wellness widgets** are available under the "nutrition tips" tab of our website.
- **HUSD Food and Nutrition Facebook & Instagram pages** Shares all the wonderful meals that we prepare, share nutrition information and sometimes, just to share funny pictures.
- HUSD partners with Yavapai Regional Medical Center in the **Partners for Healthy Students program.** This program provides free health care to eligible students and their siblings.
- **Yavapai County Community Health Services** is encouraged to participate with the School Health Advisory Council in order to strengthen the committee and execute grant dollars geared towards student health and wellness. The SHAC also encourages all schools to sign up to be a Yavapai Healthy School Champion
- **Mountain View Elementary School:**
 - Mountain View serves breakfast in the classroom free to all students.
 - We have recess before lunch.
 - PE is offered at least once a week and some classes have it twice a week.

- We have a new relaxation room for our staff to promote wellness.
 - Teachers use GoNoodle throughout the day to promote brain breaks, physical activity, and stretching.
 - We have asked that only healthy snacks be brought in for celebrations
 - We have an active playground and are also using Second Step for SEL.
- **Coyote Springs Elementary School:**
 - Coyote Springs Elementary School's Occupational Therapist, Kristen Ott, created student choice activity options for K-6 during recess. These stations are developmentally appropriate activities to improve students' gross motor skills.
 - All CSES students during Habitat class are learning about the five food groups and what it means to be healthy using the Choose MyPlate curriculum. Students will be able to identify what foods to eat more of and why it is important to eat food in all food groups. Students in the upper grades will be able to identify what food has added sugars and solid fats. With this information, students will be able to give healthier food options to choose from.
 - The focus in PE has been based on fitness-related skills and endurance. All students have been participating in a high intensity interval training as a portion of their time in PE.
- **Lake Valley Elementary School:**
 - Lake Valley started Breakfast in the Classroom this year and teachers and students are enjoying this time. It has allowed all students the opportunity to eat breakfast, for free, daily with their peers. We have noticed that more students are eating breakfast this year and taking their time to eat and not feeling rushed to go outside to play. This change has helped our students during class not be hungry and start their day on a positive note.
 - In addition, this year, Lake Valley was able to purchase a "Ga-Ga Pit" with our Fuel up funds to add more playground games and equipment, especially for our older students. This new playground structure is used daily and our students have been so excited to see a new structure to the playground that allows them to engage with each other. Students have learned the new game and rules and have had a blast getting moving on the playground.

Grants & Donations Received

- **No Kid Hungry:** 4 grants adding up to \$32,625 to help with all aspects of the F&N program.

- **Ace Hardware:** \$3000+ worth of plastic t-shirt bags needed for our grab & go summer meal program.
- **T-Mobile:** \$5,000 to help with expenses + 2500 bags
- **GENYouth Foundation:** \$7,000.00 to help offset some of the expenses we accrued during our Covid-19 summer meal program.
- **Prescott Area Face Masks:** Donated several dozen face masks to our staff.

Feedback of students, parent/guardians and community

- The Child Nutrition Director and the District Nutritionist are in the schools daily. This time is spent communicating with the students regarding their preferences.
- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to participate in the School Health Advisory Council. Food and Nutrition staff's email addresses and phone numbers are made available in multiple locations including the website and our brochure.
- The community is encouraged to participate in the School Health Advisory Council. Nutrition education is offered to the parents and the community by the Nutritionist through the Family Resource Center.
- Jody Buckle & Pamela Liuzzo maintain a School Nutrition Specialist credentialing (SNS). All kitchen managers, cooks, and Food and Nutrition administrative staff members have the Food Safety Manager's certification.

Goals for the 2021-22 School Health Advisory Council

- Increase wellness throughout the district through the School Wellness Grant that we received.
- Increase awareness and compliance with the districts Wellness Policy
- Encourage staff to model healthy eating and physical activity behaviors and/or discourage unhealthy behaviors in the school to enhance student wellness
- Increase nutrition education in the cafeteria through posters, staff and Smarter Lunchroom strategies.
- Win Yavapai County's Healthy School Award
- Increase student access to water on playgrounds
- Update current Wellness Policy and strengthen the monitoring tool for each school in the district.
- Increase non-food fundraisers and decrease fundraisers that use foods with little nutritional value.
- Increase the usage of Arizona grown and school garden produce within cafeterias.
- Increase parent, student and school staff participation in the SHAC.
- Provide an opportunity for increased feedback regarding the National School Breakfast and National School Lunch Program through continued promotion.

- Increase the use of social media to increase SHAC participation and food program feedback.
- Increase school gardens and habitat interest
- Implement continued mandated changes in the National School Lunch Program based on the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act.
- Encourage and support schools to participate in recess before lunch.
- Encourage HUSD team members to not provide any non-nutritional foods or beverages to students until after lunch has been consumed.
- Increased collaboration between the Child Nutrition department and the Physical Educational department.
- Explore opportunities to encourage more physical activity during the school day.
- Expanded outreach from the Food and Nutrition department to teachers and other team members in order to provide more nutrition education to students and staff.

ASBA's legislative, regulatory and legal advocacy is based on the association's Political Agenda. A member-developed document, the Political Agenda is discussed, debated and approved by ASBA membership at the annual Delegate Assembly. Every district member board has the opportunity to influence the yearly agenda.

Adequately and Equitably Fund District Schools to at Least the National Median Per Pupil Funding

- Maximize state funding for nationally and locally competitive salaries to attract, recruit, and retain talented teachers and staff, including incentives for difficult to fill positions.
- Revise the School Finance formula to:
 - Provide a stable, dedicated revenue source less reliant on the general fund or annual legislative appropriation.
 - Provide dedicated school capital funding consistent with the constitutional requirement of a general and uniform public school system.
 - Ensure the formula addresses the unique financial needs of schools serving students in poverty and in rural and remote schools.
 - Revise the funding formula to add funding for student mental health and well-being initiatives.
- Fully fund full-day kindergarten and include kindergarten students in the override calculations.
- Advocate to preserve and protect the voters' original intent of Prop 301.
- Index district additional assistance (DAA) funding for inflation.
- Provide funding for new space before existing schools exceed their maximum capacity and become overcrowded, and provide dedicated and flexible ongoing maintenance funding, including building replacement. Advocate for capacity standards that reflect the design of instructional space.

- Conduct an exceptional student services cost study to assure students, including in rural or remote areas, are being funded at the actual cost of their services.

- Reform current year funding to a system that provides districts with appropriate stable annual budgeting ability and technical reliability.
- Prorate funding over the entire school year among all public schools that a student has attended during the year.
- Provide funding to individual districts to implement locally directed school safety programs as well as student mental health and wellbeing initiatives.
- Equitably invest in technology and reliable internet access for all students.
- Adequately fund programs under exceptional student services.
- Provide funding for districts to improve student achievement by addressing social-emotional learning needs and create training programs for school staff in cultural proficiency and responsiveness.

Preserve and Strengthen Local Control

Adopted by the ASBA Delegate Assembly | October 17, 2020

- Ensure local control and flexibility in managing funds and programs when possible, given the Arizona constitutional requirements of a general and uniform public school system.
- Change "override/budget increase" language to better reflect what voters are being asked to support.
- Allow school districts greater flexibility in the divestiture or use of taxpayer-funded assets.
- Oppose legislative intrusion on school site budgeting decisions.
- Maintain exclusive local authority over any measure that would propose to consolidate and/or unify any number of school districts into a larger district.
- Support local board authority for student suspensions and open enrollment.
- Support policy that eliminates the use of corporal punishment in Arizona schools.
- Amend current statute to allow school board members to use the E-Qual system in addition to in-person signatures to appear on the ballot.

Improve Outcomes For All Students

- Increase the compulsory attendance age from 16 to 18 years.
- Enact research-based reform of the English Language Learner model of instruction that may include primary language literacy to improve student achievement that does not segregate English Language Learners from English speaking peers; integrates reading, writing and oral language instruction; and incorporates multiple assessment measures to demonstrate English proficiency.
- Fully restore 9th-grade CTE/CTED eligibility and funding to allow students to explore career fields and/or certification completion.
- Allow CTEDs to serve students through age 21 regardless of graduation status.
- Support policy that recognizes, respects, and promotes teaching as a profession.
- Defend against efforts to chill the free speech rights of school employees.
- State standardized testing shall not be used for any purpose other than a year-over-year measurement of student growth in the tested subject.
- Support policy that protects school district employees and students from discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Require Public Accountability for Taxpayer Dollars Spent on Education

- Establish financial and academic transparency for all institutions and individuals that accept public funds.
- Repeal any program that gives public funds for private schools, vouchers (Empowerment Scholarship Accounts) and private school subsidies (Student Tuition Organizations) and prevent any future expansion.
- Require comparative classroom spending audits for school districts and all other institutions that accept public funds and define "classroom spending" as both instructional spending and student support spending.
- Enforce financial requirements and seek recovery of improperly received and/or expended public funds by charter and private schools and organizations.

Manage the Impact of COVID-19 on Public Schools

- Hold school districts harmless for significant enrollment losses for school year 2020-2021.
- Provide flexibility in seat time and attendance requirements for school districts for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Suspend state standardized testing requirements for school year 2020-2021.
- Enact a moratorium on school letter grades for school year 2020-2021.
- Provide districts flexibility in teacher evaluation requirements and procedures.
- Facilitate regulatory relief in the event the pandemic continues to (or does so at a future date) interrupt the academic year.
- Create a state-funded program designed to bulk purchase sanitation supplies (i.e. PPE, cleaning supplies, etc.) for distribution to school districts and schools.
- Provide funding for increased expenses incurred due to COVID-19, including costs to meet the social-emotional needs of students.
- Fund technology modernization and accessibility to ensure students have the technology and equipment to use during times like these with the current COVID-19 pandemic.
- Unless a public emergency is declared, maintain the right of school districts to close for safety concerns related to COVID-19 outbreak in the community.
- Protect public schools from liability if a community member contracts COVID-19 while engaged in school-sponsored activities.

Issues for Legislative Committee Consideration – 2021 Political Agenda

The Governing Board of Humboldt Unified School District presents the following issues to the ASBA Legislative Committee as discussed by the Governing Board at their regular meeting held on May 12, 2020.

TOP FIVE

1. Provide a permanent, dedicated funding source for teacher and other staff compensation sufficient to raise the pay to the national median. **Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, structure this funding source so that it does not rely solely on seat time and attendance to accommodate for possible alternative instructional delivery models, ie; blended or online learning opportunities.**

Rationale: Funding must be sustainable and not subject to yearly fluctuations in the economy to **accommodate for unforeseen events such as the COVID-19 pandemic.**

2. Fully restore Students First (SFB) funding for building renewal and new construction of school facilities.

Rationale: Districts currently have no mechanism for achieving these initiatives if no bond is in place. Given the continuing reduction in DAA, capital needs are now reaching critical levels.

3. Amend current statute to allow prospective school board members to use the E-Equal system in addition to in-person signatures to obtain the necessary signatures to appear on the ballot.

Rationale: Given the fact that one of the goals of locally elected school boards is to engage and represent the local electorate, it seems appropriate that we expand our opportunities to allow willing persons to collect signatures in as many ways as legally possible. This becomes especially important in light of our current pandemic situation, or other future such situations that might arise.

3. Change “override/budget increase” language to better reflect what voters are being asked to support, i.e.; “local support initiative.”

Rationale: Voters are often confused by the existing language, and think that districts “overspend” their allowable budgets.

4. Fully fund full-day kindergarten and include kindergarten students in the override calculations.

Rationale: Based on research, HUSD believes that a strong educational foundation provided by full day kindergarten is needed to increase the chances of successful learning. Given that kindergarten, which was fully funded at one time, is currently only funded at 1/2 weight per child, school districts must make up the rest of the funding, taking hundreds of thousands of dollars that could be used elsewhere, to provide this critical service.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS

5. Revise State formula and fully fund the DAA funding stream to include additional funding for costs associated with COVID-19 response such as universal affordable access to high speed internet, 1:1 technology, PPE, and increased cleaning and disinfecting needs.

Rationale: Although this had previously been promised to be achieved within five years, districts have needs now and these needs have only increased with the new reality of educating in the face of a global pandemic. Funding overall to districts remains well below 2008 levels and should be restored and increased ASAP.

6. Reform current year funding to a system that provides districts with appropriate stable annual budgeting ability and technical reliability.

Rationale: Any organization relies on financial stability during the fiscal year in order to effectively operate. A reduction in students could, in theory, mean fewer teachers, classrooms, and paraprofessionals are needed to meet the demands of the reduced student population. However, the loss of students generally impacts all grades meaning a few students are gone from each grade thus lowering classroom sizes but not enough to justify reducing operational costs. Given the extreme uncertainty of what delivering instruction will look like next school year and for the foreseeable future due to COVID-19, now would be an appropriate time to give Districts maximum flexibility in how they manage staffing and operational costs.







POLICY ADVISORY DISCUSSION

Policy IKFB, Graduation Exercises

House Bill 2705 (Fifty-fifth Legislature, First Regular Session, 2021), an act relating to local governance of schools, was approved by the Governor, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State on April 20, 2021, as an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by law.

The Governing Board should adopt Policy IKFB as amended in one reading as Policy BGB, Policy Adoption, states that *policies may be adopted or amended at a single meeting of the Board in a Board-declared emergency.*

House Bill 2705 is replicated below:

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

Section 1. Title 15, chapter 3, article 3, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended by adding section 15-348, to read:

15-348. Dress code policies; traditional tribal regalia; objects of cultural significance; graduation ceremonies; definitions

A. A SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD, A CHARTER SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY OR ANY PUBLIC-SCHOOL MAY NOT PROHIBIT A STUDENT WHO IS A MEMBER OF A FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBE OR WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BE ENROLLED AS A MEMBER OF A FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBE FROM WEARING TRADITIONAL TRIBAL REGALIA OR OBJECTS OF CULTURAL SIGNIFICANCE AT A GRADUATION CEREMONY.

B. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "OBJECTS OF CULTURAL SIGNIFICANCE" AND "TRADITIONAL TRIBAL REGALIA" INCLUDE AN EAGLE FEATHER OR EAGLE PLUME.

Sec. 2. Emergency

IKFB © GRADUATION EXERCISES

Graduation exercises will be held for students who have met state and local requirements for graduation from high school.

Participation in high school commencement exercises is encouraged but is not compulsory. However, since these exercises require planning and rehearsals, the following rules shall apply:

A. Students who wish to participate must be present at the rehearsals. Failure to do so, except for legitimate reasons for absence, may be cause for excluding students from participating in the exercises.

B. Students may not participate in the commencement exercises unless they have successfully completed the requirements for graduation.

C. Awards to seniors will be printed on the commencement program and announced at the exercises only in cases where the recipients have been selected solely by the school.

D. Other awards to graduating seniors selected by persons or organizations outside the school may be presented at the final awards assembly if approved by the principal.

E. A student who is a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe or who is eligible to be enrolled as a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe may wear traditional tribal regalia or objects of cultural significance at a graduation ceremony.

F. For the purposes of this section, "objects of cultural significance" and "traditional tribal regalia" include an eagle feather or eagle plume.





SUPPORTING DATA

The Bradshaw Mountain High School Athletic Department would like to officially add boy's JV and Varsity Volleyball to our list of sports offered at BMHS, starting the spring of 2022. This would take our total number of sports offered at BMHS to 16. Title IX does not come into play with this decision since we already offer 10 sports which females can participate in and 9 sports for male athletes. Baseball and potentially boys' volleyball being the only all true male sports program at BMHS.

- We currently have a list of 23 boys who have expressed interest in playing volleyball. But can see it increasing once they know it is actually being offered. Even had a middle school student ask about it during a visit.
- The AIA would add BMHS to a conference (most likely staying in 4A) and can be placed in a region (possibly West Valley with Prescott) for competition. We will have to create our own schedule since the schedules are created on a 2-year basis. But all it will take is asking other schools to fill our schedule and getting it approved by the AIA.
- We would not need to purchase any new equipment since the athletic department already owns all the necessary equipment from girls' volleyball.
- We would need to purchase uniforms; however, the Student Council has already agreed to assist with \$400 in purchasing some of the uniforms. Plan on looking for donations if possible.
- The district would need to supply transportation to approximately 7-10 away games and 2 tournaments (if allowed next school year). The teams would have 18 games on the schedule, plus possibly 2 tournaments.
- Two coaches (Varsity and JV) stipends would need to be covered. The starting range is \$1225.000 to \$1592.50. The athletic department would be willing to cover the cost the first year through their tax credit account but would look to moving it to M/O for the Head coach and tax credit for the assistant coach the following year



SUPPORTING DATA

West Yavapai Guidance Clinic (WYGC) is willing to partner with Humboldt Unified to offer school-based counseling services for students during the 2021-22 school year. This program will be housed on school campuses by providing an in kind donation of an office for the full-time clinician provided. WYGC employs and compensates clinicians to provide school-based counseling services to all students at their assigned school. Initially, this program will benefit two school sites.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Humboldt Unified School District (herein "District") and **West Yavapai Guidance Clinic**, an Arizona nonprofit corporation (herein "WYGC") hereby agree to the following Terms and Conditions:

1. **PURPOSE.** This Agreement supports WYGC's desire to provide mental health services, substance abuse counseling, and parenting skills training, including individual, group, family counseling services (herein "Services") to students and families within the District.
2. **WYGC AGREES TO:**
 - A. Provide clinicians (counselor or social worker) services to select schools and sites to be designated by the District.
 - B. Make Services available on school campuses for students who are enrolled in WYGC Services.
 - C. Support teachers and school personnel in identifying students and families who are in need of behavioral health services.
 - D. Provide Services to students and families who are either eligible or ineligible for Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (herein "AHCCCS") coverage. It is anticipated that some students may be enrolled in WYGC and others may be paid for through grant funding.
 - E. Assist families with enrollment for AHCCCS. Provide Services to students and families who will pay for Services out-of-pocket (herein "Private Pay"). Students and families receiving Private Pay Services will sign a Private Pay Agreement with WYGC. The Rate Schedule for Private Pay is outlined in Exhibit A.
 - F. Work in collaboration with families, teachers, and school personnel to aid students and families in reaching their service plan goals.
 - G. Upon request, provide updates to School Administration and Board regarding the progress and impact of programs and Services.
3. **DISTRICT AGREES TO:**
 - A. Provide adequate office and classroom space to enable WYGC to effectively administer programs and Services.
 - B. Work in collaboration with WYGC to aid students and families in reaching their service plan goals.
4. **TERM.** The term of this Agreement shall be from _____, 2021 through _____, 2022. This Agreement is not subject to automatic renewal.
5. **TERMINATION.** Either party may, at any time and without defaulting on this Agreement, terminate in whole, or any part, this Agreement for convenience by providing a thirty (30) day written notice to the other party.
6. **RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN PARTIES.** WYGC and District are independent entities. No relationship of employer-employee exists between WYGC, District, and their agents. The Parties understand and agree that they shall not in any manner represent or hold out as acting or being authorized to act on behalf of the other Party. WYGC and District will retain exclusive control of their respective employees.
7. **INSURANCE.** The District and WYGC shall maintain insurance to cover its operations and properties throughout the term of this Agreement. Any insurance maintained by WYGC will apply in excess of, and not contribute to, insurance maintained by the District. WYGC shall provide District with proof of liability insurance.
8. **CONFIDENTIALITY.** During the execution of this Agreement, the Parties may gain access, gain exposure, or acquire confidential information of clients (herein referred to as "Confidential Information").

- A. **Confidentiality Obligations.** The Parties, including their employees, agents, or representatives shall (i) not disclose to any third party the Confidential Information acquired during the execution of this Agreement, unless otherwise permitted by this Agreement, (ii) only permit use of the Confidential Information by employees, agents, and representatives who need the Confidential Information to complete performance under this Agreement, and (iii) advise each of their employees, agents, and representatives of their obligations to keep the Confidential Information private. The Parties agree that they shall be bound by and shall abide by all applicable Federal and State statutes and regulations pertaining to the confidentiality of client records or information.
- B. **Confidentiality Exception.** The Parties shall not use or disclose any Confidential Information for any purpose not associated with the Parties' responsibilities under this Agreement, unless the Party receives written consent from the client, client's attorney, or legal guardian.
9. **INDEMNIFICATION.** Each Party to this Agreement shall hold harmless, and indemnify the other Party and its directors, officers, agents, sub-contractors, employees and volunteers against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, injuries, claims, suits, demands and legal proceedings including any direct, indirect or consequential loss, liability, damage, or expense, but not including attorneys' fees, unless awarded by a court of competent jurisdiction, arising out of or in connection with the intentional, willful, wanton, reckless or negligent conduct arising from or to the extent alleged to be in connection with the Services to any Indemnified Party and any third party. However, neither Party shall be indemnified hereunder for any loss, liability, damage, or expense resulting from its sole negligence or willful misconduct. Any claim involving contributory negligence shall be handled so that each party is responsible and liable for its share of the damages and defense cost associated therewith, in proportion to its share of negligence.
10. **NOTICES.** Unless otherwise provided for in this Agreement, notices shall be provided in writing. Notices may be made in electronic or hard copy format, so long as the specified guidelines are followed.
- A. **Electronic Notices.** Electronic notices must be sent via electronic mail. Notice is deemed given when the notice is sent. Electronic notices to WYGC shall be sent to: _____.
Electronic notices to District shall be sent to: John.Pothast@humboldtunified.com.
- B. **Hard Copy Notices.** Hard copies notices must be sent by registered or certified mail with delivery confirmation. Notice is deemed given upon confirmed delivery. Notices to WYGC shall be sent to: West Yavapai Guidance Clinic; _____; Attention: _____. Notice to District shall be sent to: Humboldt Unified School District; 6411 N. Robert Road, Prescott Valley, AZ 86315; Attention: John Pothast, Superintendent.
11. **GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE.** The validity, interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Arizona. The venue for any legal action arising out of this Agreement shall be held in a court of competent jurisdiction in Yavapai County in the State of Arizona.
12. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAW.** The Parties agree that this Agreement shall, comply with applicable local, State, and Federal law.
- A. **Equal Opportunity Affirmative Action.** WYGC shall not maintain or provide racially segregated facilities at any establishment under its control. WYGC agrees to comply with all applicable State and Federal Equal Opportunity, immigration, and affirmative action requirements.
- B. **Nondiscrimination.** The Parties shall comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, and State Executive Order No. 99-4 and 2009-09, which mandates that all persons, regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, or political affiliation, shall have equal access to employment opportunities. The Parties shall comply with the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, which prohibits discrimination in the employment or advancement of employment of qualified persons because of physical or mental handicap, and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- C. **Fingerprinting.** District will have, at all times, a complete and accurate written list of all employees and agents of WYGC who will be provided access to District sites on a regular basis under this Agreement;

WYGC will be required to have a completed fingerprint clearance card in accordance with A.R.S. § 15-512(H), and a criminal background check for each person granted access to District sites on an intermittent basis; and WYGC will ensure that its employees and agents follow guest or visitor rules at District sites

- D. **Workers' Compensation.** An employee of either Party shall be deemed an "employee" of both Parties while performing pursuant to this Agreement, for purposes of A.R.S. § 23-1022 and the Arizona Workers' Compensation laws. The primary employer shall be solely liable for any worker's compensation benefits which may accrue. Each Party shall post a notice pursuant to the provisions of A.R.S. § 23-906 in substantially the following form: All employees are hereby further notified that they may be required to work under the jurisdiction or control or within the jurisdictional boundaries of another public agency pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement or Contract, and under such circumstances they are deemed by the laws of Arizona to be employees of both public agencies for the purposes of workers' compensation.
- E. **Changes in Law.** If prior to the expiration of the term of this Agreement, applicable Federal, State, or local laws are enacted and affect either Party's performance or ability to perform under this Agreement, then the Parties may modify this Agreement within thirty (30) days after the legislation is effective.
- F. **Appropriations.** If during the term of this Agreement, a regulatory body, including the Arizona Department of Behavioral Health Services and/or Human Services, Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS), Regional Behavioral Health Authority, other funding sources, or the Internal Revenue Service determines that this Agreement is illegal, jeopardizes WYGC's tax exempt status, or otherwise materially affects WYGC's business, the applicable provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed null and void.
- G. **Severability.** If any of the provisions contained in this Agreement are deemed invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect under any applicable statute or rule of law, then such provisions shall be deemed inoperative to the extent that it is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, and the remainder of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

- 13. **DISPUTE RESOLUTION.** Any claim or controversy arising out of this Agreement will be resolved, to the fullest extent possible and in accordance with the law through informal meetings and discussions held in good faith between appropriate representatives of the parties. Any remaining claim or controversy will be resolved through mediation. Either party may initiate mediation by providing the other party a written request for mediation, setting forth the subject of the dispute and the relief requested. The parties will cooperate with one another in selecting a mediator. The parties agree they will participate in the mediation in good faith. Each party will bear its own costs and expenses, including its own attorneys' fees. Each party will bear an equal share of the mediator's fees and any administrative mediation costs. All offers, promises, conduct, and statements, whether oral or written, made in the course of the mediation by any of the parties, their agents, employees, experts and attorneys, and by the mediator made during mediation, are confidential, privileged, and inadmissible for any purpose, including impeachment, in any other proceeding involving the parties, provided that evidence that is otherwise admissible or discoverable shall not be rendered inadmissible or non-discoverable as a result of its use in the mediation.
- 14. **WAIVER.** No delay or failure to exercise any right, power, or privilege under this Agreement shall impair any such right, power, or privilege or be construed as a waiver of any default.
- 15. **NO PUBLICITY.** The Parties shall not advertise, publish or disclose to any third party or use any trademarks or trade names in any press release, promotional materials, advertisements, without a written consent signed by all Parties
- 16. **ASSIGNMENT.** This Agreement shall not be assigned in whole or in part by any of the Parties without the express, written consent of all Parties.

17. **ENTIRETY.** This Agreement contains the entire contract between the Parties. All prior negotiations between the Parties are merged into this Agreement. There are no understandings or agreements other than those incorporated herein. This Agreement may not be modified except by written instrument signed by all Parties.
18. **SIGNATURE AUTHORITY.** Each person signing this Agreement represents and warrants that he or she is duly authorized and has legal capacity to execute and deliver this Agreement.


