providing a beautiful mix of traditional and deeply moving musical performances. Thanks also to Senior Class President Jason Tolevski for his inspiring address to fellow classmates.





Make All the Difference Scholarships





An Outstanding Season of Music

It's been an exciting spring for Churchville-Chili Central School District's music program. In addition to being named a 2023 Best Community for Music by the NAMM Foundation for the eighth consecutive year, the district's high school Orchestra, Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble brought home an impressive collection of awards from performances at the New York State School Music Association's (NYSSMA) Major Organization Festival in Rochester and the national Music in the Parks Festival in Hershey, PA. Then to top it off, our Concert Choir and Ninth Grade Treble Choir scored top awards at NYSSMA, too!



At Music in the Parks, Churchville-Chili High School's Wind Ensemble was rated "Superior" and won first place in their division and Overall Best Band in the entire competition. The Orchestra garnered second place in their division with an "Excellent" rating – the first time the orchestra



has won a competitive award. Symphonic Band shone as well, with an "Excellent" rating and third place finish in their division.

At the NYSSMA Festival, Wind Ensemble performed Level 6 repertoire - the highest level of difficulty - and Symphonic Band played Level 4 repertoire. Both groups received Gold ratings.

Later at the NYSSMA Festival at Rush Henrietta High School, more great performances were given by our Concert Choir and Ninth Grade Treble

Choir. Concert Choir performed a Level 6 repertoire and received a Gold with Distinction award. Ninth Grade Treble Choir chose to perform a Level 5 repertoire and collected a Silver award.

The Churchville-Chili School District was one of only 830 school districts to be named a 2023 Best Community for Music by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) which recognizes districts around the country for their exceptionally high commitment to music education for all students.
