ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The curriculum consists of rigorous college-preparatory academics in all subject areas. As such, all courses are taught at either the Advanced Placement (AP) or Honors level.

In 2018-19, we removed the "Honors" label on course titles but continue to add weighting in the GPA.

- Saint Mary's School does not calculate class rank.
- 21 AP courses are offered, in addition to the full honors-level curriculum. (Students enrolled in an AP course are typically required to take the AP Exam.)
- A copy of the Curriculum Guide, including course offerings by department, is available online.



SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

- **Seminar**: A required course for all students, Seminar is designed to develop the <u>10 key competencies</u> through intentional partnerships with outside organizations and is team-taught by our faculty (Pass/Fail).
- **Independent Studies**: Available to students as an in-depth study of an academic interest with a faculty mentor. Independent Studies are graded and receive one-half credit per semester.
- Online Courses: Through our partnerships with <u>One Schoolhouse</u> and <u>Laurel Springs</u>, students are occasionally permitted to enroll in online courses (which are listed on the transcript but not included in the Saint Mary's GPA).

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CLASS OF 2024

The school year is divided into two semesters, and the expected course load is seven courses per semester, including Seminar. Diploma requirements include a minimum of 21 units, including:

English 4 units

Humanities & Social Sciences 4 units, including .5 unit of religion/philosophy and .5 unit of choice

Mathematics 3 units, including 1 unit beyond Algebra II

Science 3 units, including 1 unit of Biology and 1 unit of a physical science

World Languages 2 units (consecutive units of the same language)

Visual & Performing Arts 2 units Electives 3 units

Seminar Required every semester; non-credit bearing (pass/fail)
