A NOTE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

It has been a super busy half term of learning and experiences and I think everyone is ready for a well deserved rest. This half term has seen many fantastic achievements across the school including:

- lots of exciting experiences for pupils including the Crucial Crew visiting year 7, reception visiting the local travel agent, a trip to the theatre for our older pupils;
- parents' evenings for years 8 and 11;
- winning the British Film Industry award for Wales;
- being involved in national research about digital learning;
- some superb GCSE results for our year 11 pupils;
- pupils working with student teachers to support their development;
- a visit from Chris Bryant;
- the wins and losses (both allow development) of our sports teams; and,
- completion of practical examinations in science for both year 10 and year 11 (worth 10% of the full qualification).

Pupils have been busy progressing their learning. For those in nursery through to year 8, a lot of this is against the curriculum themes and for our older pupils, looking ahead to their qualifications. The list of these can be found on our website under curriculum.

We have a lot to look forward to next term with two international trips, World Book Day, the Eisteddfod and St David's day (further details of these are further on in this newsletter).

I have been meeting with Nant pupils over the past weeks and they, in turn, have been consulting with their classmates about how we improve lunchtimes for them. There have been lots of really helpful suggestions and the group of 20 pupils and I will work towards a proposal that will shortly be released to pupils for them to give their views and vote. With all that is planned, it is crucial that pupils are in school to learn every day as learning gaps very quickly emerge when there are even very few absences. I understand that, over the last few years. there were temporary changes to the expectations about when children were expected to attend school however those changes have passed and all children are expected to be in school every day unless they are very unwell and unable to attend for this reason. There is more information in this newsletter about attendance to support discussions with your child. Our team are always available should you wish to discuss your child's attendance.

The second focus area of this newsletter are the year 9 options process which has already started with in school consultations and will progress to the stage of pupils considering and choosing their qualification pathways in the next couple of weeks. Newsletter focus item:

Attendance

When children attend school consistently they are more likely to do well with their studies but also build strong relationships and feel connected with the school community. It also demonstrates reliability which will help prepare children for life beyond education and looks positive to future employers.

Our school attendance is currently often less than 90%. This means that a significant amount of pupils are missing out on a significant part of their learning. All pupils should aim to attend school 95% of the time, or even better- 100% so as not to miss out on the exciting opportunities on offer! Currently, there are no restrictions on school attendance, there are no expectations for pupils to test for Covid and so all pupils should be in school every day unless they are seriously unwell.

Should you have any queries about whether your child should or should not come to school, you can look to NHS Wales 111 for guidance.

Understanding Your Percentage Attendance

Every day in school makes a difference to your child's future. When pupils are not in school, the amount of days missed will impact on the learning that takes place. It is also important to stress the non-academic advantages of being in school too where friendships, socialising and wellbeing support all play a significant part in the development of our pupils. Any pupil with attendance below 95% is below target. Pupils should already be aware of their attendance percentage. If you are unsure please contact the lower/middle/upper school team.



Supporting attendance

If you are having any difficulties with your child attending school or if your child is anxious or worried about going to school, please ask your childs' school team for help. We have lots of experience in these situations and above all, we are here to support, working with you as a team to support you and your child with their attendance.

Punctuality

Punctuality is also as important as attendance. Not only is punctuality an important life skill, but further, learning starts promptly each day and pupils who arrive late are missing vital sessions of the day including literacy sessions and parts of the day where important information is given. As a reminder school starts for middle and upper school pupils at 8.40 and lower school pupils at 8.55. Pupils should be at their classrooms for this time.

Reporting absence

It is vitally important that your child's absence is reported to us on the first day of absence and each subsequent day of absence unless there has been medical authorisation for a period of absence granted on day one. Please can you use the classcharts app to report absence. It is easy to do and takes seconds. If you are unsure or do not have your login details, please contact your child's relevant school team who will be happy to help.

Year 9 options information

As parents will no doubt be aware, we have now started the careers focus fortnight and options process in earnest. In order to keep you informed and abreast of the most up to date information, we are sharing information with you via this newsletter.

Please see a timeline below that clearly sets out the next few weeks and how the process will unfold;

Frequently asked questions:

What are option blocks?

Pupils will choose three subjects in total. One from each option group, or block as per the example below**

Option A	Option B	Option C
Art and photography	Performing arts	Business studies

This is an example and does not in any way represent how the option blocks will appear this year. This has yet to be decided

What is a straw poll and why is it so important?

This is where pupils are given a vast array of subjects to choose from and they pick their top 5. It is important that pupils complete this and give it careful thought as this is used to inform the final option blocks. So, for example, if 45 pupils want to do engineering but 25 of those also want to do art, we would ensure that art and engineering do not appear in the same option block. The straw poll helps to inform the option blocks (as above) and allows us to ensure we give as many pupils the opportunity to study the subjects that they most want to do.

What about core subjects?

Core is made up of:

English literature, English language, mathematics, mathematics - numeracy, Welsh, science - biology, chemistry and physics, well-being, religious studies and the skills challenge certificate.

This could give pupils the equivalent of up to 10 GCSEs.

Pupils will also study a complementary curriculum which includes: finance education, information technology skills, enterprise skills.

This curriculum could give pupils the equivalent of a further 5 GCSEs.

In addition to the formally timetabled examinations, year 10 and 11 also have the following examinations scheduled over the next term which will make up part of their final qualification grade. Attendance to school is vital for pupils to secure the best outcomes.
