It has been a fantastic term at St Leonards. In this update's a summary of the some of the fantastic achievements of our students. Thank you for all your support.

Thank you to the parents who responded to our survey. At the time of writing the government has delayed the introduction of the 32.5 hrs a week rule for schools. I will update you regarding proposals.

Students have responded really well to increasingly high expectation at the Academy. **The start of term in September** has been designed so that all students have time to prepare for expectations around lessons, work in books, movement around the academy.

Year 8, 9 and 10 arrive at normal time and go to tutors and will have a full day

Year 7 and 11 arrive at 11am for break and will be in school for the rest of the day

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> September

All at school as normal

In response to student voice we will have new arrangements for lunch and break to allow more access to inside space. We will write at the start of the year about this and rules around phones. There were some great responses to our survey on this which I will also share in September. 75% of those surveyed were in favour of the extension of the ban in phones. The main concern from others was that students would not be allowed to bring their phones at all.

Phones should be in bags and not visible. If students need to use phones in an emergency then can go to year team office Students working with the safeguarding team can go there /Students working with the SEN team can go to the COVE

In Term 6, the Maths team launched **Sparx** our new **homework** platform to Years 9 & 10 as an early trial before a whole school rollout in September. The Maths team would like to say a massive thank you for your support in our initial launch and we are pleased to say that we have already had some wonderful successes.

Homework is a well-researched area that is proven to make huge amounts of progress when completed regularly, and we have already seen thousands of hours of personalised learning take place outside of lessons in the first few weeks

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of this launch. Students are being rewarded weekly for their self-discipline and are receiving regular praise in lessons, with special recognition going to those who are going above and beyond on tasks or completing additional independent learning!

Sparx gives teachers. Students who begin the work earlier will receive extra support with their homework when their teacher feedbacks to the class and plans activities to address gaps in knowledge.

Sparx will become a large part of our Maths Strategy into the new academic year where we will see a roll out to the remaining year groups and an increase in the size of our homework support club. We thank you again for your support on this important project!
