

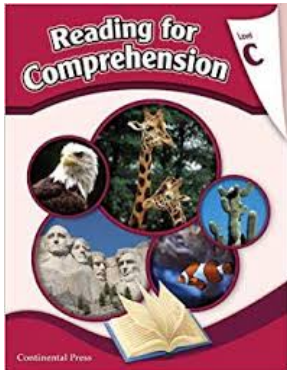

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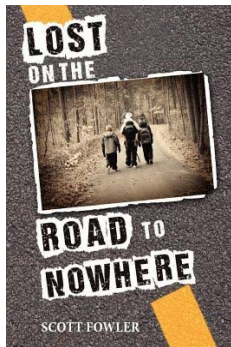

Keep a journal throughout the summer. Write about the trips you go on and the fun adventures you have. Check all your written work using COPS.

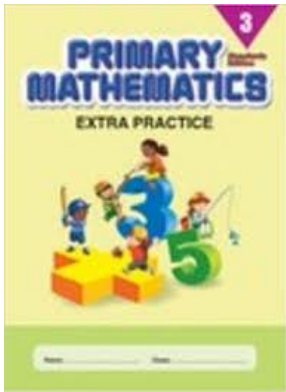

Editing with COPS!	
<input type="checkbox"/>	C apitalization *Does each sentence begin with a capital? *Is the letter "I" capitalized? *Did you capitalize the names of places and people?
<input type="checkbox"/>	O rder & Organization *Does it make sense? *Does it sound right? *Is it neat? *Did you use proper spacing?
<input type="checkbox"/>	P unctuation *Does every sentence end with punctuation? *Do you need any ? or ! ?? *Did you use " " when people talk in your story?
<input type="checkbox"/>	S pelling *Have you checked your work for spelling? *Have you tried to fix any incorrect spelling? *Have you circled words you know are not spelled correctly?
