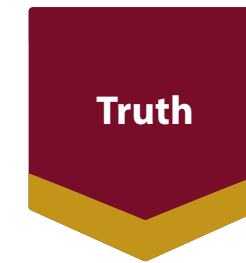

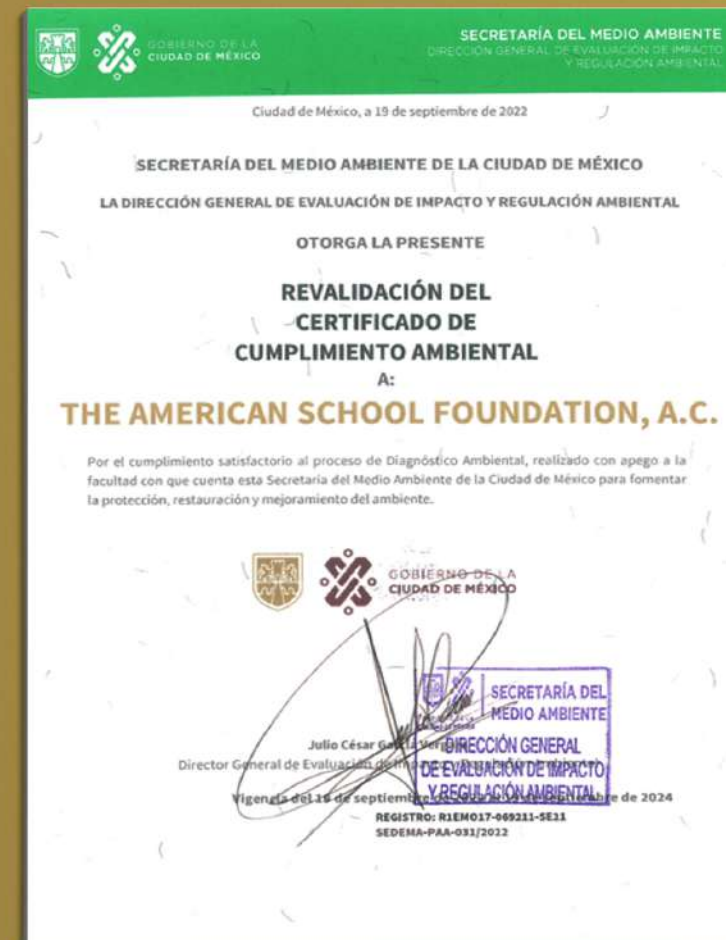

Academic Programs

AMERICAN PROGRAM

ASF is accredited by the Cognia (formerly *The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools*) in the United States. All students follow this program's requirements to obtain a United States high school diploma, with optional Upper School coursework available through the IB, AP and Mexican programs described below.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Advanced Placement courses are offered at the Upper School level, giving students the opportunity to challenge themselves and earn university credit. The Advanced Placement international Diploma is an option for those who wish to demonstrate outstanding achievement on AP exams across several disciplines.

IB PROGRAMME

ASF is an IB World School offering all three Baccalaureate programs – Primary Years Programme (PYP), Middle Years Programme (MYP) and the Diploma Programme (DP), which is an optional two year program that offers Upper School students advanced work in a variety of areas. Courses in the IBDP are considered the most rigorous pathway at ASF.

MEXICAN PROGRAM

The *Secretaría de Educación Pública* (SEP, Mexican Education Secretariat) revalidates ASF studies for grades K through 12, while the *Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México* (UNAM, National Autonomous University of Mexico) revalidates studies for grades 10 through 12. The Mexican program offers students validation of coursework for entry into other Mexican schools and universities affiliated with UNAM. ASF's accreditations and high academic standards allow students to transfer to other schools around the world seamlessly.

UNSTOPPABLE LEARNING!

While COVID-19 was evolving into an endemic disease, The American School Foundation took on the challenge of going fully back on campus. All Students, all Faculty and Staff... and all Bears were finally home again. Some of the best practices learned during the pandemic were kept, and a few events were still held online for the 2021-22 school year, as it was seen that they just worked better in this format. The majority of events, however, were held back on Campus, with all the emotion that it entails. We were all happy to be together once again, feeling the warmth that comes with in-person interaction. This Annual Report summarizes the events of all the incredible outcomes of our Students' projects during the 2021-2022 academic year.



The 2021-22 school year represented a challenge of a new variety. Classes were back to in-person K-12, with an asynchronous model option offered at the beginning of the year. However, there were very few students who followed this option, the majority preferring to be in person, even if required to wear a mask at all times.

However, there were very few students who followed this option, the majority preferring to be in person, even if required to wear a mask at all times. At the beginning of the school year in-person classes for ECC, LS and MS students were rotated weekly per grade level, with the purpose of monitoring any possible outbreak. Fortunately, we did not see any widespread outbreaks on campus. Upper School students were allowed to fully return in person due to the mixture of grade levels in many sections.

In-person return included certain measures that allowed the school to follow up in case of an outbreak: face mask wearing during the school day over the entire school year, daily temperature record (students and employees, including faculty members), staggered recess and outdoor academic activities, and the encouragement of vaccinations through excused absences for students and staff. Parents were asked to share the students' vaccination certificates, in order to determine the percentage of vaccinated students.

Athletics and Extended Learning activities started on a regular basis in August 2021, as only a portion of the student body participates in them. These actions were adjusted over the school year according to the needs. Very quickly, all classes took place in-person and, later in the year, the daily temperature records were discontinued.

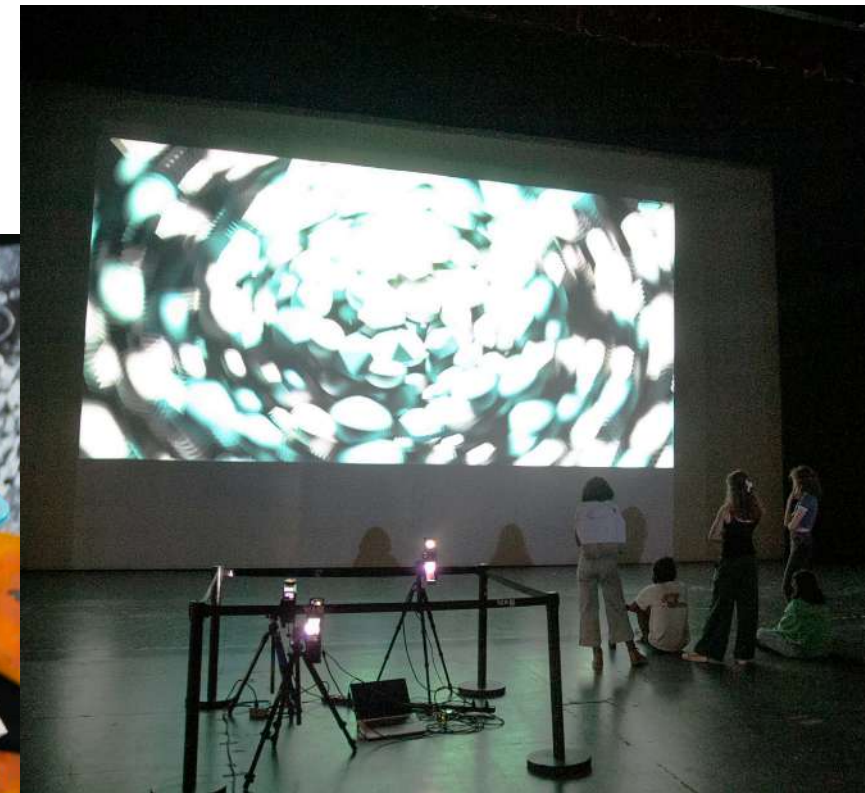
Counselors continued working on providing students the tools to reacclimate to in-person school activities, social and academic support, including individual and group interventions to develop study, organizational and time management skills, as well as emotional support. The common denominator during the school year was a positive attitude and student excitement for an in-person return, which was reflected in a successful school year.

Re-newal: 52nd Art Fair Week

The legal restrictions on in-person events made this installment of the Art Fair very challenging. Notwithstanding, we decided to create, for the first time ever, a complete week celebration for the 52nd Art Week: only Student-created artwork was displayed in the Fine Arts Center Lobby and the Lower School Multipurpose Room, from K1 to Grade 12. This resulted in active, mass participation from all our Community.



Transmedia and Creative Technology Spring 2022 Showcase



Considering Speculative Design as a way to create alternative readings of the past, present and future of humanity, our Upper School students developed projects in digital 3D spaces in which they critiqued a specific part of society and then speculated about a possible future or outcome.

Students did not simply “invent” these speculative scenarios, they had to research about what the realities and tendencies are in the given area they chose to investigate.

Their final works turned the Fine Arts Center into a massive multimedia immersive experience that invited the audience to reflect upon the topics and their involvement in the search for solutions.

Grade 4 Musicals

The Grade 4 Musicals is a project originally offered at the Metropolitan Opera Guild in New York, and ASF has been carrying it out for 30 years. Back in the day, the Metropolitan Opera Guild trained teachers to create an opera from the start: the story, script, music, set, makeup, costume design, and everything that an opera entails. While our teachers are no longer traveling to New York for training, ASF continues with this project and provides different workshops to Students so that they can create 15-to-30-minute-long musicals. Students could not be helped by adults, it has to be their work alone.

The 2021-22 Grade 4 Musicals was a very exciting event, because Students came back to campus and they were able to do their plays in the Ángeles Espinosa Yglesias Fine Arts Center. The result was incredible.



Mamma Mia!

2022 marked the return of the performing arts to the ASF campus and to celebrate it our ASF Theatre Company put us all to dance and sing along to their outstanding rendition of Mamma Mia! With a completely original and colorful set, brilliant performances and lots of passion and hard work, 41 students from 8th to 12th grade created the most memorable experience for the ASF community acting, playing live music and running the show.



Athletics

In 2021, all after-school activities were finally held in person and back on campus. Students were eager to meet their teams once again and start training together. This year brought with it many athletic events and competitions, including sports day, the ASOMEX Tournament, the Athletics Gala and a lot more.



The JV Basketball Team Brings Home First Place: ASOMEX Tournament

ASF won First Place in the JV ASOMEX Tournament which was held in Guadalajara from May 5th to 9th, 2022, after beating the Colegio Inglés de Monterrey in the finals. It was the first time since the beginning of the pandemic that ASF won this tournament in First Place. They played against nine different teams and won every single match by more than 10 points!

Sports Day

On May 11th, 2022, Our Community got to be back together at school since COVID, and we celebrated our safe return to sports; different games were played throughout the day ending with our traditional American football game and varsity athletes parade. Different food options were available and Bear Boosters held a raffle with the number one prize being a Manchester United jersey signed by professional soccer player Javier Hernández, "Chicharito"! First time we could all get together at school as a community after Covid. This substituted Homecoming, since this year we were unable to hold it due to the restrictions due to the pandemic.



Athletics Gala

Held on May 26th in the ASF Fine Arts Center - We could finally celebrate our athletes in person and recognize their accomplishments. Although our "back to the new normal" began until the second semester, our athletes were again able to participate at ASOMEX, tournaments, meets and leagues. Notwithstanding all the challenges the athletes faced like last-minute game cancellations, special protocols and covid testing they were finally able to return to their teams/sports.



Extended Learning

Extended Learning had a great year upon returning from the remote learning modality. Almost every single one of our activities was full and many of them even held waiting lists. Our program had its registration numbers back to where they were before the pandemic and a few more. The instructors and students aligned to the health and safety protocols inside and outside the classroom, which made the program run smoothly.



We were able to offer our regular program which includes: Art, Ballet, Chess, French, Playball, Gymnastics, Karate, Magic, Mindfulness, Taekwondo, Soccer, Swimming, Tennis, and Violin for our ECC students.

3D Printing, Art, Ballet, Basketball, Ceramics, Chess, Coding Beginners and Intermediate, Drawing, Flag Football, French Beginners and Intermediate, Gymnastics, Karate, Jazz Dance, Maker's, Magic, Mindfulness, Musical Theater, Running, Swimming, Taekwondo, Tennis, and Yo-Yo for our LS and MS Students.





Our Financial Aid program provides tuition relief to families that need it. For 39 years, together as the strong community that we are, our program has been able to expand to cover 18% of our student body with an average of a 50% scholarship. It is through donations and several events that the Community manages to raise the money to support the Endowment Fund for Financial Aid.



Holiday Bazaar

This year, due to COVID-19 safety protocols, our traditional Holiday Bazaar took on a new form. The bustling event that typically took place within the school grounds was held at a new venue in Torre Virreyes. Despite the challenges presented by the pandemic, our community came together to create a memorable and vibrant experience and at the same time support our Endowment Fund for Financial Aid. The Holiday Bazaar, brought together more than 120 vendors, each offering unique products.

With the holiday spirit of the season, ASF also held an "In House" Bazaar for all Students, Faculty and Staff at campus so that they could also live a joyful experience of our traditional Bazaar. Having the participation of our ASF community in both Bazaars served as a reflection of the resilience and creativity in adapting to challenging times. We were able to ensure the safety of all participants while still providing a festive and enjoyable experience for all.

Spring Bazaar

After a long period of separation because of COVID-19, we were thrilled to finally welcome back all Parents to the school grounds. In the spirit of reconnecting with our Community, we decided to celebrate to host a Spring Bazaar. It was a vibrant event filled with excitement and the spirit of renewal. Once again families visited our ASF campus, engaged with vendors, and discovered unique products. The Bazaar created opportunities for community members to re-connect, support local businesses, and have a great shopping experience.

Despite a very challenging period following the COVID-19 pandemic, our Tournament had the participation of important brands that generously sponsored the event, providing engaging activities and exciting gifts for all participants. The players enjoyed a day of golf and networking, all while making a meaningful impact in the education of our community.



7th Virtual Race

The Virtual Race is ASF's annual fundraising drive, which, in 2022, was set with a goal of 1 million pesos, this year's virtual race engaged all community members to come together in support for our Financial Aid program. We kicked off with enthusiastic participation from all members of our community. The involvement of this year's race was phenomenal with runners from ECC to 12th grades and community partners like the Parent Association, Alumni, the Board of Trustees, Faculty and Staff. We know that when we work together, no task is big enough. Our race started with the ECC piggy bank fundraising followed by the LS bake sales and by daring Mr Jordan, Head of Lower School, to a Camping on Campus Challenge.

The ECC, Middle School, Upper School, and Athletics were not far behind in joining the fun. Ms Erin, Mr. Jeff, Mr. Peat and Mr. Wilson accepted Mr. Jordan's challenge. We reached and surpassed our goal and came to the total amount of \$1,008,055 pesos! This has a direct impact on our community and more students will be able to stay at ASF to fulfill their education.



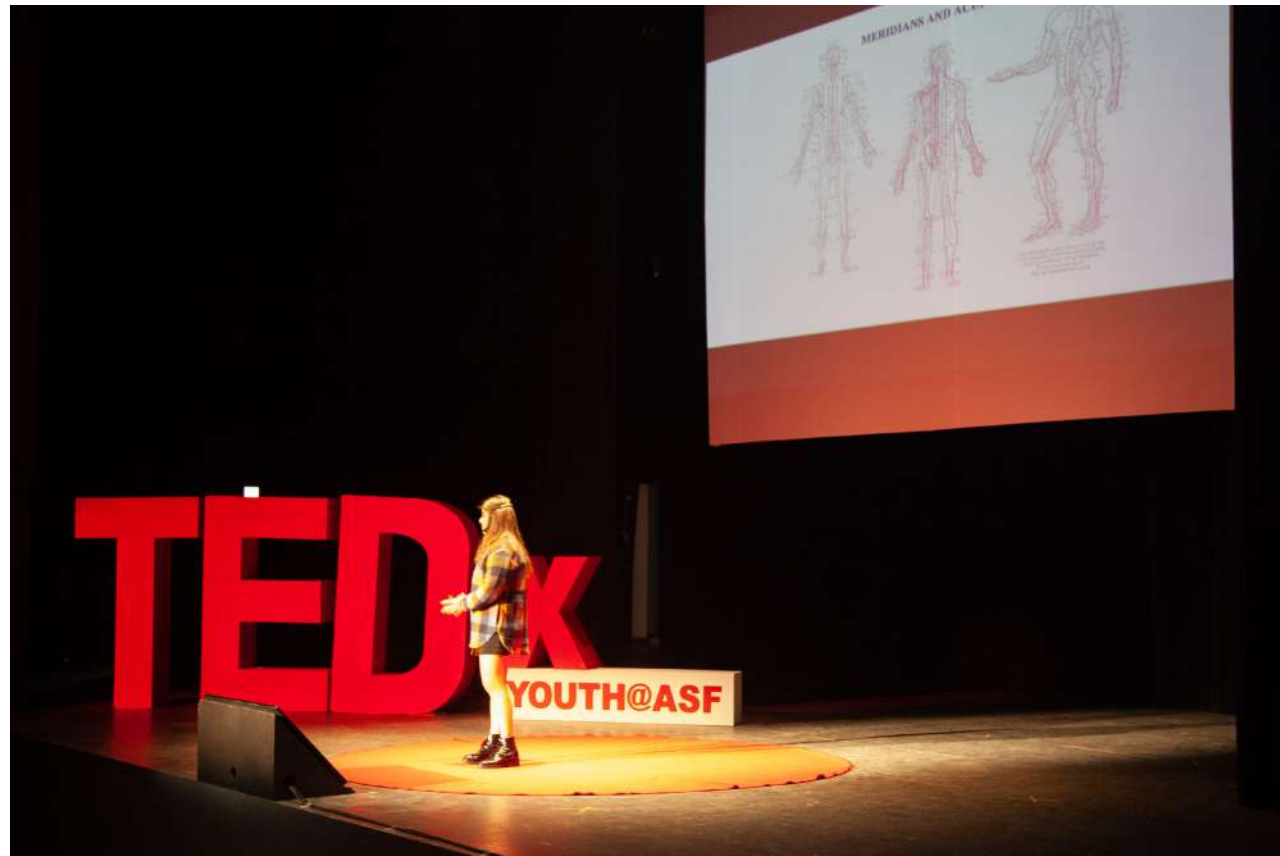
Toy Drive and Despensas Campaign

ASF hosted a new edition of the TEDx Youth event in the Ángeles Espinosa Yglesias Fine Arts Center. During this event organized by Upper School Students, there were seven powerful TED talks given by ASF students and staff. It was an activity that stimulated discussion and debate among attendees.



Club Omega

At Club Omega, we continued to offering online classes for senior citizens, mainly in the neighborhood surrounding our School. ASF Upper School students developed didactic activities for Computer and English classes, in addition to proposals for the use of electronic devices. Groups were well organized, according to learning levels, and our motivated representatives kindly offered their time adapting to the studying conditions that the senior citizens were able to access.



Club Gamma

During the 2021-22 school year at Club Gamma, we continued to offer online classes for students from public schools. ASF students at Upper School developed didactic activities for Spanish, Math, English, Art, Science and Computer Lab Classes. Although fewer students participated as activities resumed after the pandemic, our enthusiastic students continued with the work, motivated by the future return to class for this program in the 2022-23 school year. The Fine Arts Center helped to define strategies and organize groups and classrooms with the intention of creating new activities in our School. The complexity was that the students we assisted lacked the adequate infrastructure for the activities, but this did not stop them from achieving their goals.



SERVICES FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS A YEAR IN REVIEW

The ASF Special Education Program, Services for Academic Success (SAS), promotes comprehensive-inclusive education services and provides specific support for students with Mild to Moderate disabilities, including but not limited to the following categories of The Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA): Specific Learning Disabilities, Some Other Health Impairment, Speech and Language Challenges and Students with Autism (Requiring moderate support for academic needs).

The school year 2021-22 was an adventure for the SAS program, starting with the program's audit, followed by the transition of the new coordinator, and ending with all the changes and challenges that both things have brought to the program.

In order to continue reviewing and improving our programs, during the 2021-22 school year the U.S. Department of State supported an audit of the SAS program, through one of their specialists. The audit made recommendations to be implemented over the next years, and came along with the transition of the new coordinator that would overtake the position, which undoubtedly allows the program to be revamped.



The SAS teachers continue to put all the interventions, resources, and strategies needed to make their students grow. They create Individualized Education Plans that were accurate to their students' needs and shared these documents and the progress with parents, teachers, administrators, and students. The team's main objective is to continue promoting positive changes, based on a five-year strategic plan that will be created especially for SAS, in the services, policies, resources, formats, and ways to collaborate with teachers and administrators.

Alumni Tours

As ASF reopened its doors, the Alumni tours were restarted, and requests have increased! During the 2021-22 school year, ASF held tours for the classes of 2005, 1966 and 69, 1970 and 1990. It is a very gratifying experience to guide these alumni through campus as they remember their days in school and are amazed at the changes on campus.



Graduation Events

During the Senior Awards Ceremony, three Seniors were the recipients of Alumni Spirit Award. They received a hoodie, an Alumni cup and were invited to become Class Representatives, two of them accepted. In addition, a special video was created to recognize those Seniors children of Alumni, as the Bear tradition carries on within their families.



ASF Talks Digital Revolution Human Experience

A new edition of ASF Talks was held on April 6th, 2022. This time, the event had a hybrid format, in person and via livestreaming with the theme "Digital Revolution in our Human Experience". We looked into the effects and consequences of technology on our identity, health, relationships, well-being, business activity and socio-economic identity. In order to do so, six Alumni and two guest orators took on the challenge to tackle this subject through their field of expertise along with a discussion panel. Some of the most important topics discussed by them were: how relationships have changed, well-being skills, the paradoxical nature of technologies (being good and bad), and making healthy choices while consuming social content online. Finally, three members of the ASF Community were recognized throughout the event: Linda Farca, Mr. Allan Goud and Irene de la Llata Anzaldúa. Tears ran as we listened to them and their families talking about what our School had meant to them in their lives.



Paw Prints Alumni Helping Alumni

The "Paw Prints - Alumni Helping Alumni" Fund continued raising funds for Financial Aid for children of Alumni. Former ASF students of all ages contributed to this fund and four children of Alumni received Financial Aid for the school year 2022-23.

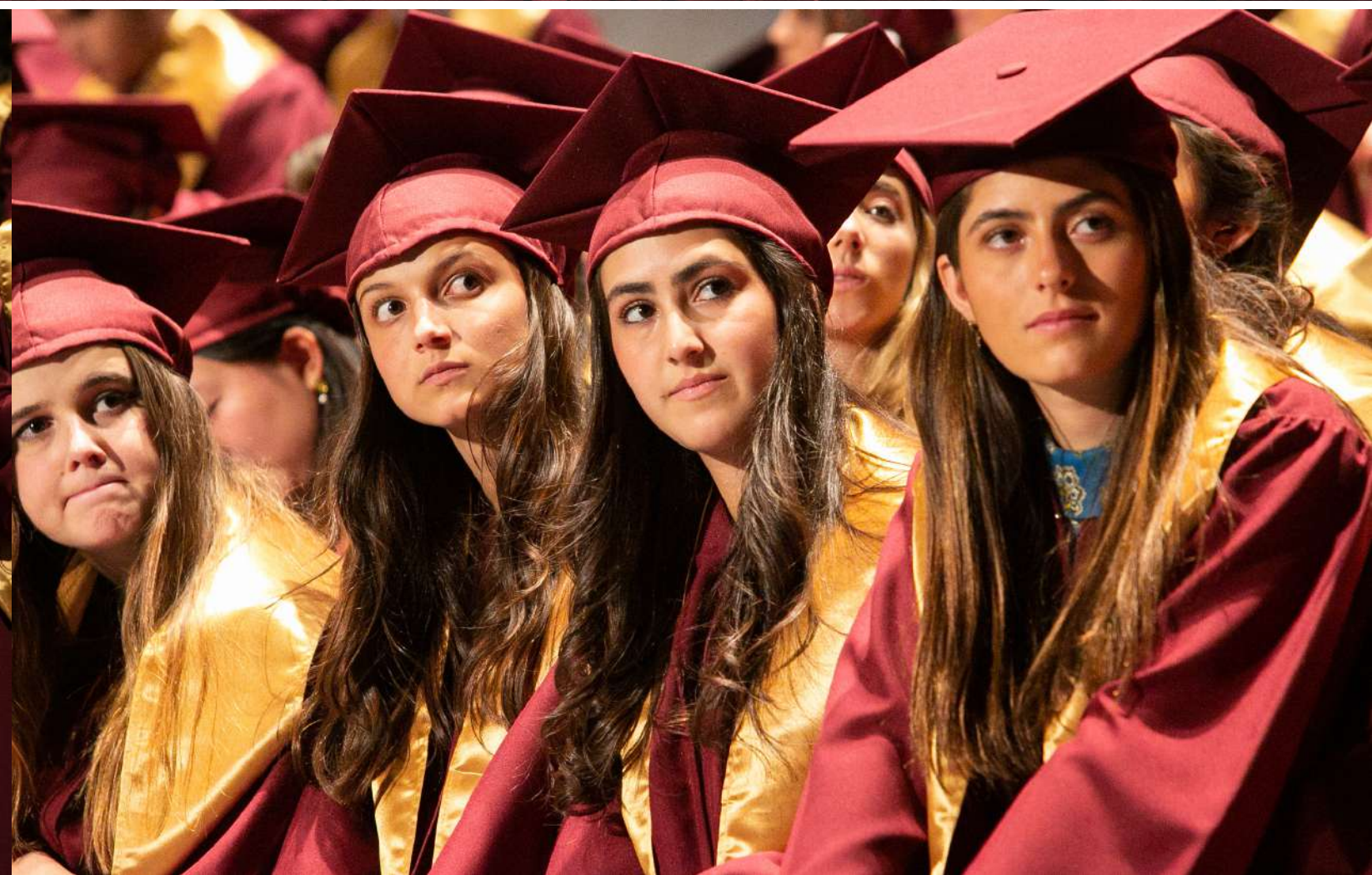

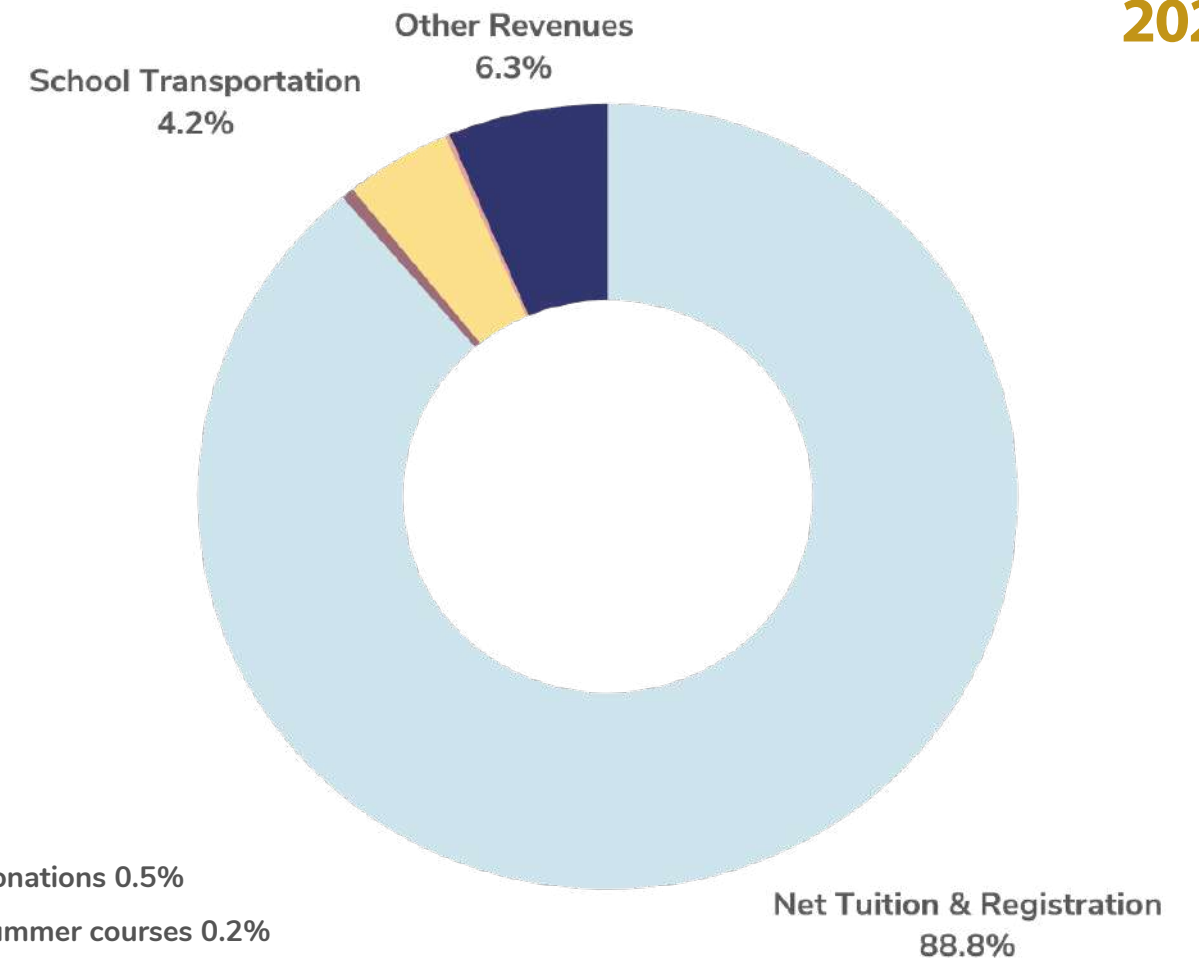




The American School Foundation A.C. is an independent school and a foundation; no one owns it and it operates on a break-even budget. The School receives income from tuition and registration, bus service, summer camp, and donations, among other sources. This income, with the exception of donations, goes into the General Fund, which supports the School-wide operations, such as compensation and fringe benefits, school materials, transportation, etc. The Endowment Fund for Financial Aid is a restricted fund, established in 1984 with the purpose of providing financial aid to qualified ASF students. In the school year 2021-222, ASF provided financial assistance to 450 students, some 18% of our student body.

The Endowment Fund for Financial Aid was created with the goal of making an ASF education available to talented and mission-appropriate applicants with limited economic means who could not otherwise afford to attend. Early on, the decision was made to cover Financial Aid out of the operational revenues of the School until such time as the Endowment Fund could support 20% of enrolled students with financial aid awards up to fifty percent.

Major Gifts are needed for the School to build and refurbish our campus and to improve technology. These donations go directly to the Capital Building Fund. The land where the School was built was donated, and all the ASF facilities were constructed thanks to donations from families, foundations, and our community.

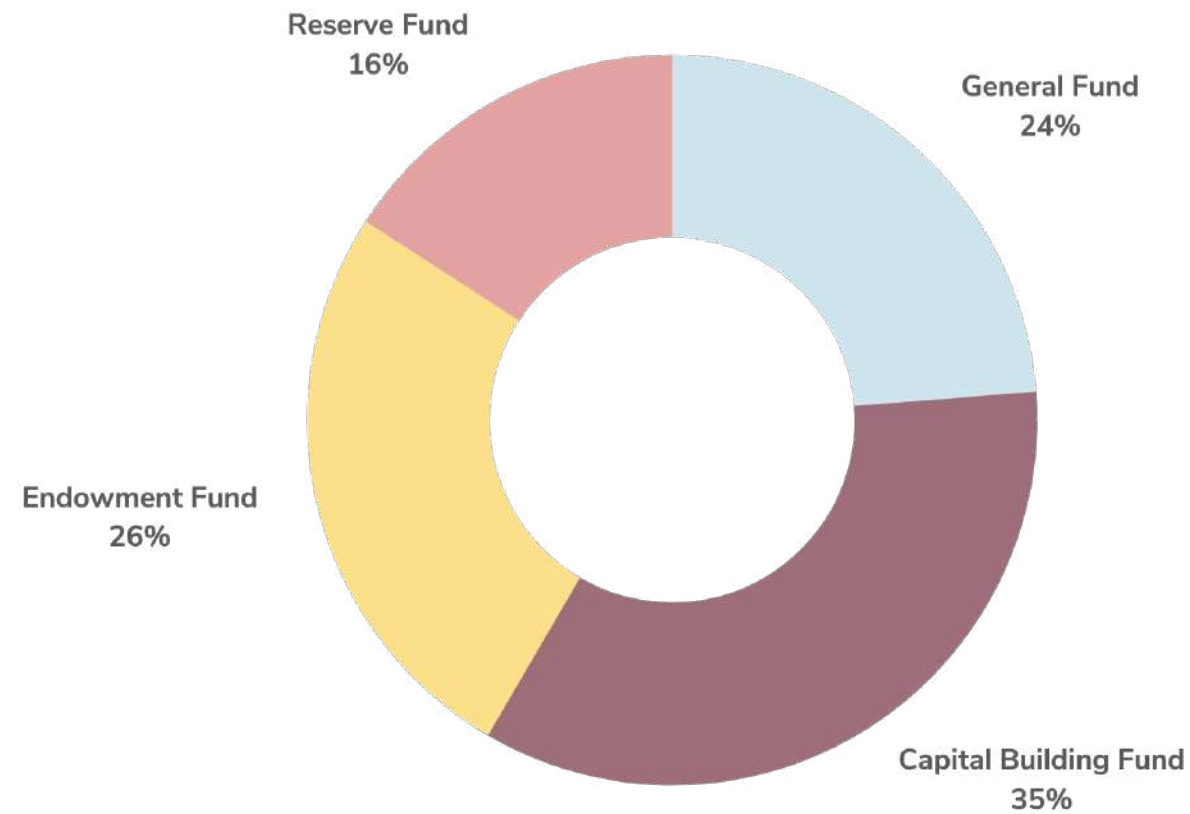

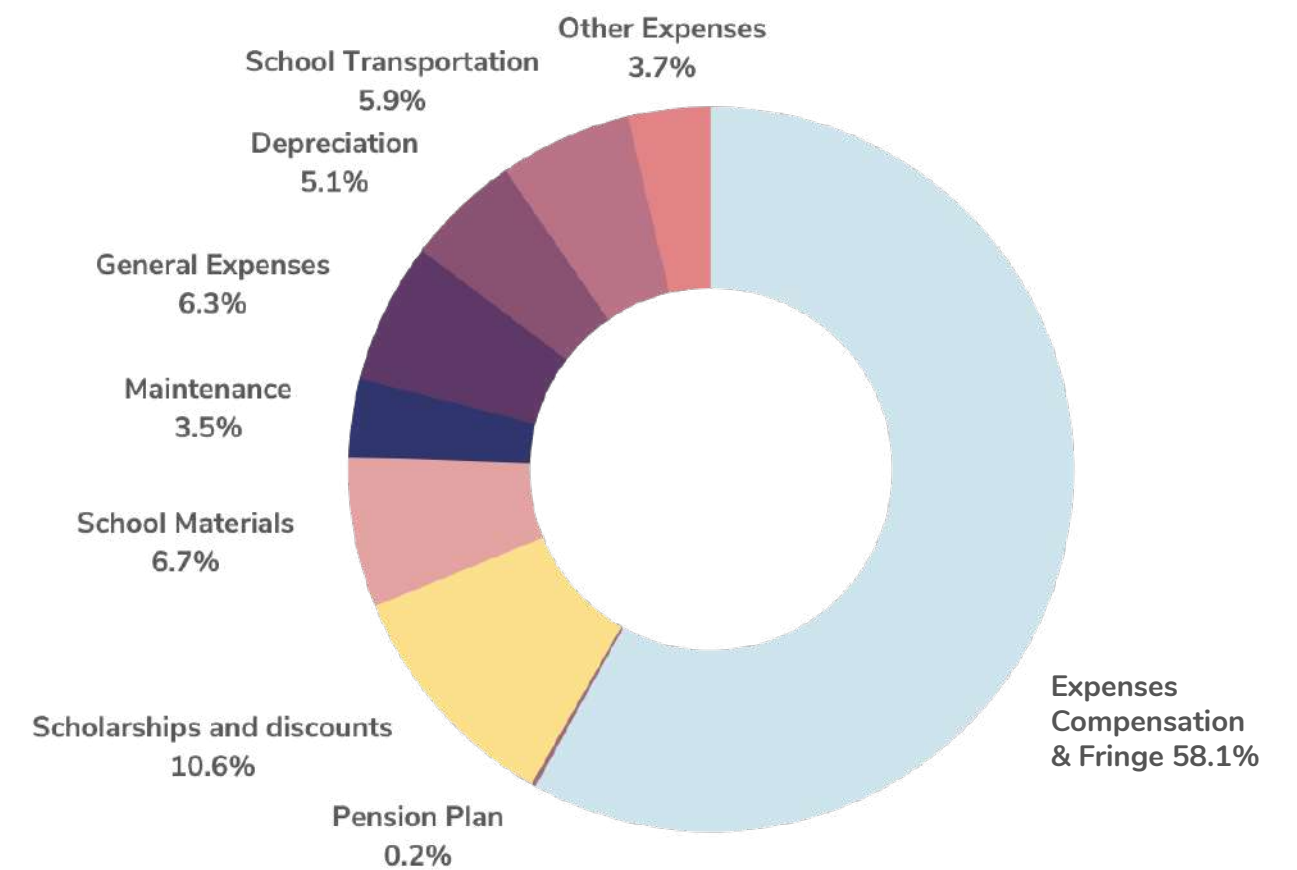
