SUPPORTING DATA

After reviewing and paper-screening all applications, a Search Committee was convened to interview four (4) highly qualified candidates for the Director of Technology position.

The committee had certified staff, classified staff, and administrative representation. Members included: Mr. John Pothast, Superintendent; Aimee Fleming, Lake Valley Principal; Ashley Tetreault, Bradshaw Mountain Middle School Instructional Specialist, Tech Tools Team, and Synergy Primary Team member; Bob Terry, IT Director; Robin Berardi, Help Desk Technician; Corey Christens, Governing Board Member. Upon completion of the interviews, the committee's choice for the position was Mr. Mark Mo, and the committee's recommendation to the Governing Board is to name Mr. Mark Mo as the Director of Technology.

Mark brings with him over 21 years of IT leadership, architectural, and engineering experience from some of the most respected Healthcare IT and Aerospace Fortune 500 organizations. Since 2019, Mark successfully built and led Honeywell's IT Engineered Systems department at the National Nuclear Security Administration. His teams were tasked with developing, maintaining, and securing highly sensitive and mission critical networks for the Department of Energy. Prior to joining Honeywell, Mark served as the Global Technology Architect at Cerner Corporation with responsibility over the entire organization's strategic datacenter design and tactical operations decisions which spanned across North America, Europe, the Baltics, Middle East, Southeast Asia, and Australia for over 5 years. Mark also had the privilege of serving as a Network Systems Manager at a Fortune 7 company, McKesson Corporation, over their Pharmacy Benefits Management service offering which processed from just several million real time sub-second adjudications per year in 2005 to well over 100 million per year by 2011.

Mark received his Bachelor's degree in Information Technology Systems from Ottawa University and his Associate's degree in Information Technology from Johnson County Community College (JCCC). He also holds numerous industry recognized certifications such as Cloud Infrastructure and Services (EMCCIS), Information Storage and Management (EMCISMv2), CompTIA A+, Lean Six Sigma Green Belt, and Microsoft Certified Professional. His community involvement has included volunteering his time by serving as the Director of IT and Information Security for a non-profit, providing industry representation as a member of the JCCC Technology Advisory Board, and engaging in the recruitment of the next generation of IT workforce at college campus events over the past several years.

SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION

The Search Committee, Superintendent Pothast, and Mr. Christens support the recommendation that Mr. Mo be approved as the new Director of Technology for the Humboldt Unified School District.

Prop 301 Update

OBJECTIVE: Board Governance

SUPPORTING DATA

The 2021-2022 Meet and Confer Committee has organized and begun meeting, including developing a sub-committee that has been working on defining the use of Prop 301 funds. Although HUSD has an established process for the use of Prop 301 funds, recent legislative action allowed school districts to reconsider the use of Prop 301 funds.

SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION

Meet and Confer's Prop 301 Sub-Committee recommends keeping HUSD's current guidelines and process for the use of Prop 301 funds, with one change: Removal of Components 2 (Classroom Level Student Achievement data) and Component 3 (School Level Student Achievement Data), leaving only Component 1 (Professional Growth) as the performance aspect for a teacher to receive the funds. There were numerous points that were considered by the sub-committee's work, conversations, and decision.

- Although the Arizona Legislature passed recent legislation that allowed school districts to
 reconsider the use of Prop 301 funds, the Sub-Committee was unanimous in their belief that the
 funds should still be used for the original intent of the funds, which was for teachers.
 Additionally, employment contracts were signed last spring on the understanding that current
 guidelines and processes would be used in determining salaries, as well as the use of any Prop
 301 funds.
- At the state level, the funding source for this money comes directly from state sales taxes collected. Because of that, in years where the state collects a larger amount from sales taxes, Prop 301 funds are larger, and in years where state sales tax collection is smaller, Prop 301 funds are smaller. Historically, teachers have received as little as \$2,000, and as much as \$8.000, due to the fluctuation of sales tax collection at the state level. Prop 301 funding for the current school year is high (and estimated to be roughly \$11,000), due to a larger-than-normal year in sales tax revenues for the state. Projections for next year, and into the future, are expected to have Prop 301 funds back in the "normal" range, which has been around \$5,000-\$7,000.
- As stated earlier, Sub-Committee recommends keeping HUSD's current guidelines and process for the use of Prop 301 funds (with the removal of Components 2 & 3), which includes paying out approximately 1/3 of the funds to teachers in December, and the remainder at the end of the school year in May.
- The larger-than-normal amount in the funds for the current school year prompted a great deal of discussion about the possibility of employee groups other than teachers being able to receive some additional funding as well. Although the Sub-Committee is unanimous in their recommendation to keep our current guidelines and process for the use of Prop 301 money, the Sub-Committee also recommends that the district use ESSER funds to give a bonus to other employee groups who do not qualify for Prop 301 funds. Those bonus funds would be for the

- current school year only, and would vary in amount from roughly \$400 \$2,000, depending on current job classification and rate of pay.
- As stated, the Sub-Committee recommends keeping HUSD's current guidelines and process for the use of Prop 301 funds, with the removal of Components 2 & 3. There was discussion about other performance measures being included. With the state suspending the state's letter grade/accountability system last spring, including additional performance measures did not seem reasonable at this point. However, as HUSD move further along with its work on Personalized Learning, additional performance measures, that make sense, could be considered in the future.

Currently this is a Discussion Item intended to share the work and thinking of the Sub-Committee, but this topic will be an Action Item on the November 9, 2021 Governing Board meeting agenda.
