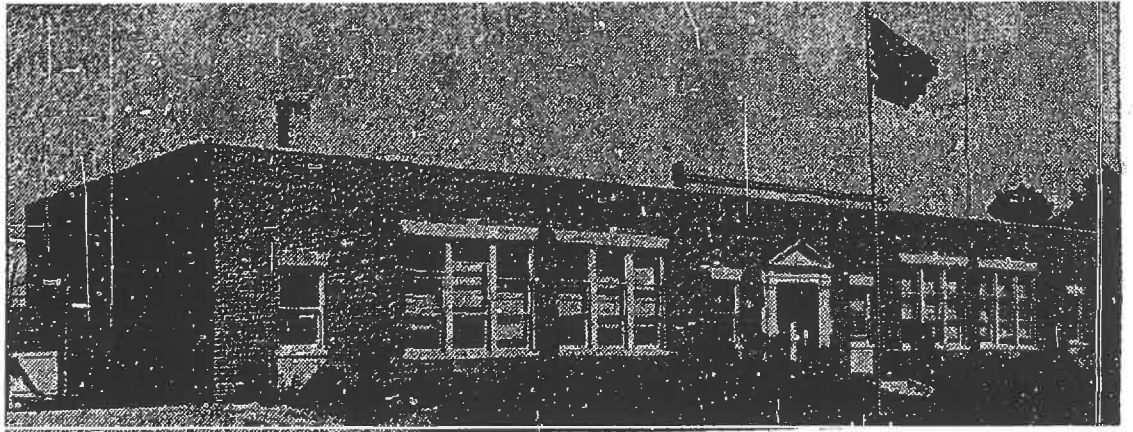

Dedication ceremonies for the recently completed Palos Community Consolidated school will be held at 3 p. m. Sunday on the school site at 127th st., a half mile west of Harlem av. near the eastern outskirts of Palos Park.

The new school, financed by a \$285,000 bond issue, is district 118's second elementary unit. It accommodates kindergarten and 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade pupils. The old Palos Park school now has only 1st, 2d, and 3d grade pupils.

Pastor to Speak

Royal Stephenson, school board president, will unveil the corner stone plaque, and Zay Smith, building committee chairman, will make a report. The dedicatory address will be made by the Rev. John B. Pengelly, pastor of the Church of Transfiguration, Palos Park. There also will be a music program and an open house. Refreshments will be served.

Smith said the school accommodates 300 children from Palos Park and sections of Palos Heights. It is a one story steel and brick structure with seven classrooms, kindergarten, combination auditorium and gymnasium, a combination library, arts, crafts, and domestic science room, offices, and health rooms.

Has Radiant Heating

The building combines bilateral natural lighting with a low intensity lighting tube system which casts even illumination on the ceilings of rooms. Heating is a combination radiant and convection system. Warm air is forced between two concrete floor slabs.
