2023 Summer Culture Project ALL GRADE LEVELS

Each year we ask each student to complete a small project that will become part of an inspirational installation in their classroom or hallway. Instructions are below and an example is attached. This project can be completed independently by older students; our younger Mustangs may need some assistance.

You will need:

- 8 ½ x 11 in (or larger) sheet white poster paper
- Art supplies and/or printed pictures

Directions:

You will be creating an imaginary town that represents *you* by including your favorite things. For example, you might include an ice cream shop because it is your favorite dessert and a comic book shop because you love comics. Maybe you love animals, so your town has a petting zoo. The town name should reflect you, as well, and maybe even street or park names. Your creativity is the only limit!

Important Guidelines:

- You may do a detailed aerial view (bird's eye) or a street view.
- Your poster can include hand-drawn details and/or computer printed pictures.
- Grades K-2, please include at least 3 locations in your town that tell about you.
- Grades 3-8, please include at least 6 locations in your town that tell about you.
- Label your name, grade, and house team (if applicable)
- Posters will be displayed, so be sure to be make something that you will be proud to share with others.
- This assignment is due by the first day of school. A great time to hand it in is when you bring in your materials to Open House.
