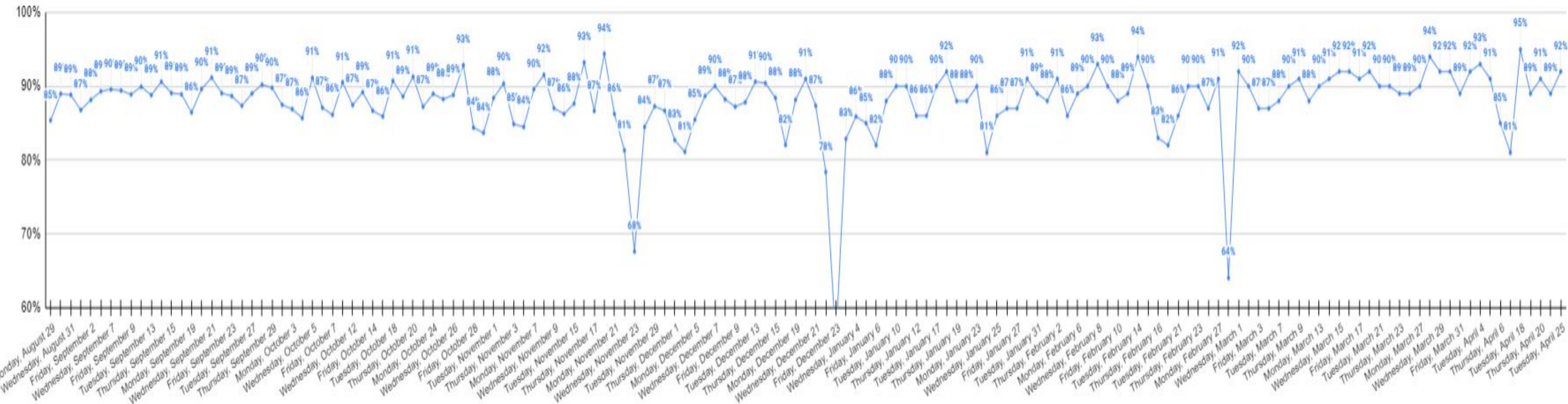

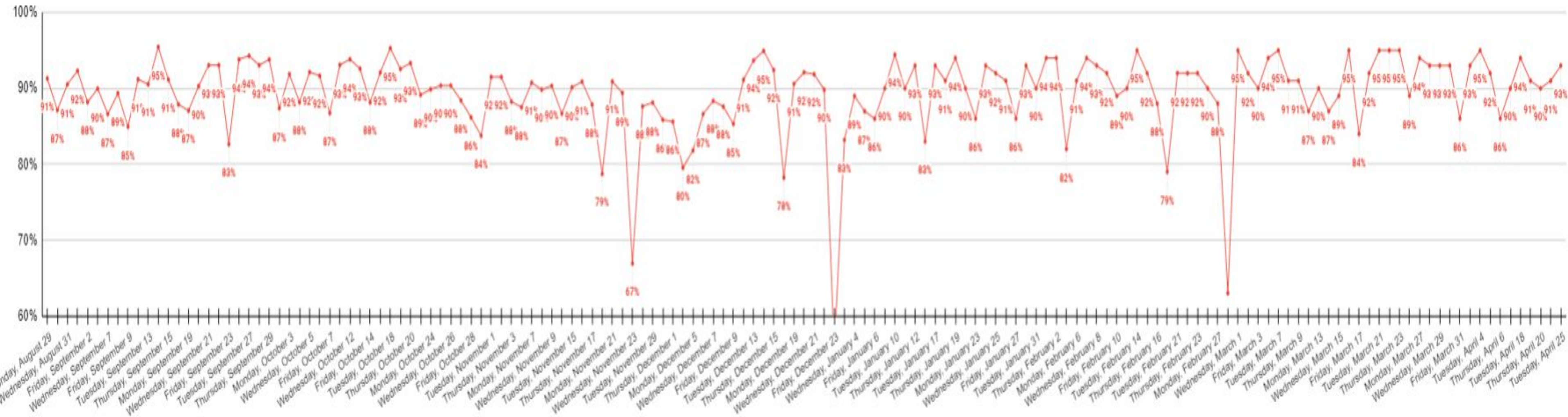

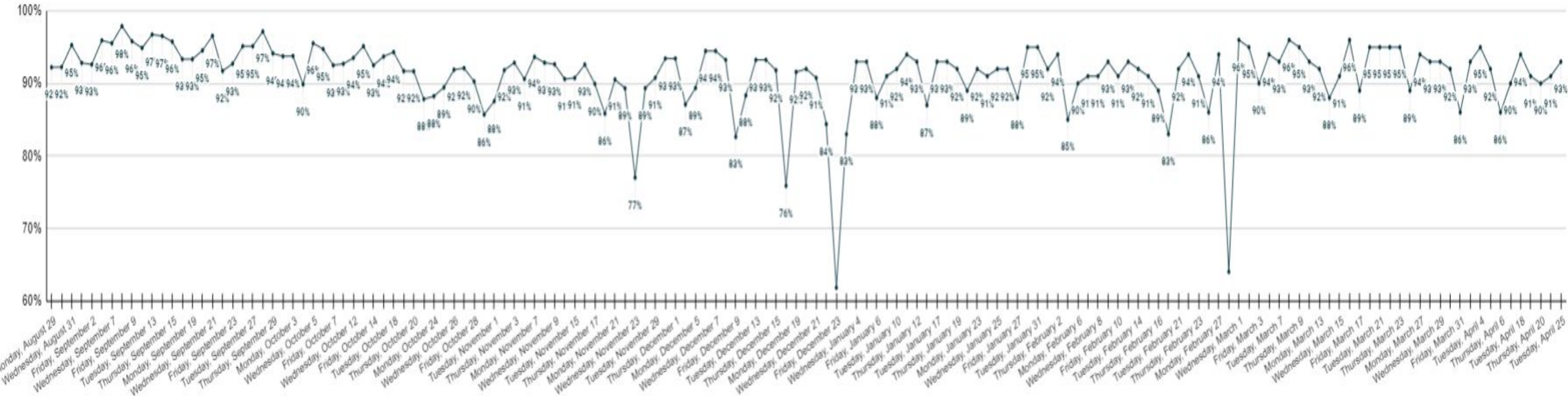

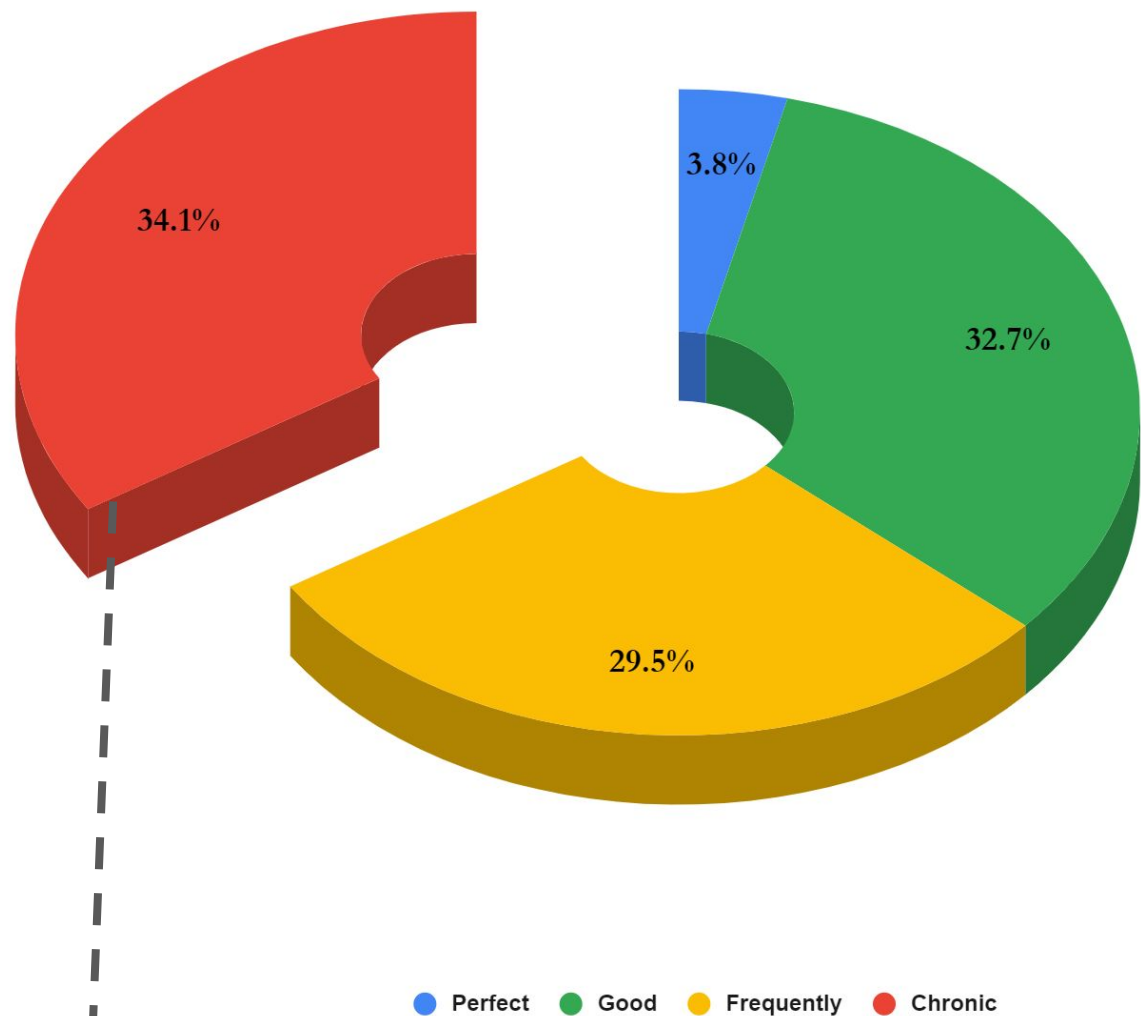

 - 20-21 SY = 72.4% (6/30/21)

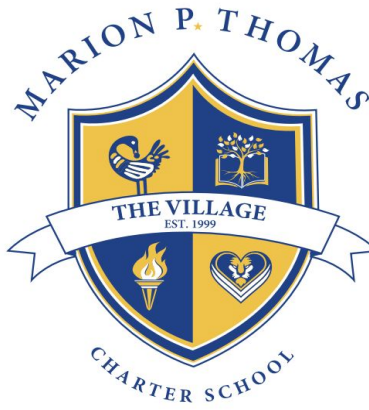
- Average Daily Attendance (ADA)
