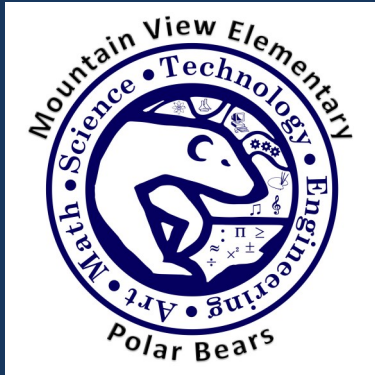

Principal's Message

Mountain View Elementary School is located in the heart of the Humboldt Unified School District, in Prescott Valley, AZ. Our neighborhood school is better for the combined dedication of everyone involved in the care and education of the children we serve every day. We continue to strive for excellence in our students, knowing that all can be successful if they are given a strong foundation. Through the efforts of our staff, students, parents, volunteers and community stakeholders we have made this school a loving, learning community focused on ever improving skills and achievement. The use of interventions and incentives has encouraged and strengthened the resolve of the students to achieve a higher level than even they thought was possible.

The Title One staff at Mountain View encourages every student in their efforts to increase reading achievement through independent reading. Our monthly newsletter features tips for parents regarding reading and study skills. This year we are opening a school store where students can shop using tickets based on their number of Reading Counts points. At the end of school years in the past, I have been slimed, taped to a wall, consumed bugs, been dunked, and kissed a pig and a frog because our students met the Reading Counts point goal.

Eureka math is taught to fidelity and students are sharing how they answer a problem not given the standard algorithm. This allows students the opportunity for differentiation of learning styles. Differentiation of instruction is also our top priority for students to meet the needs of all students.

Response to Intervention (RTI) occurs daily in scheduled RTI blocks. There are three tiers built into the Master Schedule. The first level (Tier I) includes high quality, rigorous classroom instruction by the grade level classroom teacher. For students struggling with a particular skill taught in Tier 1, we provide individual instruction focused on specific need (Tier II). For students who are not showing progress in the first or second level, we provide a third level (Tier III) that provides more individualized attention. The Tier model has been the key to our success! Students continue to show growth on district and statewide testing.

Students who need extra support for behavior are given an adult staff mentor, in addition to the teacher, who supports them throughout the school day. This is called our Check-In Check Out system (CICO). This has had a positive effect on our students as well as the adult mentor. At the end of the year we hold a breakfast with the parents, students, and the mentors to celebrate an outstanding year.

Safety is our top priority in and out of the classroom. Students practice fire drills, lockdown drills, bus evacuations, and an earthquake drill. Mountain View has Specific Standardized Dress Apparel to enhance our student achievement through our educational environment, promoting learning, fostering discipline, creating self-value, and ensuring a safe school atmosphere. All attire must be solid except on Fridays.

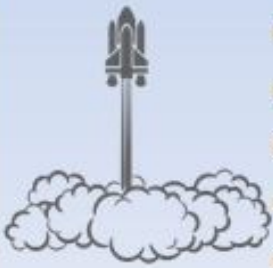





 - 6th grade English/Language Arts percent passing was above the state average

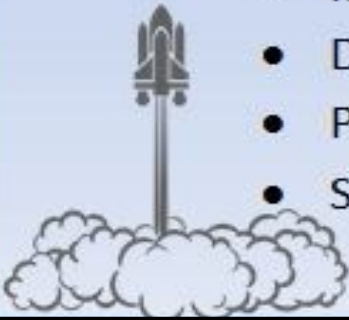
