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Philosophy

In order for our students to grow and learn, a safe and orderly environment must exist within our school.

Background & Purpose

A discipline handbook was developed and approved by the USD 470 board of education in 1991 by school board members, parents, representatives of judicial and social service agencies, teachers and administrators and has been reviewed and updated annually.

Parents and students are encouraged to read the guidelines and be familiar with behavior that is expected of students in USD 470. Visitors entering school property must first report to the office. Policies and procedures outlined in these guidelines apply to schools, school property and school sponsored events, and are intended as a guide to cover most but not all situations. Offenses are cumulative by semester. Because USD 470 believes that family involvement is critical when dealing with student discipline issues, reasonable efforts will be made by the school to contact parents with disciplinary concerns. School counselor referrals, when appropriate, will also be used for intervention. Any action that may constitute a criminal offense will be referred to appropriate law enforcement. Electronic surveillance is in place at all sites. **Although it is expected administrators will follow the guidelines as adopted by the board of education, school officials may exercise discretion in applying policy to individual cases.**

Searches of Students & Property

Principals are authorized to search students and property, which includes pockets, purses, shoulder bags, personal technology devices, book bags, briefcases, and parking lots, if there is reasonable suspicion district policies, rules or directives are being violated. Lockers shall be subject to random searches without prior notice or with reasonable suspicion. Lockers in the district schools shall be under the supervision of the principal. Students have no expectation of privacy in any school locker, while on school property, or when using district email or computer systems. The combinations and/or keys to all lockers shall be in the possession of the principal and stored in a place designed to guard against unauthorized access or use. The principal may search any locker at any time without notice. Students shall not place locks, other than those approved by the school, on any locker.

High School & Middle School Discipline Notes

Middle School students assigned to ISS will report upon arrival through the end of the school day. Detention is held from 7:25-7:50 a.m. and from 3:21-3:50 p.m. ACMS students assigned detention must attend at least one detention session daily.

High school students are assigned to ISS from 7:55 a.m. to 3:21 p.m. Detention is held before and after school from 7:00-7:50 a.m. and 3:26-4:26 p.m.

Pre-K Discipline Notes

In alignment with the [US Department of Health and Human Services and US Department of Education's joint statement](#) to severely limit expulsion and suspension in early childhood settings, such action will only be taken as a last resort in extraordinary circumstances where there is a serious safety threat that cannot be reduced or eliminated by the provision of reasonable modifications. In such cases, the program will collaborate with the parents, and utilize appropriate community resources – such as behavior coaches, psychologists, other appropriate specialists, or other resources – as needed, to determine no other reasonable option is appropriate. If a temporary suspension is deemed necessary, the program will help the child return to full participation in all program activities as quickly as possible while ensuring child safety by continuing to engage with the parents and community resources; developing a written plan to document the action and supports needed; and, determining whether a referral to a local agency responsible for implementing IDEA is appropriate.

1. Use a high quality, supportive, structured, predictive, nurturing environment to help children feel safe and learn self-regulation.
2. Develop targeted social emotional support, games and activities used to connect and build relationships.
3. Provide one-on-one individualized interventions to meet children’s needs, if appropriate. The one-on-one relationship with a significant adult is the key to success at this level.

Only after all intervention plans have been implemented, documented, and exhausted can the determination be made to consider an alternative placement (suspension) for the child. (See U.S. Department of HHS and U.S. Department of Education joint Policy Statement on Expulsion and Suspension Policies in Early Childhood Settings).

OFFENSE: Arson

SPECIFICATION: Students involved in acts of arson will be suspended, and school officials will seek a hearing request for a long-term suspension and/or expulsion. Legal authorities will be notified.

OFFENSE: Battery

SPECIFICATION: Battery, which may include sexual battery, is defined as the unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of another, which is done in a rude, insolent, or angry manner. Battery could involve, but is not limited to, such acts as slapping, scratching, punching, kicking, grabbing around the neck or body, shoving, biting, hair pulling, etc. Students involved in acts of battery will be referred to the office where immediate and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. If appropriate, legal authorities will be notified. Consequences will also apply to students who incite, instigate or are accomplices to the battery.

OFFENSE: Battery – aggravated

SPECIFICATION: Aggravated battery is defined as the unlawful touching or application of force to the person of another with intent to injure that individual and which inflicts great bodily harm upon them, or causes any disfigurement or dismemberment to or of their person, or which is done with or without using a deadly weapon, or in any manner whereby great bodily harm, disfigurement, dismemberment, or death could be inflicted. Students involved in acts of aggravated battery will be referred to the office for immediate and appropriate disciplinary action. If appropriate, legal authorities will be notified.

OFFENSE: Cheating/Plagiarism

SPECIFICATION: Cheating, defined as copying another's work and claiming it is your own and plagiarism, defined as the use of another person's original ideas or writing without giving credit to the true author, are both prohibited practices. Materials taken from electronic sources are covered by this policy. A student who engages in any form of academic dishonesty will be subject to the loss of credit for the work in question, as well as other disciplinary measures.

OFFENSE: Detention violations – office assigned

SPECIFICATION: Students who skip administrative-assigned detention or violate the rules of the detention room will receive immediate and appropriate disciplinary action. Middle school students not reporting to detention within 5 minutes of the start time may not be allowed to serve that session.

OFFENSE: Disruptive behavior

SPECIFICATION: Students will not be allowed to deprive the instructor of the right to teach or deprive other students of the right to learn, nor will they be permitted to adversely affect the learning environment of the classroom or the school. Teachers will make reasonable efforts to contact parents to advise them of the problems their student is causing in school.

OFFENSE: Dress code violations

SPECIFICATION: Neatness, decency and good taste are guidelines of the district dress code. Students who violate school dress codes will be asked to make an adjustment or necessary clothing change which results in compliance with the dress code.

OFFENSE: Driving violations

SPECIFICATION: Driving a vehicle to school or on school property is a privilege rather than a right. Students will not be allowed to violate law or jeopardize health, safety, or physical well-being of others by operating their vehicle in a reckless manner, by exhibiting excessive speeds or by over accelerating a vehicle. Students who violate this policy will receive immediate and appropriate disciplinary action. If warranted, students may immediately lose parking privileges, and legal authorities may be notified.

OFFENSE: Extortion

SPECIFICATION: Students who attempt to acquire money, property that is not their own, schoolwork or services of any type from another student by using threats or force will receive immediate and appropriate disciplinary action.

OFFENSE: False note or call or fraudulent misuse of a school form

Also, any student who falsifies a school form or document, or uses that form or document for any purpose other than the specific purpose for which it was intended, will receive immediate and appropriate disciplinary action. This will include misuse of school ID.

OFFENSE: Fighting or use of physical force with anger

SPECIFICATION: Fighting or use of physical force with anger will not be permitted. Students should exhaust every alternative available to them before resorting to hitting or the use of physical force. Fighting at school, on school property or at school-sponsored activities is expressly prohibited. If appropriate, legal authorities will be notified. Consequences also apply to students who incite, instigate or are accomplices to the fight or use of physical force. All aspects to a fighting situation will be considered when consequences are applied.

OFFENSE: Flagrant misbehavior

SPECIFICATION: Flagrant misbehavior is any overt act that could adversely affect the learning environment of the public schools of USD 470 or jeopardize the health, safety or physical well-being of those students and staff who attend or work in any of the public schools. Students who involve themselves in acts of flagrant misbehavior will be referred to the office where immediate and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. If appropriate, legal authorities will be notified.

OFFENSE: Gang-related activities – non-violent

SPECIFICATION: Gang activities which threaten the safety or well-being of persons or property on school grounds or at school activities, or which disrupt the school environment, are prohibited. Immediate and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against any student wearing, carrying or displaying gang paraphernalia, or exhibiting behavior or gestures which symbolize gang membership, or causing and/or participating in gang-related activities. Gang paraphernalia will be confiscated.

OFFENSE: Harassment – bullying

SPECIFICATION: Activities that involve students bullying other students are abusive behaviors that harm victims and negatively impact the school environment by creating an atmosphere of fear, distrust, and mean-spiritedness. USD 470 strictly prohibits students and adult staff from engaging in any form of bullying (including cyber-bullying) on school property, in conjunction with any school activity or involving any person associated with the school. Any student who participates in bullying or conspires to engage in bullying will face immediate and appropriate disciplinary action and must meet with the counselor. A mandate of “no interaction” will be issued. Students who experience bullying (including cyber-bullying) are required to report the incidence to an adult staff member and complete the anti-bullying report form. OFFENSE: Harassment – racial [see reference to adult staff] see also ACHS Bulldogs Agenda; “Policy”; “Reporting” ACMS Agenda

SPECIFICATION: Racial harassment is unlawful discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin under Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Kansas Acts Against Discrimination. All forms of racial harassment are prohibited at school, on school property, and at all school-sponsored activities, programs, or events. Racial harassment is racially motivated conduct which: (1) affords a student different treatment, solely on the basis of race, color or national origin, in a manner which interferes with or limits the ability of the student to participate in or benefit from the services, activities or programs of the school; (2) is sufficiently severe, pervasive or persistent so as to have the purpose or effect of creating a hostile academic environment; or (3) is sufficiently severe, pervasive or persistent so as to have the purpose or effect of interfering with a student’s academic performance or ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities or programs of the school. Racial harassment may result from verbal or physical conduct or written graphic material. Students who violate the racial harassment policy must meet with the counselor, and a mandate of “no interaction” will be issued.

OFFENSE: Harassment – sexual [see reference to adult staff] see also ACHS Bulldogs AGENDA; “Policy”; & “Reporting” ACMS AGENDA

SPECIFICATION: Sexual harassment is unlawful discrimination on the basis of sex under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Kansas Acts Against Discrimination. All forms of sexual harassment are prohibited at school, on school property, and at all school-sponsored activities, programs, or events. Sexual harassment is unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other inappropriate oral, written, or physical conduct of a sexual nature. Sexual harassment may result from verbal or physical conduct or written or graphic nature. Sexual harassment may include, but is not limited to, verbal harassment or abuse, pressure for sexual activity; repeated remarks to a person, with sexual or demeaning implication; unwelcome touching; or suggesting or demanding sexual involvement accompanied by implied or explicit threats about a student’s grades, participation in extra-curricular activities, etc. Students who violate the sexual harassment policy must meet with the counselor, and a mandate of “no interaction” will be issued.

OFFENSE: Hazing

SPECIFICATION: Hazing and initiation activities that involve students hazing other students are abusive and illegal behaviors that harm victims and negatively impact the school environment by creating an atmosphere of fear, distrust, and mean-spiritedness. USD 470 strictly prohibits students from engaging individually or collectively in any form of hazing or related initiation activity on school property, in conjunction with any school activity or involving any person associated with the school, regardless of where the incident occurs. Any student who participates in hazing or related initiation activity, or conspires to engage in hazing will face immediate disciplinary action: up to and including suspension, expulsion, exclusion, and loss of participation in extra-curricular activities. In addition, students who participate in hazing must meet with the counselor, and a mandate of “no interaction” will be issued.

Intervention Program: Students who violate district policy for alcohol, illegal drugs, and/or tobacco may be required to complete a school approved intervention program prior to returning to school.

Alcohol:

Specification: The consumption, possession (actual or constructive), use, transfer, distribution or to be under the influence of any alcoholic beverage, cereal malt beverage or intoxicant of any kind – anywhere inside the school building or on school property or at any school-sponsored activity is prohibited.

Illegal Drugs:

Specification: The consumption, possession (actual or constructive), use, transfer, distribution or to be under the influence of any illegal substance – in any form or any e-cigarettes, narcotic drug, hallucinogenic drug, amphetamine, barbiturate, stimulant, depressant, marijuana, crack, steroids, or any other substance on the controlled substance abuse list– anywhere inside the school building or on school property or at any school-sponsored activity is prohibited.

The student or crowd use of any product which may pose a health risk to persons or potential damage to district or personal property is disallowed. Students who violate this policy will receive immediate and appropriate disciplinary action. Police will be notified. Any illegal substance or paraphernalia will be confiscated by school officials.

OFFENSE: Weapons

SPECIFICATION: A student shall not knowingly possess, handle, or transmit any object that can reasonably be considered a weapon at school, on the school property or at a school-sponsored event. This shall include any weapon, any item being used as a weapon or destructive device, or any facsimile of a weapon.

Weapons and destructive devices: As used in this policy, the term “weapon” and/or destructive device shall include, but shall not be limited to:

- Any item being used as a weapon or destructive device;
- Any facsimile of a weapon;
- Any weapon which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive.
- The frame or receiver of any weapon described in the preceding example;
- Any firearm muffler or firearm silencer;
- Any explosive, incendiary or poison gas, bomb, grenade, rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces, missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than 1/4 ounce, mine or similar device;
- Any weapon which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than 1/2 inch in diameter; any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting any device into a destructive device described in the two immediately preceding examples and from which a destructive device may be readily assemble;
- Any bludgeon, sand club, metal knuckles or throwing star;

- Any knife, commonly referred to as a switchblade, which has a blade that opens automatically by hand pressure applied to a button, spring or other device in the handle of the knife, or any knife having a blade that opens or falls or is ejected into position by the force of gravity or by an outward, downward or centrifugal thrust or movement;
- Any electronic device designed to discharge immobilizing levels of electricity, commonly known as a stun gun.

Penalties for possession: Possession of a firearm or other weapon, other than a facsimile of a weapon, shall result in expulsion from school for a period of one calendar year, except the superintendent may recommend this expulsion requirement be modified on a case-by-case basis (See JDC ~ BOE). Possession of a facsimile of a weapon may result in suspension or expulsion. Expulsion hearings for possession of a weapon shall be conducted by the superintendent or the superintendent’s designee.

Students violating this policy shall be reported as having a felony or misdemeanor and also referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency(ies) and if a juvenile to SRS or Commissioner of Juvenile Justice.

Short-term suspension

Except in an emergency, short-term suspension (not exceeding 10 school days) must be preceded by oral or written notice of the charges to the student and an informal hearing. If a hearing is not held prior to the suspension, an informal hearing shall be provided no later than 72 hours after imposition of a short-term suspension.

Written notice of any short-term suspension shall be delivered to the student’s parent or guardian within 24 hours after the suspension has been imposed. Short term suspension hearings may be conducted by any person designated in policy as having the authority to suspend.

At the informal suspension hearing, the student shall have the right to be present and notified of: the charges; and the basis for accusation. The student shall have the right to make statements in his/her defense after receiving notice of the charges.

Long-term suspension

Before a student is subject to long-term suspension (not to exceed 90 school days) or expulsion (not to exceed 186 school days), a hearing shall be conducted by a hearing officer who has authority to suspend or expel. The superintendent/principal shall designate a hearing officer authorized by the board. Formal hearings shall be conducted according to procedures outlined in current Kansas law and:

- The student and parents or guardians shall be given written notice of the time, date, and place of the hearing.
- The notice shall include copies of the suspension/expulsion law, and appropriate board policies, regulations, and handbooks. ● The hearing may be conducted by either a certified employee or committee of certified employees authorized by the board, the chief administrative officer, or other certified employee of the district in which the student is enrolled, or by an officer appointed by the board.
- Findings required by law shall be prepared by the person or committee conducting the hearing.

- A record of the hearing shall be available to students and parents or guardians according to Kansas law.
- Written notice of the result of the hearing shall be given to the pupil and to parents and guardians within 24 hours after determination of such result.

During the time a student is suspended (long- or short-term) or expelled from school, the student may not:

- **Be on school property or in any school building without the permission of the principal.**
- **Attend any school activity (home or away) as a spectator, participant, or observer.**
