Academic Statistics for School Year 2022-23

Advanced Placement (AP) Information & Results - May 2023

- In 2023, a total of 395 AP examinations were administered to 158 students.
- Of the 158 students, there were 83 seniors, 45 juniors, 8 sophomore, and 22 freshmen
- 74 students from the Class of 2024 have enrolled in 1 or more AP courses during their 4 years of high school
- 54 students from the Class of 2024 have enrolled in 2 or more AP course for their senior year
- Saint Joseph High School expects all students enrolled in AP courses to take the corresponding test
